NOTICE TO CARRIERS, CARRIERS' AGENTS, AND FORWARDING AGENTS.

THE attention of carriers, carriers' agents, and forwarding agents, is directed to the circumstance that by the Act No. 78 their licenses must be renewed annually; that any unlicensed person acting as a carrier is liable to a penalty of £50; that any person permitting the words "licensed carrier" to remain upon his vehicle after his license has expired is liable to be indicted for a misdemeanor; and that carriers' agents or forwarding agents delivering goods to any other person than a licensed carrier will be liable for any loss of or injury to them.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF MEMBERS OF THE VICTORIA VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

THE following rules and regulations, agreed to by the members of the undermentioned companies of the Victoria Volunteer Rifle Corps, having been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, are now published for general information:-

1. Every member for admission to a company shall make a personal or written application to the captain commanding, stating name, place of abode, and occupation. The names of all applicants to be read to the company after the next parade.
2. Each member on joining shall attend instruction drill at least twice a week, and shall not be supplied with uniform until he shall have attended at least sixteen drills, or until he shall have been dismissed from drill, whichever may first happen.
3. On all occasions of promotions to the rank of non-commissioned officer, three candidates shall be chosen by ballot at a general meeting of the company, each member to name three, or his vote shall be null and void. A selection from these three shall be made by the commanding officer.
4. No member shall be qualified for promotion until he shall have been dismissed from instruction drill.
5. All members changing their permanent address must, within thirty days, give notice of the same in writing to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Five shillings.
6. Any member of the company intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days, must give notice of such intention, in writing, to the command-

ing officer, and deposit his arms, accoutrements, and uniform, in a place to be appointed by the officer commanding, under a penalty of Ten shillings.

7. There shall be four parades of the company in each month, one of which shall be the commanding officer's parade. The undermentioned fines will be imposed upon any member absenting himself from the commanding officer's parade, viz.:

And the same fines will be inflicted on any member neglecting to attend one of the other parades during the month, unless good and sufficient reason be given to the officer commanding, in writing, on or before the last day of the month. Attendance at a general parade of the companies will be considered equivalent to a company parade other than the commanding officer's.

8. At every parade, on the roll being called, any member not answering to his name shall be deemed absent, unless a sufficient reason has been previously forwarded to the commanding officer. Any member coming late, and assigning a reason for so doing which is deemed sufficient by the commanding officer, shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

9. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence for each offence.

10. Any member guilty of talking or other irregularities on parade will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

11. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

12. The officer commanding the company may at any time convene a general meeting, at which no rule or bye-law shall be passed unless due notice by advertisement or circular shall have been given. At every meeting the senior officer present shall preside.

13. All moneys arising from fines or other sources will be collected by the non-commissioned officers, and paid over to the officer commanding, who will keep a public account, and submit the same for inspection half-yearly, or whenever deemed advisable.

14. Any member expelled the company within twelve months from the receipt of new uniform, will be required to defray the full contract price of the same.

15. A book shall be kept called the "Fine Book," in which all fines shall be entered and signed by the commanding officer; a separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the receiving officer. This book shall be kept by the commanding officer, and shall be produced when required.

16. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer or others duly appointed by the commanding officer to receive the same within fourteen days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment will be proceeded against according to law.

17. Members of the company are liable to be placed in arrest under the following circumstances, viz.:

1st. By order of the officer commanding the company pending investigation of any charge.

2nd. By the senior officer or non-commissioned officer present for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress.

No person placed in arrest may wear his uniform until released.

Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.

19. A court martial shall have the power to censure, fine to the extent of Five pounds, or expel.

20. Any member feeling himself aggrieved, may demand a court martial.

21. All courts martial shall consist of seven members of the age of twenty-one, years and upwards (including the president), of whom one at least shall be a commissioned or non-commissioned officer; the president shall be appointed by the commanding officer, and the other members shall be taken from a roster.

22. A list of the members of the court shall be given to the member accused, who may object to any of the members, such objections to be limited to ten in number.

23. The forms to be observed on courts martial shall be as nearly as possible in accordance with those observed in Her Majesty's army.

24. The decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

25. Bye-laws, not inconsistent with these regulations, or with the provisions of the Acts of the Legislative Council 18th Victoria No. 7, and 19th Victoria No. 8, may be made by any members of the company, and if approved of by the commanding officer, shall be by him submitted for confirmation or rejection at a general meeting of the company called for the purpose; and every such bye-law, if confirmed at such general meeting, shall be binding on all members of the company; and non-compliance with any such bye-law will render the offender liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

26. Every member joining the company to be supplied with a copy of these rules and regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PENTRIDGE COMPANY OF THE VICTORIA VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

THE following rules and regulations, agreed to at a general meeting of the members of the Pentridge Company of the Victoria Volunteer Rifle Corps, having been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

1. The company shall be open to all persons subject to the approval of the select committee to be appointed as hereinafter provided.

