### NOTICE TO CARRIERS, CARRIERS' AGENTS, AND FORWARDING AGENTS.

THE attention of carriers, carriers' agents, and forwarding agents, is directed to the circumstance that by the Act No. 78 their licenses must be renewed annually; that any unlicensed person acting as a carrier is liable to a penalty of £50; that any person permitting the words "licensed carrier" to remain upon his vehicle after his license has expired is liable to be indicted for a misdemeanor; and that carriers' agents or forwarding agents delivering goods to any other person than a licensed carrier will be liable for any loss of or injury to them.

### ALTERATION OF POLLING PLACES FOR THE WESTERN PROVINCE.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint that the places mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereunto annexed shall be respectively polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the Western Province, and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits of the divisions mentioned in the first column of the same schedule shall be taken at any election for such Province at the polling places set opposite to the names of such divisions respectively in the said second column, that is to say:—

#### PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT. CLUNES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-nine householders of the township of Clunes, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that mining operations of an extensive and permanent character are now being carried on in the township by large companies, involving a great outlay of capital and employing a large population, and that the most efficient quartz crushing works in the colony are located there.

That the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable cost.

That there is also much land under cultivation in the immediate neighborhood.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense.

That the creation of the district into a municipality will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest the following municipal area, viz.:— Commencing at a point 120 chains south of the south-east corner of the post office reserve, by a line running west 120 chains; thence north 240 chains; thence east 240 chains; thence south 240 chains; thence west 120 chains to the commencing point; such area containing a population of more than three hundred householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore humbly beseech your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of ‘The Municipal District of Clunes,’ according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.”

For the month of August, the rate of mortality in Melbourne and suburbs showed considerable improvement as compared with that of the previous month, the number of deaths having been 271 or 8.74 daily, against 319 or 10.29 a day in July. The comparison with the month of August, 1859, is not equally favorable, the deaths for that month having numbered only 221 or 7.1 daily.

The mean temperature for the month was 49.4°, against 47.3° for July, and against 51.3° for August, 1859. The maximum temperature (64.9°) was at 2 p.m. on the 27th, and the minimum (34.6°) at 6 a.m. on the 29th, the range for the month thus being 30.3°. The greatest daily range (25.1°) was on the 31st, from a maximum of 64.1° to a minimum of 39.0°, the least (6.3°) on the 4th, from a maximum of 51.8° to a minimum of 45.5°, and the mean daily range for the month was 15.5°. The highest point reached by the barometer (30.556 in.) was at 10 a.m. on the 2nd, and the lowest (29.607 in.) was at 4 a.m. on the 24th; the range of pressure for the month thus being .949 in., and the mean pressure 30.173 in. The mean pressure for the month of August, 1859, was 30.4 in.

For the first four weeks in August the mean temperature and daily average of mortality were as follow:—

Of the 271 deaths which took place during the month, 165 or about 61 per cent. were of males, and 106 or 39 per cent. were of females. The deaths of persons over 5 years of age slightly outnumbered those of persons under that age, there having been 137, or nearly 51 per cent. of the former against 134, or about 49 per cent. of the latter. A similar result obtained also in the months of June and July. It was remarked in the report for June, that with the single exception of September, 1859, in no one month of the preceding twelve, were the deaths of persons over 5 years of age in excess of those of children under that age. In August, the greatest number of persons dying on any one day (16) was on the 13th; during the previous month (July) the greatest number of deaths on any one day was 17, and during the month of August, 1859, it was 12.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of last census, the daily average of deaths during the months of July and August, and the increase or decrease of the rate of mortality in August, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

NOTE.—The population of Melbourne and suburbs, as shown by the census of 1857, is given as a guide to the probable relative proportions rather than to the actual numbers of the present inhabitants of the several sub-districts.

Of the 134 deaths of children under five which occurred during the month, 81 or about 60 per cent. were of males, 53 or about 40 per cent. of females. Of the entire number of both sexes 69 were less than a year old, 37 between one year and three, and 28 between three years and five.

Of 137 persons who died over five years of age, 84 or about 61 per cent. were males, 53 or 39 per cent. females. Of the entire number, 35 were between the ages of five and fifteen, 38 between fifteen and thirty, 32 between thirty and forty-five, 20 between forty-five and sixty, and 12 over sixty years of age. Of the latter, 3 females had reached the age of 70 years, and one that of 78; one male was 75 years old, one 77, and another 78. Six lunatics (four males and two females), died during the month at the Yarra Bend Asylum.

