### NOTICE TO CARRIERS, CARRIERS' AGENTS, AND FORWARDING AGENTS.

THE attention of carriers, carriers' agents, and forwarding agents, is directed to the circumstance that by the Act No. 78 their licenses must be renewed annually; that any unlicensed person acting as a carrier is liable to a penalty of £50; that any person permitting the words "licensed carrier" to remain upon his vehicle after his license has expired is liable to be indicted for a misdemeanor; and that carriers' agents or forwarding agents delivering goods to any other person than a licensed carrier will be liable for any loss of or injury to them.

LAND SET APART AT DIVERS PLACES FOR PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, has, by an Order made on the 3rd day of September, 1860, set apart the pieces or portions of land hereinafter described, situate at the undermentioned places, as sites for public buildings, viz. —

2nd. From and after the passing of this bye-law, Bye-law No. 36 of this council, *To regulate the conducting of the election of members of the municipal council*, and Bye-law No. 41, *To alter and amend clauses No. 2 and 9 of Bye-law No. 36 of the municipal council of Williamstown, and for introducing new clauses therein*, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
