THE ANDERSON'S CREEK AND BRUSHY CREEK ELECTORAL DIVISIONS RE-NAMED.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of August, 1860.

WHEREAS by two several Orders of the Governor in Council, made on the 30th day of July now last past, the divisions of the Electoral Provinces and Districts were named and described as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter the nomenclature of the Anderson's Creek and Brushy Creek divisions of the South Province and of the Electoral District of Evelyn, and to interchange the names thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order interchange the names of the said divisions, and doth appoint that the limits and boundaries of such divisions shall be the limits and boundaries mentioned in the fourth column of the Schedule hereunto subjoined opposite to the respective names of such divisions, that is to say:—

		Anderson's Creek*	Commencing at the junction of the Mullum Mullum Creek and the River Yarra Yarra; bounded on the north by the River Yarra Yarra bearing north-easterly to a point due south of the Big Hill, being the north-east angle of section 3 A, parish of Yering; thence on the east by a line bearing south-easterly to the source of the Running Creek; thence by said creek bearing south-easterly to a spur of the Dandenong Range; thence by said range bearing south-westerly to the boundary between the counties of Evelyn and Mornington; thence by said boundary line bearing north-westerly to the source of the Mullum Mullum Creek; thence by said creek bearing north westerly to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable William Nicholson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint that the places for the nomination of Candidates to serve in the Legislative Council of Victoria for each of the electoral provinces shall be the places whose names are prefixed to the respective schedules hereunto annexed; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby appoint that the several places mentioned in the second column of each of such schedules shall be respectively polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for each of such provinces,

and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits of the several divisions of such provinces mentioned in the first column of each of the said schedules shall be taken at any election for each province at the polling place mentioned in the second column of each of the said schedules opposite to the names of such divisions respectively, that is to say:—
