REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.
SUPPLEMENTARY TO REGULATION No. 5.
(Amended Audit Act, 22 Victoria No. 86, section ii.)

IN cases where a collector of imposts or an officer in the public service, whose duty it is to receive money on account of the Consolidated Revenue, shall not have made any collections within the period during which only he is at liberty to retain such collections in his own custody, he shall nevertheless forward, at the prescribed time, a statement (Form A) to the receiver to whom his collections are payable, such statement to be in such case inscribed with the word "nil."

**LAND PROPOSED TO BE PERMANENTLY
RESERVED.**

IN compliance with the terms of the 4th section of the Act of Parliament 24 Victoria No. 117, it is hereby notified that it is intended permanently to reserve from sale the land hereinafter described for the purpose of extending the area of the reservoir for water in connection with the municipal district of Ararat, subject to the conditions that the municipal council of Ararat shall not interfere with the water-shed above the reservoir, and that compensation be made by the said municipal council to parties in legal occupation of the land required for the proposed reservoir at the date of this notification.

It is also hereby notified that the Governor in Council has, in the meantime, temporarily reserved such land from sale under the power in that behalf contained in the 3rd section of the said Act, and has also exempted the said land from mining operations within the meaning of the 4th section of the Gold Fields Act 21 Victoria No. 32.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND ABOVE REFERRED TO.—County of Ripon, parish of Ararat, Eleven acres one rood sixteen perches: Commencing at a point on the west side of Vincent street, bearing south 29 degrees 45 minutes west two chains one and a half links from the north-west angle of allotment 4 section 3, township of Ararat; bounded on the south by a line bearing west thirteen chains forty links; on the west by a line bearing north 8 chains 47 links; on the north by a line bearing east thirteen chains forty links; and on the east by a line being a prolongation of the west side of Vincent street bearing south eight chains forty-seven links to the point of commencement.

GEELONG VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

THE following Rules and Regulations, agreed to by the members of the Geelong Volunteer Rifle Corps, having been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, are now published for general information, the regulations hitherto in force in that corps being repealed.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF MEMBERS OF THE GEELONG RIFLE REGIMENT.

Admission.

1. The regiment shall be open to all British subjects and naturalized persons between the ages of 18 and 50.
2. The name, residence, and occupation of every member joining the regiment shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose.
3. All members changing their address must, within seven days, give notice of the same in writing to the adjutant.
4. Any member intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days, shall give notice of such intention in writing to, and deposit his arms and accoutrements with, the adjutant.

Recruits.

5. Recruits shall attend instruction drill at least twice a week, and shall not be supplied with uniform until dismissed from drill.

Uniforms, Arms, &c.

6. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.
7. Any member expelled the regiment within twelve months from the receipt of uniform shall pay the full contract price of the same.

Parades and Drills.

8. Instruction drill for recruits and others shall be held twice a week at least, in the evening, at such hour as the commanding officer shall appoint.
9. Two commanding officer's parades shall be held in each month, at which every member shall attend. These parades shall be held on the first and third Wednesdays in each month, or on such other day and at such time as the commanding officer shall appoint.
10. Any officer or other member who shall be absent from parades three times consecutively shall be considered to have resigned or be struck off the roll respectively, and shall be required to return his arms and accoutrements; and should he not have satisfied or satisfy the claims against him, his name may be published as provided in rule 18.
11. Members in uniform shall salute officers in uniform in accordance with the practice of the regular army.

Officers and Non-commissioned Officers.

12. Officers and non-commissioned officers shall be elected as provided by the Volunteer Amendment Act, 24 Victoria No. 113.
13. Sergeants shall attend and take charge of the instruction drills in rotation, attended by one corporal.

Fines.

14. The following fines shall be inflicted on members for the offences specified:—

15. All fines shall form part of the general fund of the regiment.
16. A book shall be kept called the fine book, in which all fines shall be entered and signed by the commanding officer. A separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the receiving officer. This book shall be kept in the adjutant's office, and shall be accessible to every member of the regiment.
17. The fines shall be collected by the adjutant, and shall be accounted for monthly to the treasurer.
18. A list of all fines fourteen days and upwards overdue shall be made out by the adjutant on the Tuesdays preceding the general parades, and shall be exhibited in some conspicuous part of the orderly room, with a notice appended calling attention to this rule. Any overdue fine remaining unpaid for fourteen days after the affixing of such notice as aforesaid, may be recovered according to law, or the commanding officer may, in his discretion, expel the defaulter from the regiment, and publish such expulsion in the *Government Gazette* and such other newspaper as he may think fit.

Exemption.

19. Any member not attending parade, and having sufficient excuse, shall signify the same in writing to the adjutant before the parade, the sufficiency of such excuse to be for the consideration of the commanding officer.

Arrest and Courts Martial.

20. Members of the regiment are liable to be placed in arrest under the following circumstances:—
 - 1st. By order of the officer commanding the regiment, pending the investigation of any charge.
 - 2nd. By the senior officer present, for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without any remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress.
21. No person placed under arrest may wear his uniform or any part of it until released. Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
22. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.
23. A court martial shall have the power to censure, fine to the extent of Five pounds, or expel.
24. Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.
25. All courts martial shall consist of seven members of the age of twenty-one years and upwards (including the president), of whom at least one shall be a commissioned officer; the president shall be appointed by the commanding officer, and the other members shall be taken in rotation from a roster.
26. A list of the members of the court shall be given to the member accused, who shall be privileged to challenge members of such court to the number of four (4), without assigning any reason for so doing; and further, that members so challenged shall immediately and without remark vacate their seats.
27. The forms to be observed on courts martial shall be as nearly as possible in accordance with those observed in Her Majesty's army.
28. The decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

Civil Staff.