The deaths from zymotic diseases during the month of August bore, within a fraction, the same proportion to the total deaths from all causes, that they did in July. Scarlatina still remained high in August, the returns showing 33 deaths from that cause against 32 in July. Of diphtheria 14 deaths were returned in August against 15 in July. Deaths from other diseases of the zymotic class, diminished in about the same proportions as the mortality generally.

Of sporadic diseases, those of uncertain seat showed an increase in their proportions to the total, of 6 per cent.; this was owing to the number of children dying of debility in August, 25 fatal cases having been returned from that cause against 9 in July. Diseases of the respiratory organs, although numerically fewer, showed an increase in their proportions to the total mortality in August, 27.7 per cent. of the deaths having been caused by complaints of this class against 25.4 per cent. in July; phthisis and pneumonia caused respectively 34 and 21 deaths against 37 and 23 in July. The greatest improvement was in diseases of the digestive organs, only 2.6 per cent. of the deaths of the month having been from that class of diseases against 9.1 per cent. in July.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 23.—FOR THE PREVENTION OF THE STRAYING OF CATTLE, SHEEP, PIGS, AND GOATS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BE it ordered and directed by the municipal council of Ballaarat East, in accordance with the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No 15, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer any horse, sheep, pig, goat, or other cattle belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large or to wander in or upon any street, public place, or unenclosed place within the municipal district of Ballaarat East, whether the same be or be not public property; and any person who shall so offend shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds; and it shall be lawful for the town inspector, or any other person, to place any horse, sheep, pig, goat, or other cattle so at large as aforesaid, into some enclosed place or yard, appointed for that purpose by the said municipal council, until the owner or owners thereof have been found and dealt with as aforesaid.

BYE-LAW No. 29.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT EAST, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR 1860 AND 1861.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore enacted, that the assessment of the annual value of property within the municipality of Ballaarat East, estimated at £61,281 10s., as approved of by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing the 1st June, 1860, and ending the 1st June, 1861.

BYE-LAW No. 30.—FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND THREEPENCE IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT EAST, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR OF 1860 AND 1861.

MUNICIPALITY OF BUNINYONG.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR REGULATING AND LICENSING PUBLIC VEHICLES, PUBLIC CARTERS, WATER DRAWERS, AND NIGHTMEN.

WHEREAS by an Act of 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district, established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the regulation and licensing of public carriers, carters, water drawers, and public vehicles, the restraining noisome and offensive trades, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Buninyong, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria:—

1. That no vehicle of any description whatsoever, excepting stage coaches running long distances, shall carry passengers for hire within this municipality unless the same be duly licensed.
2. That the owner or owners of every public vehicle carrying passengers for hire within this municipality, shall register their names and addresses, and the names and addresses of their drivers, at the town clerk's office, and shall submit the vehicle, horses, and harness required to be licensed, to the inspection of the council or their inspector; and the council shall thereupon determine the number of passengers to be carried at any one time in or upon the said vehicle; and after satisfying themselves as to the good character of the person who shall be registered as the driver thereof, may grant a license in the annexed form (marked A); and the owner or owners of every licensed vehicle shall cause to be conspicuously and legibly printed thereon the number of his or their license, and the number of passengers that such vehicle has been licensed to carry; and any owner of a licensed vehicle changing his place of abode, or selling such vehicle, shall give notice thereof in writing to the town clerk within three days of such change of residence or sale, or in default shall be liable to the penalty imposed by this bye-law; and any purchaser of such vehicle using the same for hire before having had his name endorsed on the license of such vehicle by

the town clerk, shall be deemed and taken to be the owner of an unlicensed vehicle, and be subject to the penalty imposed by this bye-law.

3. Be it further ordered and directed, that the owner of every cart, dray, or other vehicle plying for hire within the said municipal district, shall register his name and place of abode in the town clerk's office, and shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, and the number of his license; and the owner of every cart or dray plying for hire shall have the number of his license with his name legibly painted and conspicuously fixed to the right or off side of the dray or cart: Provided always that in case the owner shall have more than one cart or dray plying for hire, he shall take out a license for each and every such cart or dray in the same manner as though they belonged to different owners.

