ORDER IN COUNCIL, MAKING PROVISION FOR APPEALS FROM THE SUPREME COURT OF THE COLONY OF VICTORIA TO HER MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Governor has directed the Order of Her Majesty in Council, subjoined hereto, to be promulgated, together with the Despatch of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Extract therein referred to.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, it was enacted, that there should be in the said colony a Court styled the "Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria," with the power and jurisdiction therein mentioned; and that persons aggrieved by the decision of the said Court might, in certain cases therein mentioned, appeal therefrom to Her Majesty in Council, but that nothing contained in the said Act should be construed to affect the Royal Prerogative, or to abridge the power of Her Majesty to allow any person so aggrieved to appeal to Her Majesty at any time in such manner as Her Majesty would be graciously pleased to allow: And whereas by an Act passed in a session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty, it was enacted, that it should be competent to Her Majesty, by any Order or Orders in Council, to provide for the admission of appeals to Her Majesty in Council from any judgments, sentences, decrees, or orders of any court of justice within any British colony or possession abroad, although such court should not be a court of errors or appeal within such colony or possession, and to make provision for the instituting and prosecuting such appeals, and for carrying into effect any such decisions or sentences as Her Majesty in Council should pronounce thereon: And whereas it is desirable that provision should be made to enable parties to appeal from the decisions of the said Supreme Court to Her Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that any person or persons may appeal to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, in her or their Privy Council, from any final judgment, decree, order, or sentence of the said Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, in such manner, within such time, and under and subject to such rules, regulations, and limitations as are hereinafter mentioned; that is to say, in case any such judgment, decree, order, or sentence shall be given or pronounced for or in respect of any sum or matter at issue above the amount or value of Five hundred pounds sterling (£500), or in case such judgment, decree, order, or sentence shall involve, directly or indirectly, any claim, demand, or question to or respecting property, or any civil right amounting to or of the value of Five hundred pounds sterling (£500), the person or persons feeling aggrieved by any such judgment, decree, order, or sentence may, within fourteen days next after the same shall have been pronounced, made, or given, apply to the said Court, by motion or petition, for leave to appeal therefrom to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, in her or their Privy Council; and in case such leave to appeal shall be prayed by the party or parties who is or are directed to pay any such sum of money or perform any duty, the said Court shall be and is hereby empowered, either to direct that the judgment, decree, order, or sentence appealed from shall be carried into execution, or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the said appeal, as to the said Court may appear to be most consistent with real and substantial justice; and in case the said Court shall direct such judgment, decree, order, or sentence to be carried into execution, the person or persons in whose favour the same shall be given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to be approved by the said Court, for the due performance of such judgment or order as Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, shall think fit to make thereupon; and in all cases security shall also be given by the party or parties appellant in a

bond or mortgage or personal recognizance not exceeding the value of £500 sterling for the prosecution of the appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may be awarded by Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, or by the Judicial Committee of Her Majesty's Privy Council, to the party or parties respondent; and if such last-mentioned security shall be entered into within three months from the date of such motion or petition for leave to appeal, then, and not otherwise, the said Court shall allow the appeal, and the party or parties appellants shall be at liberty to prefer and prosecute his, her, or their appeal to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, in her or their Privy Council, in such manner and under such rules as aforesaid or may be observed in appeals made to Her Majesty from Her Majesty's colonies and plantations abroad.

And it is further ordered, that it shall be lawful for the said Supreme Court, at its discretion, on the petition of any party who considers himself aggrieved by any preliminary or interlocutory judgment, decree, order, or sentence of the said Supreme Court, to grant permission to such party to appeal against the same to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, in her or their Privy Council, subject to the same rules, regulations, and limitations as are herein expressed respecting appeals from final judgments, decrees, orders, and sentences.

Provided also, that if in any action, suit, or other proceeding it shall so happen that no final judgment, decree, order, or sentence can be duly given in consequence of a disagreement of opinion between the Judges of the said Supreme Court, then and in such case the final judgment, decree, order, or sentence may be entered *pro forma*, on the petition of any of the parties to the action, suit, or other proceedings, according to the opinion of the Chief Justice, or in his absence of the Senior Puisne Judge of the said Supreme Court, provided that such judgment, decree, order, or sentence shall be deemed a judgment, decree, order, or sentence of the Court for the purpose of an appeal against the same, but not for any other purpose.

Provided always, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing herein contained doth or shall extend or be construed to extend to take away or abridge the undoubted right and authority of Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, upon the humble petition at any time of any person or persons aggrieved by any judgment or determination of the said Court, to admit his, her, or their appeal therefrom, upon such terms, and upon such securities, limitations, restrictions, and regulations, as Her Majesty, her heirs or successors, shall think fit, and to reverse, correct, or vary such judgment or determination as to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, shall seem meet.

