PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

Kew.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and seventy-two householders resident at Kew, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are all householders within the meaning of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, are more than one hundred and fifty in number, and are all resident within an area of nine square miles, containing a population of more than three hundred householders.

That they are desirous that the village of Kew and its neighborhood should be constituted a municipal district, and governed by a local council.

They propose that the boundaries of the district shall be the following, viz.:—“Commencing in the centre of the Government road bounding portions 71, 72, 73, 74, and 75 of the parish Boroondara; on the south at the junction of that road with the River Yarra Yarra, and bearing east from the said commencing point along the centre of the said road to the end thereof, and thence further east along the centre of a private road to the centre of the Government road which bounds Elgar's Special Survey on the west; thence bearing north along the centre of the last-mentioned road to portion 52 of the said parish; thence bearing east fifty links to the south-eastern corner of the said portion 52; thence bearing north along the said eastern boundary line of the said portion to the River Yarra Yarra; and thence by the River Yarra Yarra to the commencing point.”

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency that the before-mentioned boundaries may be constituted the limits of the municipal district; that your Excellency will be pleased to constitute the same under the name of ‘The municipal District of Kew,’ and also be pleased to issue the necessary proclamation for declaring it a municipality and defining the limits accordingly.”

That more than one hundred and fifty householders have affixed their signatures to the petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

“Your petitioners therefore most humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased forthwith to proclaim that Chewton aforesaid be declared a municipality.”

**RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE
OF MEMBERS OF THE VICTORIA VOLUNTEER
NAVAL BRIGADE.**

THE following Rules and Regulations, agreed to by the members of the Volunteer Naval Brigade, Hobson's Bay, having been approved by the Governor in Council, are now published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The brigade shall be open to all persons, subject to the approval of the select committee to be appointed as hereinafter provided. (This rule applicable to Williamstown Company only.)
- 1 A. Candidates for admission to the corps shall make a written or personal application to the committee, stating name in full, age, place of abode and occupation; the decision of the committee to be made known to the candidate within one week after his application has been made. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
2. Each candidate for admission shall be proposed and seconded, in writing, by members of the brigade, and his name shall be read at the next weekly parade of the corps, to give an opportunity to any member to object to his entrance. (This rule applicable to Williamstown Company only.)
- 2 A. No candidate is eligible for admission to the corps who is under the height of five feet six inches, excepting under special circumstances, to be decided by an unanimous vote of the entire committee. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
3. Each member shall pay to the treasurer the annual subscription of Six shillings by monthly instalments. (This rule applicable to Williamstown Company only.)
- 3 A. All requisite expenses of the corps not provided for by the Government shall be defrayed by voluntary subscription. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
4. On all occasions of promotion to the rank of non-commissioned officer, three candidates shall be chosen by ballot at some general meeting of the brigade; each member present to name three, or his vote shall be null and void. An election from these three shall be made by the commanding officer. (This rule applicable to Williamstown Company only.)
- 4 A. The non-commissioned officers of the company or corps shall be chosen by ballot at a general meeting of the company. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
5. No member shall be qualified for promotion until he shall have been dismissed from instruction drill.
6. Any member changing his permanent address must within thirty days give notice of the same in writing to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence.
7. Any member of the brigade intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days must give a satisfactory reason for so absencing himself to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Five shillings.
8. A member being absent from his district of enrolment more than three months at any one time, unless good and sufficient cause for the same shall be shown, shall be considered to have retired from the brigade.
9. Every member on joining shall attend instruction drill at least twice a week, and shall not be supplied with uniform until he shall have attended at least sixteen drills, or until he shall have been dismissed from drill, whichever may first happen.
10. Brigade drill shall take place once every week, at such time and place as may be appointed by the commanding officer, after consulting the wishes of the majority of the members, and must be attended by all members at least once a month, unless satisfactory reason be given to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence for each default.
11. The commanding officer's parade shall take place on the first Saturday in each month, or on such other day as he may appoint, and shall be attended by every member (unless he forward a sufficient written excuse to the commanding officer), under a penalty of Five shillings for officers, Two shillings and sixpence for non-commissioned officers, and One shilling for privates.
12. Members accepting rank as commissioned or non-commissioned officers shall attend drill twice every week at least, until they are able to impart instruction to recruits.
13. Every member will be liable to be sent to instruction drill by the commanding officer for want of knowledge occasioned by absence or other cause; and for inattention, talking, or any unsteadiness at parade or drill, he will be liable to a reprimand by the commanding officer.
14. At every parade any member coming late, and assigning a reason for so doing which is deemed sufficient by the commanding officer, shall be considered as having been present at that parade.
15. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any respect unserviceable from neglect, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence, provided notice has already been given to all the members to appear in uniform.
16. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any wilful or careless damage done thereto shall be made good by him.
17. Any member who may desire to leave his arms and accoutrements in charge of the gunner's mate, may be permitted to do so on payment of One shilling per month to defray the expense of keeping them clean and in good order.
18. A general meeting of the company shall be held in the first weeks of January and July respectively, of which one week's notice is to be given in the drill room and local papers. (This rule applicable to the Williamstown Company only.)
- 18 A. A general meeting of the company shall be held in the first weeks of October and April respectively, of which one week's notice is to be given in the drill room and local papers. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
19. The officer commanding the brigade may at any time convene a special general meeting.
20. On a requisition being signed by not less than ten members the commanding officer must call a special general meeting. (This rule applicable to the Williamstown Company only.)
- 20 A. On a requisition being signed by not less than thirty members the commanding officer must call a special general meeting. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
21. Not less than seven days' notice shall be given of every special general meeting, and no business shall be transacted unless at least one-third of the brigade are present.
22. At every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman. No person shall be permitted to speak to any questions more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover of a resolution, who will be entitled to reply. All motions shall be delivered to the chairman in writing, and shall be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two or more members. No protest shall be received, and no meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved without a motion for that purpose.
23. At every half-yearly meeting a select committee, consisting of eight members, of whom one shall be a commissioned officer, and five shall form a quorum, shall be chosen by ballot, for the purpose of the first section of these rules, to audit and settle the accounts of the company, and generally to take into consideration any matters connected with the company that may be referred to them by the commanding officer. Such committee shall include the honorary secretary and honorary treasurer as members *ex officio*. (This rule applicable to the Williamstown Company only.)
- 23 A. At every half-yearly meeting a select committee, consisting of nine members, of whom one shall be a commissioned officer, five to form a quorum, shall be chosen by ballot, for the purposes of the first section of these rules, to audit and settle the accounts of the company, and generally to take into consideration any matters connected with the company that may be referred to them by the commanding officer, the secretary and treasurer to be elected by the committee from the members of the same. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
24. Members wishing to resign by reason of their period of enrolment having expired, or by reason of bodily infirmity, must give at least fourteen days' notice in writing to the commanding officer.
25. No resignation will be accepted until the member resigning shall have settled all claims against him on account of the company, and shall have forwarded to the orderly room, to the officer in charge, his arms, accoutrements, and all other property of the company that may be in his possession.
26. Any member permitted to resign within twelve months after having received new uniform, must pay for the same according to the following scale:—
Retiring under 7 months, full price of uniform.
At the end of 7 months, five-sixths price of uniform.
At the end of 8 months, four-sixths price of uniform.
At the end of 9 months, three-sixths price of uniform.
At the end of 10 months, two-sixths price of uniform.
At the end of 11 months, one-sixth price of uniform.
Members unavoidably leaving the district are exempted from this rule.
27. Any member expelled the company within twelve months from the receipt of new uniform, will be required to defray the full contract price of the same. (This rule applicable to the Williamstown Company only.)
- 27 A. Any member of the company being expelled from the corps for misconduct, will be compelled to return his uniform. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
28. Penalties fixed by rule may be inflicted or remitted by the commanding officer at his discretion.
29. A book shall be kept called the "Fine Book," in which all fines shall be entered and signed by the commanding officer. A separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the treasurer. This book shall be kept in the orderly room, and shall be accessible to every member of the company when required.
30. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the treasurer within thirty days of its notification to him.
31. A list of all claims against members of the company shall be made weekly, and kept in view in the orderly room.
32. On the first week of each month a written notice shall be sent to each defaulter of every claim against him which may be more than thirty days overdue, and if he shall not pay all such claims in full within thirty days after the service of such notice, he shall be liable to expulsion from the brigade; notice of such expulsion being published in the *Government Gazette* and such other public papers as to the commanding officer may seem fit.
33. The treasurer is to receive all moneys on account of the company, and is to deposit the same in one of the local banks; the account to be operated upon by the joint signatures of the treasurer and secretary. The treasurer is not to have more than Five pounds in hand at one time, and vouchers for all disbursements are to be submitted to the first committee meeting following such disbursements. (This rule applicable to the Williamstown Company only.)
- 33 A. The treasurer is to receive all moneys on account of the company, and vouchers for all disbursements are to be submitted to the first committee meeting after such disbursements have been made. (This rule applicable to Sandridge Company only.)
34. Members of the brigade are liable to be placed under arrest under the following circumstances:—
1st. By order of the officer commanding pending the investigation of any charge.

2nd. By the senior officer present for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without any remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress.

No person placed under arrest may wear his uniform until released. Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty not exceeding One pound.

35. No officer shall use any insulting or irritating language to any member while on parade or drill.

COURTS MARTIAL.

36. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.

37. A court martial shall have the power to fine to the extent of Five pounds, censure, or expel.

38. Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial, to be granted at the discretion of the commanding officer.

39. All courts martial shall consist of seven members of the age of twenty-one and upwards (including the president), of whom one at least shall be a commissioned officer. The president shall be appointed by the commanding officer, and the other members shall be taken in rotation from a roster.

40. A list of the members of the court martial shall be given to the person accused, who may object to any of the members, such objections to be limited to ten in number.

41. The forms to be observed on court martial shall be as nearly

as possible in accordance with those observed in Her Majesty's Navy.

