**REGULATIONS RESPECTING REMISSIONS OF SEN-  
TENCES OF PRISONERS IN GAOLS.**

**T**HE following Regulations respecting remissions of sentences  
of prisoners confined in Gaols have been approved by the  
Governor in Council.

These Regulations will apply to all persons, whether male or  
female, convicted after the 1st of September, 1860; prisoners  
convicted before that date will be dealt with under previously  
existing Rules.

1. The General Rules for Gaols numbered respectively from  
58 to 65, both inclusively, are rescinded, and mitigation of sen-  
tence will be granted only in the form of an absolute remission.

2. No application for mitigation of sentence on the ground of  
good conduct while in confinement will, except under special  
circumstances, be entertained from any prisoner until he shall  
have completed at least two-thirds of the whole term of his  
sentence or cumulative sentences, together with the full periods  
of all punishments awarded him for misconduct while under-  
going imprisonment.

3. In the consideration of any such application, regard will be  
had not only to the general character of the prisoner while in  
confinement, but also to the work which he may have performed;  
and if his conduct shall have been in the least degree unsatisfac-  
tory, or if he shall have been absent from hard labor, or exhibited  
any want of diligence when at work, mitigation of sentence will  
be postponed, or altogether withheld, according to the circum-  
stances of the case.

4. All prior convictions, whether in this colony or elsewhere,  
will be taken into account, and in general the minimum period  
of service will in such cases be extended by one-fourth or more,  
in proportion to the nature of the previous offence.

5. Nothing in these Rules shall be construed to prevent any  
prisoner from at any time memorializing the Executive Govern-  
ment in respect to his conviction, if he can bring forward in  
support of his appeal some material evidence which he was unable  
to adduce at his trial.

**NOTICE TO CARRIERS, CARRIERS' AGENTS, AND  
FORWARDING AGENTS.**

**T**HE attention of carriers, carriers' agents, and forwarding  
agents, is directed to the circumstance that by the Act No.  
78 their licenses must be renewed annually; that any unlicensed  
person acting as a carrier is liable to a penalty of £50; that any  
person permitting the words "licensed carrier" to remain upon  
his vehicle after his license has expired is liable to be indicted for  
a misdemeanor; and that carriers' agents or forwarding agents  
delivering goods to any other person than a licensed carrier will  
be liable for any loss of or injury to them.

**THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF GISBORNE.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (Number 18), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Gisborne.

**PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Swan Hill, in a county unnamed, at the public expense, as and for a lock-up for police purposes: And whereas it is deemed expedient to proclaim such building to be a gaol, prison and house of correction, within the meaning of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said building, called and known as the Police Lock-up, situated at Swan Hill aforesaid, as and to be a public gaol, prison and house of correction, within the meaning of the said Act.

**PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.**

**SOUTH BARWON MUNICIPALITY.**

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-two householders resident within the limits of the municipal district of South Barwon, praying for an alteration in the boundary thereof.

The petitioners state that the municipal district of South Barwon as at present defined is partly bounded by the southern and eastern banks of the River Barwon, to the middle of which river the Geelong corporation and the municipality of Newtown and Chilwell, situated on the opposite side, claim jurisdiction, and that they consider that the vesting of such jurisdiction in the local municipal authorities is of public advantage.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners would therefore humbly pray that where the present boundary line of the South Barwon municipality is defined as the eastern and southern banks of the River Barwon, such boundary line may be extended to the middle of the said River Barwon."

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SUM OF THREE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-FIVE POUNDS, PAID OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR THE YEAR 1860, AS A FIRST INSTALLMENT OF THE GRANT-IN-AID OF THIS MUNICIPALITY.

WHEREAS by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid from the Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct and separate bye-law:

And whereas the legislature of this colony has made a grant-in-aid of the public works of this municipality of Three hundred and thirty-five pounds (£335) as a first instalment for the year 1860: Be it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Buninyong, that such amount be expended as follows, that is to say:—

4. For a fence to be erected on each side of the road at the Union Jack bridge.—Granted.
5. For certain quarries to be placed under the control of this council.—Under consideration.
6. For 100 acres of land for recreative purposes.—Refused.
7. For £2000 to be placed on the estimates of the ensuing year for making a road direct from Buninyong to Smythesdale.—Refused.
