## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight-Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint that the places for the nomination of candidates to serve in the Legislative Assembly of Victoria for each of the electoral districts hereinafter mentioned shall be the places mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereunto annexed; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby appoint that the several places mentioned in the fourth column of such schedule shall be respectively polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for each of such districts; and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits of the several divisions of such districts mentioned in the third column of the said schedule shall be taken at any election for each district at the polling places mentioned in the said fourth column opposite to the names of such divisions respectively, that is to say:—

**PARTICULARS.**

*Description of the Offenders*.—The 1st man was 30 to 35 years of age, with fair complexion, small whiskers, and moustache, and wore a monkey jacket, moleskin trousers, and dark felt hat. The 2nd man was 5 feet 7 inches high, and wore a monkey jacket and wideawake hat.

## CLUNES.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-nine householders of the township of Clunes, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that mining operations of an extensive and permanent character are now being carried on in the township by large companies, involving a great outlay of capital and employing a large population, and that the most efficient quartz crushing works in the colony are located there.

That the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable cost.

That there is also much land under cultivation in the immediate neighborhood.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets in the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense.

That the creation of the district into a municipality will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest the following municipal area, viz.:—Commencing at a point 120 chains south of the south-east corner of the post office reserve, by a line running west 120 chains; thence north 240 chains; thence east 240 chains; thence south 240 chains; thence west 120 chains to the commencing point; such area containing a population of more than three hundred householders, and not exceeding nine square miles, wherein no point is distant more than six miles from any other point.

"Your petitioners therefore humbly beseech your Excellency that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Clunes,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary that for the purposes of forming, metalling, paving, and repairing the several streets, roads, ways, and footpaths within the municipality of Hotham, and for the construction and repairs of drains and sewers, or for the laying of water or gas pipes, or for the taking up and relaying or repairing the same, the street, road, way, or path, or streets, roads, ways, or paths, where any such works are being carried on, should be stopped up or closed against public traffic, if deemed necessary, during the progress of such works or any of them: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Hotham, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, pursuant to 18th Victoria No. 15, section 33, &c., it shall be lawful for the said council to order and direct the closing up or stopping of any street, road, way, or footpath, within the limits of the municipality, against public traffic, during the progress therein of any or all of the works above described, by any suitable barrier or barriers, or by notice or notices in writing, at the ends or junction of any such street, road, way, or path with any other street, road, way, or path, and to continue such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, until such time as such street, road, way, or path shall be ready and fit for public traffic. And be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that if any person or persons shall take down, break, or remove any such barrier or barriers, notice or notices as aforesaid, or proceed along any such street, road, way, or path, without the consent of the said council, or the municipal surveyor, or any other authorised officer, being first obtained thereto, with any cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle, or with any horse, bullock, or other beast of burden, or cattle, whether attached to any such cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle or not, during the progress of any such work or works as aforesaid, or until such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, shall have been removed at the instance of the said council, any

person or persons so offending shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Five pounds