42. The decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

43. Bye-laws, not inconsistent with these regulations, nor with the provisions of the Legislative Council 18 Victoria No. 7, and 19 Victoria No. 8, may be made by the select committee of each company, and if approved of by the commanding officer, shall be by him submitted for confirmation or rejection at the next general meeting of such company; and every such bye-law, if confirmed at such general meeting, shall be thenceforth binding on all members of such company, and non-compliance with any such bye-law will render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten shillings and sixpence.

44. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any rule or regulation of the brigade, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen days' notice of the same in writing to the commanding officer, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition, to be hung up in the orderly room.

45. It shall not be competent to recommend His Excellency the Governor any alteration, rescission, or addition to the existing rules of either company, unless such shall have been agreed to at a general meeting by an absolute majority of the company.

The rate of mortality in Melbourne and suburbs during October showed a large increase as compared with that of the previous month, 362 deaths, or a daily average of 11.68, having taken place in October, against 239 deaths, or 8.63 daily, in September. This rate of mortality contrasts still more unfavorably with that of October, 1889, the number which died during that month having been only 225, or an average of but 7.3 deaths daily.

The mean temperature during the month of October was 56.7°, against 53.8° for the previous month, and against 58.7° for the same month last year. The highest temperature (76.2°) was at noon on the 6th, and the lowest (37.8°) at 4 a.m. on the 17th, the range for the month thus being 38.4°. The greatest range of temperature on any one day (32.6°) was on the 4th, from a maximum of 71.8° to a minimum of 39.2°, the least (3.8°) on the 20th, from a maximum of 55.0° to a minimum of 51.2°, and the mean daily range was 16.9°. The mercury in the barometer reached its highest point (30.271 in.) at 8 p.m. on the 31st, and its lowest (29.441 in.) at 1 p.m. on the 8th, the mean pressure for the month being 29.9 in., and the range .830 in.

For the first four weeks in October the mean temperature, number of deaths, and daily average of mortality were as follow:—

Of the 362 deaths which were returned as having occurred during the month, 203, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 159, or 44 per cent., of females. 223 deaths, or the large proportion of nearly 62 per cent. of the entire number, were of children under 5 years of age, against 139 deaths, or only about 38 per cent. of the total, above that age. During September, deaths of children under 5 years of age numbered but 53 per cent. of the total, and during each of the three months previous, the deaths of persons above 5 years of age were more numerous than those of children under that age.

On the 23rd of October 21 deaths occurred, being the largest number returned as having taken place on any one day since the 21st and 22nd of last January, on which days (remarkable as being the hottest which had been experienced in the colony for some years) 30 and 26 deaths occurred respectively. 20 persons also died on the 23th of October, 17 on the 12th, 16 on the 1st and 21st, 15 on the 4th and 19th, and 14 on the 9th and 27th.

The number of deaths occurring in the Melbourne Hospital during the month was 27; in the Benevolent Asylum, 3; in the Lying-in Hospital, 2; in the Immigrants' Home, 7; in the Spencer street Barracks, 5; in the Immigration Hospital, 1; in the King street Police Barracks, 1; in the Western Gaol, 1; and in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3; making a total of 50, or nearly 14 per cent. of the total deaths; thus, during the past month, about one person out of every 7 dying in Melbourne and suburbs, died in one of the public institutions.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of last census, the number of deaths of persons under and over five years of age, and the daily average of deaths at all ages during the month of October, 1860, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

Of the 223 deaths of children under five years of age returned during the month, 126, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 97, or 44 per cent., of females. 67 were less than a year old, 61 between one year and two, 46 between two years and three, 21 between three years and four, and 28 between four years and five.

The 139 persons recorded as having died at ages above five years, consisted of 77, or about 55 per cent. of males, and 62, or nearly 45 per cent., of females. Of the total number of both sexes, 47 were between five years and ten, 4 between ten and fifteen, 13 between fifteen and twenty, 11 between twenty and twenty-five, 13 between twenty-five and thirty, 14 between thirty and thirty-five, 3 between thirty-five and forty, 12 between forty and forty-five, 7 between forty-five and fifty, 8 between fifty and fifty-five, 4 between fifty-five and sixty, 1 between sixty and sixty-five, 2 between sixty-five and seventy, and 1 between eighty and ninety.

Whilst during the month of September deaths from zymotic diseases amounted to 39 per cent., or less than two-fifths of the total deaths of the month, the mortality from that class increased in October to 49 per cent., or nearly one-half of the entire deaths. The increase in measles was from 25 fatal cases in September to 77 in October; and in scarlatina from 42 to 55 fatal cases. In regard to deaths from whooping-cough, diphtheria, diarrhoea, and dysentery, each showed a slight augmentation in October, whilst those from croup and typhus showed a slight diminution.

It is worthy of remark that only 1 fatal case of scarlatina occurred to a child of less than a year old, and only 2 fatal cases to persons above the age of ten years; also that of measles, 6 deaths occurred to children under one year, and but 2, to persons over ten years of age.

With reference to deaths from sporadic diseases, those from diseases of uncertain seat increased from 28 in September to 41 in October, and those from diseases of the nervous system from 33 to 40. Deaths from other classes of sporadic diseases did not vary much in their numbers during each of the two months.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats and bran also to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will, however, in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly, in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Government Stores, Melbourne, or the Treasury Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
