POLLING PLACES FOR THE WEST BOURKE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint that the places mentioned in the third column of the schedule hereunto annexed shall be the polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election of a member to serve in the Legislative Assembly of Victoria for the Electoral District of West Bourke; and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits of the Divisions of such District mentioned or referred to in the second and fourth columns of the same schedule shall be taken at any election for such District at the polling place or polling places in the third column of the same schedule set opposite to the respective names of such Divisions, that is to say:—