2. Each candidate for admission shall be proposed and seconded, in writing, by members of the company, and his name shall be read at the next weekly parade of the company, to give an opportunity to any member to object to his entrance.

3. An annual subscription of Two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the treasurer by each member on or before the 1st day of July in each year.

4. On all occasions of promotion to the rank of non-commissioned officer three candidates shall be chosen, by ballot, at some general meeting of the company, each member present to name three or his vote shall be null and void. An election from these three shall be made by the commanding officer.

5. No member shall be qualified for promotion until he shall have been dismissed from instruction drill.

6. All members changing their permanent address must, within thirty days, give notice of the same in writing to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Five shillings.

7. Any member of the company intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days, must give notice of such intention, in writing, to the commanding officer, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in the orderly-room, under a penalty of Ten shillings.

8. A member being absent from his district of enrolment more than three months at any one time, unless good and sufficient cause for the same shall be shown, shall be considered to have retired from the company.

9. Every member on joining shall attend instruction drill at least twice a week, and shall not be supplied with uniform until he shall have attended at least sixteen drills, or until he shall have been dismissed from drill, whichever may first happen.

10. Company drill shall take place once every week, at such time and place as may be appointed from time to time by the commanding officer, after consulting the wishes of the majority of the company, and must be attended by all members at least twice in each month, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence for each default.

11. The commanding officer's parade shall take place on the first Thursday in each month, or on such other day as he may appoint, and shall be attended by every member (unless he forward a sufficient written excuse to the commanding officer not later than noon on that day), under a penalty of Ten shillings and sixpence for officers, Five shillings for non-commissioned officers, and Two shillings and sixpence for privates.

12. Members accepting rank as commissioned or non-commissioned officers shall attend drill twice every week at least until they are capable of imparting instruction to recruits.

13. Every member will be liable to be sent to instruction drill by the commanding officer for want of knowledge, occasioned by absence or other cause; and for neglecting to attend, or for inattention, talking, or other unsteadiness at any parade or drill, he will be liable to a fine not exceeding Five shillings.

14. At every parade, on the roll being called, any member not answering his name shall be deemed absent, unless an excuse has been previously forwarded to the commanding officer. Any member coming late, and assigning a reason for so doing which is deemed sufficient by the commanding officer, shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

15. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any respect unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence for each offence.

16. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

17. Any member who may desire to leave his arms and accoutrements in charge of the drill sergeant may be permitted to do so on payment of One shilling per month to defray the expense of keeping them clean and in good order.

18. A general meeting of the company shall be held in the first weeks of January and July respectively, of which one week's notice is to be given by circular.

19. The officer commanding the company may at any time convene a special general meeting.

20. On a requisition being signed by not less than ten members, the commanding officer must call a special general meeting.

21. Not less than seven days' notice shall be given of every special general meeting, and no business shall be transacted unless at least one-third of the company are present.

22. At every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman. No person shall be permitted to speak to any question more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover of a resolution, who will be entitled to a reply. All motions shall be delivered to the chairman, in writing, and shall be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two or more members. No protest shall be received, no meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved, without a motion for that purpose.

23. At every half-yearly meeting a select committee, consisting of seven members, of whom one shall be a commissioned officer, and five shall form a quorum, shall be chosen by ballot, for the purposes of the first section of these rules: to audit and settle the accounts of the company, and generally to take into consideration any matters connected with the company that may be referred to them by the commanding officer.

24. Members wishing to resign must give at least fourteen days' notice in writing to the commanding officer.

25. No resignation will be accepted until the member resigning shall have settled all claims against him on account of the company, and shall have forwarded to the orderly-room his arms, accoutrements, and all other property of the company that may be in his possession.

26. Any member permitted to resign within twelve months after having received new uniform must pay for the same according to the following scale:—

Retiring under 7 months	...	Full price of uniform.
At the end of 7 months	...	5-6ths of do.
" 8 "	...	4-6ths of do.
" 9 "	...	3-6ths of do.
" 10 "	...	2-6ths of do.
" 11 "	...	1-6th of do.

27. Any member expelled the company within twelve months from the receipt of new uniform will be required to defray the full contract price of the same.

28. All fines of less than Five pounds shall be imposed by the commanding officer at his discretion.

29. A book shall be kept called the "Fine Book" in which all fines shall be entered, and signed by the commanding officer; a separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the receiving officer. This book shall be kept in the orderly-room, and shall be accessible to every member of the company whenever required.

30. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the treasurer within fourteen days of its notification to him, and in default will be liable to an increase of fifty per cent. on the fine.