And it is further ordered, that in all cases of appeal allowed by the said Court, or by Her Majesty, her heirs or successors, the said Court shall certify and transmit to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, in her or their Privy Council, a true and exact copy of all evidence, proceedings, judgments, decrees, and orders had or made in such cases appealed, so far as the same have relation to the matters of appeal, such copies to be certified under the seal of the said Court; and that the said Court shall also certify and transmit to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, in her or their Privy Council, a copy of the reasons given by the Judges of such Court, or by any of such Judges, for or against the judgment or determination appealed against, where such reasons shall have been given in writing, and where such reasons shall have been given orally then a statement in writing of the reasons given by the Judges of such Court, or by any of such Judges, for or against the judgment or determination appealed against.

And it is further directed and ordained, that the said Court shall, in all cases of appeal to Her Majesty, her heirs or successors, conform to and execute, or cause to be executed, such judgments and orders as Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, shall think fit to make in the premises, in such manner as any original judgment, decree, or decretal order, or other order or rule of the said Court, should or might have been executed.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Newcastle, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SIR,—I transmit to you herewith an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 9th of June, 1860, for making provision for appeals from the decisions of the Supreme Court in Victoria, to Her Majesty in Council.

This Order has been passed with the view of placing the Appellate jurisdiction of Her Majesty over the Courts of the colony under your government on the same footing as the Appellate jurisdiction over the Courts of New South Wales, and similar measures have been taken with regard to South Australia and New Zealand.

The annexed extract of a letter (1st May, 1860), from the Council Office, will place you in possession of the particular reason which has led to the passing of this Order.

Extract from a letter of the 1st May, from Mr. Reeve to Mr. Elliot.

In Victoria the right of appeal is at present regulated by a Colonial Act (15 Victoria No. 10), entitled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, and the right of appeal is limited to matters amounting to £1000 sterling in value, whereas in all the other Australian colonies the limit is £500. It appears to the Lord President that this distinction is objectionable, and cannot be supported.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

SWAN SPIT LIGHT.

IN accordance with a notice issued from this office, dated 7th February, 1860:

Masters of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the West Channel are hereby informed that on and after the 1st day of October next, from sunset to sunrise, a Fixed Red Light will be exhibited from a new lighthouse built on Swan Spit upon piles, and the lightship now moored there removed.

The Swan Spit Lighthouse is situated on the S.W. end of the spit, in fifteen (15) feet at low water, two hundred and fifty (250) fathoms off shore, with the following bearings:-

Upper Light, Shortland's Bluff, S. 56 W.
Royal George Perch Buoy, S. 37 W.
Fairway Beacon, on Swan Island, N. 69 W.

There are two small sand knolls outside of the lighthouse, with not more than twelve (12) feet of water over them, bearing respectively from the lighthouse E.N.E. and S.E. by E. distant forty (40) fathoms.

Vessels must not approach the lighthouse nearer than sixty (60) fathoms, outside of which distance there is a clear channel of one-third of a mile, with three, four, and five fathoms water.

A gong will be sounded every ten (10) minutes during thick and foggy weather.

Caution.-All persons in charge of vessels passing this lighthouse are cautioned against running foul of it, and are reminded that clause VII. of 16 Victoria No. 12 provides for the infliction of a heavy penalty for any injury done to lights, beacons, or sea-marks.

WEST CHANNEL LIGHTSHIP.

Notice is hereby given that on or about the 3rd of October next, the West Channel Lightship will be removed to Hobson's Bay for repairs, and her place temporarily occupied by the Swan Spit Lightship, which vessel will exhibit two Fixed White Lights similar to those now shown on board the West Channel Lightship.

CHECKERED BUOY ON WHITE STAR KNOLL, NEAR THE WEST CHANNEL LIGHTSHIP.

The depth of water over the White Star Knoll having increased to sixteen (16) feet, the checkered buoy hitherto moored there will on the 1st of October next be removed.

Vessels of heavy draught passing to the eastward of the lightship are cautioned not to approach within a cable's length.

ROCKY PATCH OFF THE LITTLE RIVER.

A sunken beacon, surmounted with a red ball fourteen feet high, has been placed in nine (9) feet water upon the southern end of a rocky patch situated between Point Wilson and the Halfway Trees, about a mile off shore, with the following bearings:-

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.
 CLUNES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-nine householders of the township of Clunes, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that mining operations of an extensive and permanent character are now being carried on in the township by large companies, involving a great outlay of capital and employing a large population, and that the most efficient quartz crushing works in the colony are located there.

That the dwellings of the colony and inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable cost.
 That there is also much land under cultivation in the immediate neighborhood.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense.

