THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF GISBORNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders at GISBORNE, in the county of Bourke, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF GISBORNE.—Commencing at a point bearing south and distant one chain from the south-

western angle of section 34 in the parish of Gisborne; thence east eighty chains; thence south eighty chains; thence west eighty chains; and thence north eighty chains to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Gisborne."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, WILLIAMSTOWN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, or any description of sewer, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be exempted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to exempt the place or building hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Williamstown: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Williamstown the following premises, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Mechanics' Institute.

REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT OF THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1860.

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the temperature in the shade at Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Flagstaff Observatory on each day during the month of July, 1860:—

The returns of mortality in Melbourne and suburbs for the month of July showed 319 deaths, or 10.29 a day, which is an increase of 39 deaths, or 0.96 daily, upon those for the month of June. The daily average is above that for the quarter ending 30th June, and is nearly equal to that for the months of February, March, and April. The returns for July, 1859, showed only 251 deaths, or 8.1 daily.

The mean temperature for July was 47.3°, or 2.4° lower than that of the previous month, but differing only by a fraction from that of July, 1859. The highest point reached by the thermometer (62.7°) was at 3h. p.m. on the 31st, and the lowest (29°) at 6h. a.m. on the 14th, the range for the month thus being 33.7°. The greatest daily range (22.6°) was on the 14th, from a maximum of 51.6° to a minimum of 45.7°, the least (4.8°) on the 23rd, from a maximum of 50.3° to a minimum of 45.7°, and the mean daily range was 15.5°. The mean height of the barometer for the month was 30.114 in. The maximum (30.381 in.) was at 11h. p.m. on the 31st, and the minimum (29.795) at 3h. p.m. on the 4th, the range of atmospheric pressure for the month thus being .586 in.

The mean temperature and daily average of mortality for the first four weeks in July were as follow:—

Of the 319 deaths which occurred during the month, 168 or 52.7 per cent. were of males, 151 or 47.3 per cent. of females. As during June, the deaths of persons above 5 years old slightly outnumbered those of children under that age, there having been 166 or 48 per cent. of the former against 153 or 52 per cent. of the latter. The days of the greatest mortality were the 2nd and 3rd, on each of which 17 deaths occurred: 16th deaths also took place on the 5th and 10th. During June, the greatest number of deaths occurring in any one day was 15, and during July, 1859, it was 16.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of last census, the daily average of deaths during the months of June and July, 1860, and the increase or decrease in the rate of mortality in July, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

NOTE.—The population of Melbourne and suburbs, as shown by the census of 1857, is given as a guide to the probable relative proportions rather than to the actual numbers of the present inhabitants of the several sub-districts.

The deaths of females under five years of age were more numerous than those of males under that age; 81 or 53 per cent. of the former having occurred against 72 or 47 per cent. of the latter. Of the entire number of both sexes dying under five years of age, 68 were less than a year old, 52 between one year and three, and 33 between three years and five.

Of 166 persons who died over the age of five years, 96 or 57.9 per cent. were males, 70 or 42.1 per cent. females. 24 were between five and fifteen years, 43 between fifteen and thirty, 46 between thirty and forty-five, 27 between forty-five and sixty, 9 between sixty and seventy, 9 between seventy and eighty, and 3 over eighty years of age. Two male and one female lunatics died in the Yarra Bend Asylum.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, during the month of April:—

On comparing the causes of death in July with those for the previous month, it is found that deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 72 or 25 per cent. of the total in June, to 109 or 34 per cent. in July. The diseases of this class exhibiting the greatest increase were scarlatina, from which 32 deaths occurred against 20 in June, croup showing 8 against 2, whooping-cough 8 against 2, and influenza 18 against 5.

Of sporadic diseases, those of the respiratory system increased from 74 to 81, and of the digestive organs from 17 to 29, whilst those of uncertain seat decreased from 39 to 26, and those of the nervous system from 50 to 39. Seven deaths occurred from old age, both in June and July.

And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, A.D. 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law to restrain the breeding and keeping of swine within the town proper of Emerald Hill: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the said district, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, it shall not be lawful for any person to keep any kind of swine within the boundaries of the town proper of Emerald Hill; and any person who shall so offend shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds: provided always that nothing in this bye-law contained shall be taken to apply to any swine brought within the said boundaries of the town proper of Emerald Hill for the purpose of slaughter, if slaughtered within twenty-four hours after being so brought for slaughter as aforesaid.


