NOTICE TO CARRIERS, CARRIERS' AGENTS, AND FORWARDING AGENTS.

THE attention of carriers, carriers' agents, and forwarding agents, is directed to the circumstance that by the Act No. 78 their licenses must be renewed annually; that any unlicensed person acting as a carrier is liable to a penalty of £50; that any person permitting the words "licensed carrier" to remain upon his vehicle after his license has expired is liable to be indicted for a misdemeanor; and that carriers' agents or forwarding agents delivering goods to any other person than a licensed carrier will be liable for any loss of or injury to them.

PROPOSED ROAD,
COUNTY OF GRANT.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a road in the county of Grant (being a portion of the Melbourne and Ballaarat road, in the Bacchus Marsh district, hitherto used as an occupation road), proposed to be made by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owner and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Lands and Survey Office, Melbourne the particulars of which are as follow:—

DESCRIPTION OF ROAD PROPOSED TO BE ADOPTED THROUGH THE PRE-EMPTIVE RIGHT OF GEORGE URQUHART, Esq., IN THE PARISH OF KERBIT BARRETT, IN THE COUNTY OF GRANT.—The centre line of this road begins at a point twenty chains south of the north-east angle of the abovenamed pre-emptive right, and bears thence thirty-seven chains and twenty-five links westward to the Government road running north and south across the pre-emptive right, the road being one and a half chain wide; thence two chains and ten links northward on the said cross road, this road being also one and a half chain wide; thence seventy-seven chains westward to the River Moorabool, the road being one chain wide.

The name of the owner of the land is George Urquhart, Esq., who has granted it as an occupation road to the purchasers of the subdivisions of the pre-emptive right.

The quantity of land required is thirteen acres and fifteen perches.

The cost of adopting the road is nil.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

SOUTH-BARWON MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-two householders resident within the limits of the municipal district of South Barwon, praying for an alteration in the boundary thereof.

The petitioners state that the municipal district of South Barwon as at present defined is partly bounded by the southern and eastern banks of the River Barwon, to the middle of which river the Geelong corporation and the municipality of Newtown and Chilwell, situated on the opposite side, claim jurisdiction, and that they consider that the vesting of such jurisdiction in the local municipal authorities is of public advantage.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
“Your petitioners would therefore humbly pray that where the present boundary line of the South Barwon municipality is defined as the eastern and southern banks of the River Barwon, such boundary line may be extended to the middle of the said River Barwon.”

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT.

A BYE-LAW, No. 28, TO AMEND A BYE-LAW, No. 1, OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLAARAT, ENTITLED, “STANDING ORDERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BALLAARAT.”

BE it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the District of Ballaarat, that the 31st and 32nd clauses of the said bye-law, No. 1 of the said municipal council is hereby repealed, and the following clauses substituted in lieu thereof:—

The chairman or the presiding chairman shall, in taking the vote of any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the ayes or noes as to which party has the majority.

The council shall vote in the affirmative by “ayes,” and in the negative by “noes,” excepting in cases of election, when the vote shall be by ballot; any member of the council may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall first stand up, and afterwards those in the negative, until their votes are recorded.

I, William McCrea, being the chief medical officer in attendance on the execution of Edward Fenlow, at the Gaol of Melbourne, do hereby certify and declare that I have this day witnessed the execution of the said Edward Fenlow at the said gaol; and I further certify and declare that the said Edward Fenlow was, in pursuance of the sentence of the Circuit Court at Castlemaine, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

Given under my hand this twentieth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, at the Gaol of Melbourne.

We do hereby testify and declare that we have this day been present when the extreme penalty of the law was carried into execution on the body of Edward Fenlow, convicted at the criminal sessions of the Circuit Court, held at Castlemaine, on the thirtieth day of July last; and sentenced to death; and the said Edward Fenlow was, in pursuance of the said sentence, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

FIRE BRIGADE.

The municipal council have expended in engines, apparatus, &c.; the sum of One thousand and sixty-eight pounds nine shillings and twopence, including the first moiety of the grant of £600 towards building an engine house (see details).

The committee of the fire brigade accepted tenders for the erection of the building in stone for the sum of £322 15s.

The foundation stone was laid on Friday, the 15th day of June, by W. C. Smith, Esq., chairman of the municipal council. The building is now nearly completed, and irrespective of its great utility, it is one of the greatest ornaments as a public building in the town.

TOWN HALL.

The municipal council invited competitive designs for town hall, the total cost of the building not to exceed £13,000. Eight (8) designs were sent in, and the council selected the one with the motto "To be or not to be," the architect, Chas. D. Cuthbert, Esq. The council have also accepted a tender for a portion of the building from Messrs. Evans and Barker, for the sum of Four thousand nine hundred pounds. The portion which is now in course of erection will include police court and four offices for the use of the municipal council.

The Government have voted towards the erection of the police court the sum of two thousand pounds.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the assent of His Excellency the Governor:—

No. 26. A bye-law for levying a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound upon all houses, lands, and tenements within the municipal district of Ballaarat, for the year ending 16th day of January, 1861.

* The chairman absent on a deputation to the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works, relative to a water supply for Ballaarat.

No. 27. A bye-law to amend a bye-law of the municipal district of Ballarat, intituled, a bye-law No. 16, to prevent the nuisance arising from exposing goods for sale and blocking up the footpaths on the township of Ballarat.

WATER SUPPLY.

The municipal council, in conjunction with the municipal council of Ballarat East, have had several miles of drains cut for conveying the storm water into Yuille's Swamp. The swamp has also been fenced in, and the filter beds have been improved.

The first moiety of the proportion of the expense has been received from the municipal council of Ballarat East.

The chairman of this council, in company with the representatives from the various municipal councils from the gold fields, waited upon the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works respecting a permanent supply of water to the gold field districts. The Government were very favorable towards voting large sums of money for supplying the inland towns of the colony with water wherever the scheme proposed could be carried out, and yield a revenue sufficient to guarantee the issue of Government debentures for such works.

The importance of a sufficient supply of water for the district of Ballarat is paramount, not only for the domestic and sanitary purposes of the population, but the future yield of gold in the district will depend very greatly on the supply of water available for the various uses in washing gold from the alluvial and quartz mines.

The town surveyor reports that, unless an unusual quantity of rain falls during the months of September and October, the supply in Yuille's Swamp will be exhausted before the end of January next.

RAILWAY TERMINUS.

The municipal council of this district sent down a memorial for presentation to the Legislative Assembly, advocating the claims of the district for a terminus on Soldiers' Hill, as they found that attempts were being made to deprive the inhabitants of this district of the advantages of a railway terminus on this township; and from the pledges given by the present and by former Governments, and the reports in the Legislative Assembly, they have every confidence that the terminus will be on Soldiers' Hill.


