From and after the passing of this byc-law, Byc-law No. 36 of this council, To regulate the conducting of the election of members of the municipal council, and Byc-law No. 41, To alter and amend clauses No. 2 and 9 of Byc-law No. 36 of the municipal council of Williamstown, and for introducing new clauses therein, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
