## ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

## No. VI.—BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING QUARTZ MINING IN THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.—[10th July, 1860.]

**A**T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 10th day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Extent of prospecting claims.*—When prospecting for a quartz reef, two miners shall be entitled to hold two hundred (200) feet along the course of the reef, which must be marked when the claim is first taken up by two pegs always kept visible; they will also be entitled to a breadth at right angles of eight hundred (800) feet, until payable gold has been obtained, after which such breadth must be reduced to four hundred (400) feet, and defined by four (4) pegs; and all reefs or veins of quartz within the said area shall be the property of the claimholders.

No second prospecting claim shall be granted within half a mile from the centre of the claim of any party prospecting for the same reef.

2. *Extent of ordinary claims.*—In ordinary claims two miners shall be entitled to hold one hundred (100) feet along the course of the reef, which must be marked when the claim is first taken up by two pegs always kept visible; they will also be entitled to hold a breadth at right angles of six hundred (600) feet, until payable gold has been obtained, after which such breadth must be reduced to four hundred (400) feet, and the boundaries of the claim defined by four (4) pegs, and all reefs or veins of quartz within the said area shall be the property of the claimholders.

3. *Breadth of claim to be defined.*—Any claimholders neglecting to define the breadth of their claim within three (3) months after having obtained payable gold, will only be entitled to hold two hundred (200) feet on either side of the shaft they are working in.

4. *Claims to be numbered.*—All claims shall be numbered consecutively north and south from the prospecting claim, which shall be No. 1.

5. *Wall to be left.*—Three (3) feet of neutral ground shall be left by the party last marking out a claim, which must be left standing as a wall until both parties agree to divide or otherwise dispose of the same.

6. *Penalty for not leaving a wall.*—Where any party neglects to leave the proper thickness of wall, the necessary thickness may be deducted from the claim last marked out, and assigned as a wall between such party and the adjoining claimholders.

7. *Oversized claims.*—Any party having marked out too much ground, the warden may curtail such claim, and assign the spare ground to any miners first claiming the same, without leaving any wall between such spare ground and the claim so overmarked.

8. *Disputed boundaries.*—In cases of disputed boundaries, except as in clauses 6 and 7, the complaining parties must give at least ten days' notice, in writing, to the other claimholders of their intention to call in the warden to adjudicate, in order that they may have time to obtain a competent surveyor.

9. *Claims to be worked in a bond fide manner.*—Four days after a claim has been taken possession of it must be worked in a bond fide manner, unless a representative of such claim is prevented by sickness or urgent business, in which case the other shareholders, or the majority, may have his place supplied by a competent miner, and he shall be responsible for any reasonable wages to the person so employed.

10. *Permanent amalgamation of claims.*—The holders of any number of claims may amalgamate permanently by posting near the centre of their claims a notice, stating the numbers of the claims to be amalgamated; such amalgamated claims must be represented in the same manner as ordinary claims, in proportion to the quantity of ground included therein.

11. *Temporary amalgamation of claims.*—The holders of any number of adjoining claims may amalgamate temporarily to test the reef, subject to mutual agreements made amongst the shareholders.

12. *Suspension of work allowed.*—Any miners who have done three (3) consecutive months' bond fide work on a claim may obtain a certificate from the warden, authorising suspension of work for any period not exceeding three months; previous to a subsequent suspension being allowed, three additional months' bond fide work must be done on the claim; seven days prior to the granting of any suspension certificate, the miners requiring such suspension shall post a notice to that effect on some conspicuous part of their claim, which notice shall contain the name of each shareholder, together with the date and number of his miner's right, and unless valid objections be made by adjoining claimholders, within the seven days specified, it shall be lawful for the warden to grant a certificate for such suspension; no certificate will be granted if the holders of the greater part of the interest in a claim are opposed thereto.

13. *Extended suspension on the water level.*—The holders of any claim on a reef who first strike the water shall be entitled to receive from the warden a certificate authorising further suspension of work for three months, and the holders of other claims on the same reef shall only be entitled to suspend work until the three months granted to the first party has expired. At the time of this bye-law coming into force, the claimholders on any reef who are in possession of certificates authorising suspension of work, in consequence of having sunk to the water level, will be entitled to renew such suspension until the expiration of the certificate bearing the latest date upon each reef; such certificates to be renewable for periods not exceeding three months.

14. *Machinery claims.*—On any claim where machinery has been erected to assist in working it, the owners shall be entitled for each nominal five (5) horse power of their engine to hold the quantity of ground allowed to one miner, and all holders of miners' rights employed in obtained fuel, or in doing other work in connection with such machinery claims, shall be considered as representing the same; and the owners of the machinery that has been erected may take possession of any share that is aban-

doned on such claim, provided they represent the same in accordance with this bye-law within one week after such forfeiture.

15. *Accident to machinery.*—When the working of any claim is impeded by accident to the machinery employed thereon, it shall be lawful for the warden to grant a protection certificate specifying the time allowed for repairing the same, a copy of which must be kept posted on the claim.

16. *Agreements among shareholders.*—Whatever mutual written agreements are entered into by the shareholders of any claim for the proper working thereof, shall be binding upon any one purchasing an interest, or taking possession of a forfeited share in such claim.

17. *Ownership of shares.*—Any holder of a miner's right may hold one or more shares in any number of claims, provided the same be represented in accordance with this bye-law. But no miner shall be allowed to mark more than one claim on any reef until the claim last marked by him be abandoned, or shall have been worked in a bond fide manner at least four days. Any infringement of this clause shall render the share or claim last previously occupied by him liable to forfeiture.

