THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SOUTH BARWON
ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*; and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case, save as therein-after mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the second day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the municipal district of South Barwon was defined as therein mentioned: And whereas a petition has been received from the householders resident within the said municipal district, praying that where the present boundary line of the said district is defined as the eastern and southern banks of the River Barwon, such boundary line may be extended to the middle of the said River Barwon, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the boundaries of the said municipal district, and with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation declare that the said municipal district of South Barwon shall be and consist of the area comprised within the boundaries and limits hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the stream of the River Barwon bearing due west from the south-west angle of allotment 1, north of section 25, parish of Barrabool; thence by the centre of the said stream to a point due north of the east

boundary of the Racecourse; thence by a line south and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Racecourse to a point one chain due north of the north-east angle of allotment J, section 4, parish of Conewarre; thence by a line bearing south to the south-east angle of allotment K, section 4, in the same parish; thence by a line bearing west to the south-west angle of portion 16, parish of Duneed; thence by a line bearing north to the north-west angle of allotment 8, section 18, parish of Moorpanyal; thence by a line bearing west, being the northern boundary of section 25, parish of Barrabool; and a line bearing west to the centre of the said stream of the River Barwon, being the point of commencement.

MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, BRIGHTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the place and buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Brighton: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal Council of Brighton the following premises, situated and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The premises rented for the use of the police, having a frontage of forty feet to Bay street, and a depth of one hundred and forty-five feet.

POSTPONEMENT OF THE NEXT GENERAL SESSIONS
AT KYNETON AND ARARAT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to define and appoint by Proclamation the times at which such Courts should be holden, and such times to alter and vary as the said Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of March, 1859, the Court of General Sessions at Ararat was appointed to be holden in every year at the times therein mentioned, until otherwise ordered: And whereas it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding

the next Courts of General Sessions at Kyneton and Ararat; Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby postpone the times appointed for holding the next Courts of General Sessions in and for the Districts of Kyneton and Ararat aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions for Kyneton, at Kyneton, from the 20th day of November now next ensuing, until Thursday, the sixth day of December in the present year.

The Court of General Sessions for Ararat, at Ararat, from the 1st day of December aforesaid, until Thursday, the 20th day of the same month of December.