That the creation of the district into a municipality will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest the following municipal area, viz. :— Commencing at a point 120 chains south of the south-east corner of the post office reserve, by a line running west 120 chains; thence north 240 chains; thence east 240 chains; thence south 240 chains; thence west 120 chains to the commencing point; such area containing a population of more than three hundred householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows :—
 "Your petitioners therefore humbly beseech your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Clunes,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

THE FRANKLIN AND YANDOIT ROAD DISTRICT.
RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE FRANKLIN AND
YANDOIT DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

MEETINGS.

THE board meetings may at all times be attended by the inhabitants and ratepayers of the district, but no individuals except the members will be allowed to take any part whatever in the business, and any person interrupting the proceedings will be requested by the chairman to retire.

2. The time stated in the notice calling any meeting of the board shall at all times be observed, provided there be three members present, this number to be a legal quorum; if, however, there be less than three members present at the expiration of half an hour, such circumstance, together with the name of the members present, shall be entered in the minute book, and such meeting shall lapse.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

1. Reading and confirmation of minutes, and no discussion to be allowed on them except as to their accuracy.

2. Any correspondence to or from the board shall then be read.

3. Petitions or reports handed in, but no discussion upon either shall be permitted until due notice has been given; and the member presenting them shall, if he wishes, call for their consideration after the motions given notice of at last meeting are disposed of.

4. Receiving reports of committees.

5. The business, notice of which was entered in the notice paper of the last meeting, shall then be called on in their order upon the list; none of which, however, can be proceeded with in the absence of the mover, unless some other member has a written authority from such mover to take it up, and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out.

6. Every communication addressed to the board shall be opened at the board table.

7. All reports handed in by any committee shall be considered on presentation, and recommendations contained in such report shall only be adopted by sense of the board being taken separately on each.

8. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it is first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board regularly convened, and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, be fixed up in the office for the inspection of any of the ratepayers.

9. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall, if he so choose, be a member of such committee.

10. It shall be the duty of the secretary to give notice to any members of the board that may be absent from any meeting of the board, the date fixed for the next meeting, and also to state the nature of the business to be then brought forward.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

1. Any member when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted except by a call to order; the member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business called on.

2. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or in reply as the mover of an original motion, and upon such explanation or reply the question shall be put to the vote.

3. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

4. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the mover.

5. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed until it is seconded; and any member may require the enforcement of any standing order of the board by simply noticing that such has been disobeyed.

6. If two or more members rise at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-eminence.

7. No member shall digress from the subject, or impute improper motives to others, and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

8. Any member who shall use expressions capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

9. Any member may of right demand the production of any document of the board relating to the question or matter under discussion.

10. The chairman, or any other member of the board, shall stand up when addressing the board in discussion of any question.

11. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

12. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

13. The board in all cases shall vote by show of hands.

14. The chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to declare from the show of hands which party has the majority.

15. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the board, but if on the question being put and lost the subject then under discussion, or the next on the notice

paper, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, and the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

16. No motion the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been made for that purpose, and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board, which shall have been negatived by the board, shall be again entertained during the same year.

17. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice has been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

CONTRACTS.

1. No member shall be allowed to contract directly or indirectly, or be received as surety for any officer or contractor, nor shall any auditor or other officer become surety for any other employe of the board, or for any work to be done for the board; and if any member shall contract directly or indirectly, satisfactory proof of the same being given to the board, the contract or contracts so made shall (on the motion of any member to that effect being put to the board and carried) be rescinded and of no effect. And in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same to be borne by the party giving the same.

2. All contracts shall be made by tender advertised not less than twice in the local or other papers; each tender to be deposited in the tender box, addressed to the chairman; and such tenders only to be opened at the time of their consideration by the board, when the tenderers may be present; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered on the minutes of the board. And when tenders are accepted, a contract bond shall be entered into and signed by the contractor the chairman, and two members of the board, the seal of the board being attached thereto.

3. The security in all cases of contracts shall be Ten pounds per cent. upon the amount of the contract paid over by the contractor to the chairman of the board, which amount shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the board, and only repaid to the contractor when he receives his final certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

1. The assessors, in making the assessment, shall be wholly and entirely guided by the provisions of the Act of Parliament relating to road boards and their powers; and notice of appeal against such assessment must be given to the board within 21 (twenty-one) days after the assessment notice has been served, when the board will appoint a day for hearing the same.

2. In all cases it shall be deemed sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due upon the assessment roll, and in the event of such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that unless the amount be paid to the secretary of the board before the expiration of one month from the date thereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery. A duplicate of such notice to be deposited in the office of the board.

The foregoing rules and regulations were passed by the Franklin and Yandoit District Road Board on the 26th June, 1860.
