## NOTICE TO WHOLESALE DEALERS IN WINE, SPIRITS, OR FERMENTED MALT LIQUORS, AND BREWERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons dealing as above, in quantities of not less than two gallons, upon which the duty has been paid, unless registered in accordance with the Acts 13 Victoria No. 26 and 20 Victoria No. 4, are liable to a fine of £30.

Certificates of Registration will be granted by the clerk of the bench at the place nearest to the residence of such dealer at which a Court of Petty Sessions is established, within a district duly proclaimed under the Act, or at the office of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, at the Immigration Office, King street; and any person who shall not have duly paid the legal fees of registration into the Treasury, or to a receiver of revenue, will be deemed or taken to be a person not registered within the meaning of the Act.

SIR,—I have much pleasure in informing you that the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have been pleased, at my recommendation, to place at the disposal of the Secretary of

State annually some nominations to Naval Cadetships in favor of candidates recommended to the Secretary of State for this purpose by the Governors of the principal Australian Colonies. The number of such nominations which can be conceded is necessarily very limited, but it will enable me to present to you in each year one nomination to be made in favor of any candidate who may appear to you fully eligible for introduction into Her Majesty's Naval Service.

The enclosed extract of the letter from the Admiralty will place you in possession of some particulars about admission and subsequent training, and you will perceive that further regulations will be hereafter supplied.

Extract of a letter from Mr. Romaine to Mr. Merivale, dated Admiralty, 15th October, 1859.

The candidates will be allowed to undergo a preliminary examination (conducted strictly in accordance with the regulations) on board the senior officer's ship on the station, but in the event of their being found qualified, it will still be necessary that they should be sent to this country to be entered on board the Training Ship at Portsmouth, where they will be subject to the same regulations as all other cadets.

I am further to acquaint you that the age for admission is about to be altered, and the regulations generally are now undergoing revision, but my Lords will supply you with copies so soon as they shall have been finally decided upon.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

THE subjoined Regulations for an examination of candidates for the Civil Service in India, to take place in July, 1860, communicated to the Governor by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

1. In July, 1860, an examination of candidates will be held in London.\*—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st May, 1860, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st May, 1860, will be above eighteen years and under twenty-two years;

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of India;

(c) Satisfactory proof of good moral character;

(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

\* The number of appointments to be made is not at present known.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the numbers set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denote the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates if found duly qualified shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India. They shall be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency to which they shall be appointed.

9. In July, 1861, a further examination of the selected candidates will take place in the following subjects:—

In this, as in the preceding examination, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

10. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India until he shall have passed a further examination, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

11. The selected candidates who at the further examination shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, shall be adjudged to have passed, and to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India.

12. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the further examination.

13. No person will, even after passing the further examination, be allowed to proceed to India unless he shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for the Civil Service of India, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character. The Civil Service Commissioners will require such further evidence on these points as they may deem necessary before granting their certificate of qualification.

14. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.

NOTE.—The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorised the Civil Service Commissioners to state that, with the view of meeting the expenses to be incurred by selected candidates during the interval which must elapse before they can proceed to India, it is his intention to allow the sum of £100 to each selected candidate who shall have passed the further examination in July, 1861, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.
