BYE-LAW No. 24.—FOR AUTHORIZING THE RAISING THE SUM OF ONE THOUSAND POUNDS BY WAY OF MORTGAGE ON THE INCOME OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by 18 Victoria No. 15, section 36, it is enacted that every municipal council shall have power to borrow, by way of mortgage or otherwise, on the credit of land, funds, or income to which it may be entitled, any sum or sums of money that may be required for the purpose of making, carrying on, or completing any permanent improvements that may directly benefit the municipal district for which such council has been elected, not exceeding in the whole the estimated revenue of such municipal corporation for the period of three years: And whereas the revenue of the municipal council of Carisbrook from municipal rates for the three years ending September next will amount to One thousand seven hundred pounds, or thereabouts: And whereas the municipal council of Carisbrook are desirous of borrowing, by mortgage or otherwise, on credit of their income from municipal rates, the sum of One thousand pounds, at interest at the rate of not exceeding ten pounds per centum per annum, for the purpose of carrying on and completing the erection of a market hall and cattle yards for the purposes of a municipal cattle market, such sum with interest at the rate aforesaid to be repaid by half-yearly payments: And whereas by bye-law No. 22 the express sanction of His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council have been given for the erection of a market hall and municipal cattle yards within the municipality of Carisbrook: Be it therefore enacted, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council, it shall and may be lawful for the said municipal council to borrow on mortgage or otherwise of municipal rates, the sum of One thousand pounds, at interest at the rate of not exceeding ten pounds per centum per annum, for the purpose of completing the erection of a market hall, and for erecting municipal cattle yards within the said municipality, by half-yearly payments.




