HEATHCOTE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT.

PETITION FOR ENLARGEMENT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-two householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote, including the chairman and councillors thereof.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state they are all householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote.

They refer to the creation of the municipality on the 19th of August, 1859, and draw attention to the power conferred in the Municipal Act 18 Vict. No. 15 to alter or vary the boundaries of a proclaimed district.

They further state that they find it will be for the benefit of the municipality that its boundaries should be altered, and the following boundaries (which are within the limits prescribed by the Act) substituted, viz.:—

Commencing at a point on the north-west boundary of country allotment number forty-eight, in the parish of Heathcote, sold to Henry Welch; thence true north thirty-two degrees east along the said boundary of country allotment number forty-five, and crossing the McIvor Creek, to a point on the north-east side of the main road; thence by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the north-eastern side of main road through Heathcote, from Sandhurst to Kilmore, to a point on the town boundary of Heathcote; thence along said town boundary north-easterly to a point twenty-five chains from the north-east side of the said road; thence again by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the north-east side of the said main road to a point bearing true north thirty-four degrees east from the eastern angle of Heathcote suburban allotment number eighteen A; thence by a line true south thirty-four degrees west to a point twenty-five chains from the said main road; thence north-easterly by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the south-west side of the said main road to a point on the town boundary; thence by the town boundary south-easterly and north-westerly to a point twenty-five chains from the said main road; and thence finally by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the said main road to the point of commencement.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that the boundaries of the municipal district of Heathcote as originally proclaimed may be altered, and that the above boundaries may be proclaimed in their stead."

MUNICIPALITY OF EAST COLLINGWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 28.—TO COMPUTE PROBABLE AMOUNT WHICH WILL BE REQUIRED FOR THE CURRENT YEAR, AND TO IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EAST COLLINGWOOD FOR THE YEAR 1860.

(Under 18 and 19 Victoria, Nos. 15 and 16.)

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, that the municipal council of any such municipal district (aforesaid) shall annually, within three months after the election of the chairman of such council, cause an estimate to be made of the probable amount which will be required for the then current year, in addition to any tolls, rates or dues which may have been levied or authorised to be levied within the said district, to carry on the fencing, making and repairing of any roads, wharves, piers, or other public works within the said district, and any other expenses necessary in carrying into effect the provisions of this act, and shall raise the amount so estimated by an assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to its fair average annual value, whether occupied or not;

Be it therefore enacted that the probable amount which will be required for the current year, exclusive of the application to public works of any Legislative grant to the municipality, will be about Four thousand eight hundred pounds, the computed amount of annual assessment being One hundred thousand pounds, and that a rate for the current year of 1860 of One shilling in the pound on the revised assessed annual value of rateable property within the limits of the municipal district of East Collingwood be imposed and levied, and be due and payable in equal portions of all rates above Five shillings per annum respectively on the 1st day of January and July, 1860; and that all such rates, Five shillings and under, be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1860.

## MUNICIPALITY OF HAMILTON.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAMILTON.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor, dated the 1st day of November, 1859, the district of Hamilton was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make divers regulations for conducting the proceedings and business of the municipal council for the said district of Hamilton: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the said district of Hamilton that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the proceedings and business of the said council shall be conducted by the following regulations only, which shall be and be called the Standing Orders of the said council, until repealed or altered, that is to say:—

1. That the ordinary meetings of the council shall be held, until otherwise ordered, on Monday in every week, at Four o'clock p.m., and shall be open to the public (except as hereinafter excepted). Minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the council shall be drawn up and fairly entered up in a book to be provided for the purpose, and shall be signed by the chairman or other presiding councillor; the minutes to be open to all persons on the ratepayers' roll at seasonable times.

2. The council business shall commence so soon as a legal quorum is present; but in case a quorum be not present at the expiration of thirty minutes from the time of meeting, a note to that effect shall be made in the minute book, as also the names of the members present, and the business of such meeting shall lapse.

3. The first business at each meeting shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereupon except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. At all meetings the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.

5. All communications by letter intended for the council shall be made and addressed to the chairman and council, under cover to the town clerk.

6. Any member when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must arise and address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down. The member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.

7. If more than one councillor rise at the same time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

8. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

9. The presiding chairman shall rise when addressing the council.

10. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections.

11. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until four clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications for the same, and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to the election.

## MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAW No. 63.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF SEVEN THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE POUNDS EIGHTEEN SHILLINGS AND ONE PENNY, GRANTED OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR THE YEAR 1859 TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PRAHRAN.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid from Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be subject to a distinct and separate bye-law: And whereas the sum of Seven thousand nine hundred and nine pounds eighteen shillings and one penny has been appropriated to the municipal council of Prahran from the revenue for 1859 by the Legislative Assembly, subject to the conditions of the abovesaid Act: Be it therefore enacted by

the municipal council of Prahran, that the above sum shall be expended on the following works:—

## LAND RESERVED AT BALLAARAT EAST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, by an Order bearing date the 18th day of December, 1858, reserved the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate at Ballarat East, viz.:—

DESCRIPTION OF THE GROUND SET APART FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES FOR THE JEWISH COMMUNITY AT BALLAARAT EAST.—Ballaarat East, one road and nineteen perches; commencing at the north-east corner post, said post bearing south 19° 34' east 50 links from the south-east corner of block O, in the said township of Ballaarat east; bounded on the east by a road bearing south 19° 34' east 51 links; on the south by a road 1 chain wide, bearing south 38° 57' west 2 chains 60 links; on the west by a line bearing north 51° 3' west 2 chains 17 links; and on the north by a road 50 links wide, bearing north 70° 26' east 3 chains 35 links to the point of commencement.

## DOG NUISANCE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIPS OF ROKEWOOD, PITFIELD, AND CRESSY.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has extended the provisions of the Act 6 William IV. No. 4, intituled, *An Act for abating the nuisance occasioned by Dogs in the streets of certain towns and on highways in New South Wales*, to the townships of Rokewood, Pitfield, and Cressy, the respective boundaries of which are hereinafter specified, viz.:—

ROKEWOOD TOWN RESERVE.—Commencing at a point on the Corindhap Creek being the north-eastern angle of suburban allotment 88 in the parish of Corindhap; thence west 162 chains and 85 links; thence south 120 chains; thence east 160 chains; thence north to the Kurookaruc Creek; and thence northwards by that creek and the Corindhap Creek to the commencing point.

PITFIELD TOWN RESERVE.—Commencing at the north-western angle of Elder's pre-emptive right, in the parish of Mindai; thence south to the southern boundary of the said parish of Mindai; thence by the southern and part of the western boundary of the said parish to the north-western angle of suburban allotment 56 in the said parish of Mindai; thence north to a point due west of the north-eastern angle of suburban allotment 34 in the said parish of Mindai; and thence east to the commencing point.

CRESSY TOWN RESERVE.—Commencing at a point on the Woody Yalouk Creek, being the north-eastern angle of suburban allotment 1 in the parish of Cressy; thence west 75 chains and 88 links; thence south 160 chains; thence east 160 chains; thence north 160 chains; and thence west to the commencing point.