18. *Protection to sleeping interests.*—No miner shall take possession of any interest that may be vested in his employer except under the following circumstances, viz.:—Any sleeping shareholder neglecting for one month to pay wages due to a working shareholder representing his interest, shall forfeit the same, and the interest so forfeited shall become the property of the working shareholder.

19. *Protection to mortgagees.*—Any person having advanced money by way of mortgage upon the interest owned by another in any claim, shall have a preferential title to such interest, and the same shall not be forfeited for non-compliance with this bye-law, unless the mortgagee or his agent has failed to comply with the same after receiving one month's written notice from the person intending to take possession of the same. Every such mortgage must be registered with the registrar or his deputy.

20. *Deceased partners.*—The surviving partners of deceased miners may hold and work their interest for the benefit of their representatives, until such representatives demand possession of the same.

21. *Registration of interests.*—Any person holding an interest in any claim shall register the same with the registrar or his deputy, and any sleeping interest shall not be deemed relinquished or abandoned through any neglect or omission on the part of a working shareholder or hired miner employed in working it; always provided, after seven days' notice in writing to the owner or his agent, his interest be fully represented in conformity with this bye-law.

22. *Scale of fees.*—The scale of fees shall be as follows:—

Registration.	Survey (including plan).
For each share or interest	Within 5 miles of Ararat—
Each transfer of a share or interest	Quartz claim
	Machinery crushing claim
	Exceeding 5 miles from Ararat—
	Each additional mile

23. *Persons leaving the district must appoint an agent.*—Any person holding an interest in a claim shall, in case of absence from a district, appoint an agent, whose acts shall be held as those of his principal, and whose name and address must be registered with the registrar or his deputy.

24. *Holidays.*—Miners may be absent from their claims on all the following days, viz.:—Good Friday to Easter Tuesday, both inclusive; 24th December to 2nd January, both inclusive; any day on which the election of a member of the legislature or mining board of this district may take place, the day before and the day after such election; and any day proclaimed a holiday by the warden.

25. *Protection to stacked quartz.*—Any person wishing to retain possession of any quartz may do so for one year, by registering the same with the registrar or his deputy, provided the same be stacked in a proper manner upon ground not supposed to be payable for mining purposes. At the expiration of one year, if the owners still desire to retain possession, registration must be renewed every six months, failing which it shall be deemed abandoned.

26. *Tunnels and tramways.*—Any party cutting a tunnel or laying down a tramway for the greater convenience of working their claim may hold possession of the same, together with a wall of six feet on either side thereof, provided the same does not impede the works of other miners or obstruct roads in ordinary use.

27. *Sludge.*—Where machinery is employed, an embankment for the purpose of retaining the sludge shall be constructed not more than one hundred feet below the main embankment, except it can be more conveniently carried off by drainage without injuring other persons.

28. *Roads to be bridged.*—When sludge or water runs across any road in general use, a substantial bridge, not less than fourteen (14) feet in width, must be constructed and kept in repair by the owners of the claim from which such sludge or water proceeds.

29. *Site proving auriferous.*—When the site occupied by a dam, tramway, or a race, or for stacking quartz, shall prove auriferous, the warden may order it to be mined upon, and parties wishing to do so shall, before commencing work thereupon, compensate the owners for any injury to be sustained, the

amount thereof to be decided by the warden or warden and assessors.

30. *Alluvial ground may be worked.*—Any miner may work alluvial ground within the claims sanctioned by this bye-law, or make a race, tunnel, or tramway thereon, provided the same can be done without detriment to the quartz claims.

31. *Disputed claim or share.*—Any miner or miners intending to take possession of a disputed claim, or share in a claim, must mark out the same, and then obtain the authority of the warden before taking further possession thereof.

32. *Forfeiture of claims of special value.*—Claims on which labor or money has been expended to the amount of Five hundred pounds sterling by the owners shall not be liable to forfeiture, unless the owners thereof fail to comply with this bye-law after having received one week's written notice from the person desirous of taking possession of the same.

33. *Other cases of forfeiture.*—Forfeiture of claims or interests will take place under the following conditions: Failing to represent any share or interest in accordance with this bye-law; obtaining a certificate from the warden authorising suspension of work by false representation; failing for one month after they became due to pay wages due to a working shareholder for representing any interest.

34. *Penalties for other infringements.*—Other infringements of this bye-law will subject the parties so offending to the penalty specified in the Gold Fields Act.

35. *Effacing notices or removing pegs.*—Any person who shall efface, alter, remove, or destroy any notice posted on a claim, or willfully remove the pegs thereof, shall be liable to the penalties specified in clause 34.

36. *Repeal clause.*—Bye-law No. 14, 7th December, 1859, relating to quartz mining in the district of Ararat, is hereby repealed.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

CLUNES.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-nine householders of the township of Clunes, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that mining operations of an extensive and permanent character are now being carried on in the township by large companies, involving a great outlay of capital and employing a large population, and that the most efficient quartz crushing works in the colony are located there.

That the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable cost.

That there is also much land under cultivation in the immediate neighborhood.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense.

That the creation of the district into a municipality will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest the following municipal area, viz. :— Commencing at a point 120 chains south of the south-east corner of the post office reserve, by a line running west 120 chains; thence north 240 chains; thence east 240 chains; thence south 240 chains; thence west 120 chains to the commencing point; such area containing a population of more than three hundred householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore humbly beseech your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of ‘The Municipal District of Clunes,’ according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.”