4. Be it further ordered and directed, that every public water carter plying within the said municipal district shall, register his name and place of abode in the town clerk's office, and shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, the number of the license, and also the reward and amounts which the council hold themselves bound to pay to water carters supplying water under their direction in cases of fire; and the owner of every such water cart shall have the number of his license, with his name, legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to the right or left side of such water cart; and further, every such public water carter shall have the words "water cart," and the number of his license, legibly painted and fixed in a conspicuous manner on the outside of his residence or the premises where the said water cart is placed at night; and further be it ordered, the better to guard against accidents by fire, that the owners of all public water carts shall keep them constantly loaded with water during the night, and also, if called upon by the council, or any officer duly authorised by them, shall, with all due diligence, and to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within the municipal boundary, and any water who shall fail without reasonable cause to keep his water cart so loaded, or refuse or neglect to supply water to fires when called upon as aforesaid, or fail to comply with the conditions herein imposed, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter imposed.

5. Be it further ordered and directed, that the owner of any cart or dray engaged for hire in carting night-soil, offal, or offensive refuse, shall register his name and abode, and also satisfy the council that he is a fit and proper person to carry on the trade of nightman. The name and address of every nightman, together with the number of his license, and the words "licensed cart or dray," as the case may be, shall be legibly painted and affixed in a conspicuous position upon the cart or dray with which he shall ply for hire; and every such cart or dray shall have affixed thereto, when employed in the removal of night-soil, two colored lights (bull's eyes), that on the off-side to be green, and that on the near side to be red.

6. Any person who shall deposit night-soil in any other place than such as has been assigned for that purpose by the council, or who shall be engaged in the removal of night-soil before Ten o'clock p.m., or who shall be found with any cart or dray with night-soil therein within any part of the municipality after Five o'clock a.m. of any day, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter named.

7. Any person committing any act against the provisions of this bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions or regulations contained herein, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of every municipality established pursuant to this Act is empowered to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of the public health, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Warrnambool, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, that any building in so ruinous, insecure, or dangerous a condition as that passengers are endangered thereby, shall be deemed to be a public nuisance.

1. That the owner, occupier, or agent of any building in a ruinous, insecure, or dangerous condition as aforesaid, shall, on receiving notice to that effect from the council, through the surveyor or other officer appointed for that purpose, cause, with all convenient speed, any such ruinous, insecure, or dangerous building to be securely shored up, repaired, or pulled down; and the owner, occupier, or agent of any such building refusing or neglecting to properly shore up, repair, or pull down so much of the building or premises as the case may require for the protection of passengers, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, pay a sum or penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

2. It shall be lawful for the municipal council to cause notice in writing to be given to the owner, occupier, or agent of such building; and in case the owner, occupier, or agent cannot be found, or his or their residences not known, to post such notice on the premises, to shore up, repair, or pull down the same, or any part thereof, as the case may require, within fourteen days then next ensuing; and if within the said fourteen days the repair, shoring up, or demolition thereof be not begun and be not completed as soon as the nature of the case will admit, then the municipal council may order, with all convenient speed, such building, or part thereof as may be necessary for the safety and security of the public, to be shored up, repaired, or pulled down, or secured in such manner as may from time to time be requisite; and any such owner, occupier, or agent refusing or neglecting to pay on demand the cost of such shoring up, repairing, or pulling down, shall be liable on default thereof, and conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, to pay a sum or penalty, for every such neglect, refusal, or offence, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

**MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.**

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING ON THE 31ST DAY OF JULY, 1860.

At the first meeting of the council, after the annual election of members, James Trangmar, Esq., was elected chairman. The expenditure of the council on public works during the past half-year amounted to the sum of £128 6s. only, owing to the late period of payment of the grant from the Government for the present year.

The council have, in compliance with the wishes of a large number of the inhabitants, urged on the Government the propriety of selling that portion of the Survey Paddock within the district, which has been complied with, and the survey is now in progress, but they have not yet succeeded in getting a sum appropriated to the drainage of the swamp, although the attention

of the Government has been repeatedly directed to this important question, and a deputation of the council waited on the members for the town and county of Normanby to request them to use their best efforts to have a sum adequate for the purpose placed on the estimates, the result of which has not yet been ascertained.

In consequence of the term for which the council chamber, in common with other public offices, was held by the Government, having expired, the council have rented the chamber of Mr. Cameron, the proprietor, at the rate of £40 per annum.

The council have rendered assistance to the Volunteer Rifle Corps, raised in Portland, by defraying the expenses of erecting shooting butts for practice at a moderate expense.

The public slaughter-house, as to which considerable difficulty has been experienced since its erection, is now let to Mr. John Huxley at a rent of £110 per annum, and all difficulties on the subject appear to have ceased.