31. A list of all claims against members of the company shall be made weekly and kept in view in the orderly-room.

32. On the first week of each month a written notice shall be sent to each defaulter, of every claim against him which may be more than thirty days overdue, and if he shall not pay all such claims in full within thirty days after the service of such notice, he shall be expelled the company; notice of such expulsion being published in the *Government Gazette* and such other public papers as to the commanding officer may seem fit.

33. All moneys received on account of the company shall be paid over to the treasurer, who shall be chosen at a general meeting of the company, and shall make no payment except on the written order of the commanding officer, which shall be a sufficient warrant and voucher.

34. Members of the company are liable to be placed in arrest under the following circumstances:—

1st. By order of the officer commanding the company pending the investigation of any charge.

2nd. By the senior officer present for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without any remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress.

No person placed under arrest may wear his uniform until released. Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

COURTS MARTIAL.

35. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.

36. A court martial shall have the power to censure, fine to the extent of five pounds, or expel.

37. Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.

38. All courts martial shall consist of seven members of the age of twenty-one years and upwards (including the president), of whom at least one shall be a commissioned officer; the president shall be appointed by the commanding officer, and the other members shall be taken in rotation from a roster.

39. A list of the members of the court shall be given to the member accused, who, on showing sufficient cause, may object to any of the members; provided always that such objection be confirmed by the commanding officer.

40. The forms to be observed on courts martial shall be as nearly as possible in accordance with those observed in Her Majesty's army.

41. The decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

42. Bye-laws, not inconsistent with these regulations, nor with the provisions of the Act of the Legislative Council 18 Victoria No. 7, and 19 Victoria No. 8, may be made by the select committee, and if approved of by the commanding officer, shall be by him submitted for confirmation or rejection at the next general meeting of the company; and every such bye-law, if confirmed at such general meeting, shall be thenceforth binding on all members of the company, and non-compliance with any such bye-law will render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding two shillings and sixpence.

43. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any rule or regulation of the company, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen days' notice of the same, in writing, to the commanding officer, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition, to be hung up in the orderly-room.

44. It shall not be competent to recommend to His Excellency the Governor any alteration, rescission, or addition to the existing rules of the company, unless such shall have been agreed to at a general meeting, by an absolute majority of the company.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF KEEPERS OF POWDER MAGAZINES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the guidance of Keepers of Powder Magazines in Victoria, viz.:-

1. Before any barrel, box, or case is received into the magazine it is to be carefully examined; and if it is not perfectly closed, so that no powder or combustible matter can escape, or should any iron be found to have been used either in its construction or repair, it is not to be received into the magazine.

2. No barrel, box, or case is on any account to be opened in the magazine; but when required, it is to be taken to a shifting shed.

3. The magazine is to be kept strictly clean and free from all gravel, sand, or grit; and no iron, light, lucifer match, greased rag, or anything liable to cause combustion, is to be permitted therein.

4. No person is to enter the magazine except with magazine slippers on, or barefooted, and then only in the presence and with the permission of the keeper.

5. No smoking or fire is to be permitted in or near the magazine or shifting sheds.

6. All tools used in coopering casks, or for any other purpose within the magazine, must be of wood or copper.

7. Where there is an outer wall surrounding the magazine, no vehicles are to be permitted to enter within such wall.

8. The attention of keepers is particularly called to the following clause of the Act 22 Victoria No. 66, and they must be careful that the provisions thereof are strictly observed with reference to vehicles receiving powder at the magazine:-

Clause 2. "No gunpowder shall be carried from any magazine, or from one place to any other place, in quantities exceeding ten hundredweight on the same carriage, cart, dray, or wagon; and no gunpowder whatever shall be carried on any carriage licensed or used for the conveyance of passengers, nor in any cart, dray, or wagon or other carriage, unless the same be provided with suitable covering."

The petitioners state that mining operations of an extensive and permanent character are now being carried on in the township by large companies, involving a great outlay of capital and employing a large population, and that the most efficient quartz crushing works in the colony are located there.

That the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable cost.

That there is also much land under cultivation in the immediate neighborhood.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense.

That the creation of the district into a municipality will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest the following municipal area, viz. :— Commencing at a point 120 chains south of the south-east corner of the post office reserve, by a line running west 120 chains; thence north 240 chains; thence east 240 chains; thence south 240 chains; thence west 120 chains to the commencing point; such area containing a population of more than three hundred householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows :—
“Your petitioners therefore humbly beseech your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of ‘The Municipal District of Clunes,’ according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.”

- For a fence to be erected on each side of the road at the Union Jack bridge.—Granted.
- For certain quarries to be placed under the control of this council.—Under consideration.
- For 100 acres of land for recreative purposes.—Refused.
- For £3000 to be placed on the estimates of the ensuing year for making a road direct from Buninyong to Smythesdale.—Refused.