29. The civil staff of the regiment shall consist of the commanding officer for the time being, who shall be *ex officio* president, a treasurer, and a board of management consisting of twelve members, who shall appoint one of their number as secretary. The board shall audit the accounts of the regiment, and manage and dispose of the regimental fund, and generally take into consideration all matters affecting the well-being of the regiment. Five members of such board shall form a quorum.
30. A general meeting shall be held yearly in January, of which one week's notice shall be given by advertisement. The treasurer and board of management shall be elected annually at this meeting by ballot.
31. Any vacancy occurring in the board of management during the year shall be filled up by the remaining members of the board.
32. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special general meeting.
33. On the requisition of not less than five (5) members of the board of management, or of not less than twelve (12) members of the regiment, the commanding officer shall call a special general meeting for the purposes mentioned in the requisition.
34. At every general meeting the president, if present, shall be chairman; if absent, the senior officer present. No person shall be permitted to speak to any motion more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover of the resolution or amendment, who shall be entitled to a reply. All motions shall be delivered to the chairman in writing, and shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division be demanded.
35. Bye-laws not inconsistent with these regulations may be made by the board of management, and, if approved by the president, shall be by him submitted to a general meeting, whether special or otherwise, and, if then confirmed, shall be thenceforth binding on the regiment.
36. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any rule or regulation of the regiment, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen days' notice of the same in writing to the president, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition to be hung up in the orderly room; and such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition shall then be submitted to a general or special general meeting, but it shall not be recommended to His Excellency unless carried by a majority of two-thirds of the meeting.

38. No member whose subscription shall be in arrear shall be permitted to speak or vote at any meeting of the regiment until such arrears shall have been paid.

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 22.—FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROTECTING RESERVOIRS, THE PROPERTY OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, AND THE WATER-COURSES LEADING THERE TO, WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is *inter alia* enacted, that every such municipal council shall adopt such means as may to them seem desirable for securing the necessary supply of water for domestic, sanitary, and irrigation purposes, and shall and may make such bye-laws for carrying out these objects as shall to such council seem fit: And whereas for the purpose of securing a permanent and convenient supply of water during the summer, the want of which has been hitherto severely felt, for domestic, sanitary, and other purposes, it has been deemed expedient and necessary, by the municipal council of Ararat, to construct a reservoir on the north side of the township of Ararat, and another on the south side of the township, both extending west from Vincent street; and in order to secure an abundant and permanent supply of water to the reservoirs abovementioned, it is necessary that no obstruction, impediment, or hindrance, shall be placed in the water courses or channels leading to such reservoirs or either of them: Be it therefore enacted by the council aforesaid, that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to put or place any obstruction, impediment or hindrance in the water-courses or any of them within the boundary of the municipality of Ararat leading to such reservoirs or either of them, nor by cutting a drain, race or ditch, nor by making an embankment to divert or turn into any other channel the water naturally flowing towards or into such reservoirs or either of them as aforesaid; and any person who shall be found putting or placing any obstruction, impediment, or hindrance, in the water course or courses leading to such reservoir or reservoirs as aforesaid, or be found cutting any drain, race or ditch, or making any embankment so as to turn away the water naturally flowing into or towards either of the reservoirs aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace for the said municipal district, forfeit and pay for every such offence, a sum or penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) sterling.

And be it further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the council aforesaid to direct and require the removal of all impediments, obstructions, or hindrances, whereby the water flowing in such courses or channels as aforesaid, or any of them, has been stopped or impeded, and the filling up of all drains, ditches, or races whereby the water has been diverted from its natural course in flowing into or towards such reservoirs as aforesaid, or either of them; and it shall be further lawful for the said council, by their officer, to give notice in writing to the owner or owners, occupier or occupiers of such obstruction, impediment, or hindrance, or of such drain, ditch, or race, to remove or fill up the same, as the case may be. And the owner or owners, occupier or occupiers of such obstruction, impediment, or hindrance, or of such drain, ditch, or race, who shall refuse or neglect to remove such obstruction, impediment, or hindrance, or to fill up such drain, ditch, or race, within three (3) days from the date of receiving such notice, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such neglect or refusal any sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

And be it further enacted by the council aforesaid, that any person found depositing any filth, rubbish, manure, or other offensive refuse in either of the reservoirs aforesaid, or upon any unenclosed ground within twenty yards of either of the reservoirs aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

Nothing contained in this bye-law shall be taken to apply to any dam or reservoir formed for puddling or other purposes previous to this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, and which was being used for such purposes up to that date.

MUNICIPALITY OF PRAHRAN.

BYE-LAW No. 67.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE REGULATION OF PUBLIC VEHICLES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PRAHRAN.

THE municipal council of Prahran, by virtue of the power to them in this behalf given in the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby enact as follows:—

1. Such places as the said council shall from time to time appoint shall be stands for public vehicles plying for hire within the municipal district aforesaid, provided that the council may from time to time, as they shall see fit, alter the situations and number of the said stands so appointed, and of the vehicles on each stand. Six clear days' notice of such appointment and of such alteration shall be given by such council by advertisement in one newspaper published within the city of Melbourne, and the local newspaper.

2. The owner or driver of any public vehicle shall not permit any part of such vehicle, or of any horse drawing the same, to stand within ten feet of the corner of any street, whether for hire or otherwise.

3. At every fourth vehicle on each stand there shall be left a space of at least six feet for passengers to pass through.

4. Public vehicles shall take their stations on the stand in the order of their arrival, and when any vehicles shall be called or driven off any stand, the vehicle immediately behind shall draw up to the vacated place, and any other vehicle behind in the like order.

5. No driver of any public vehicle shall suffer the same to stand for hire across any street or alongside of any other public vehicle, nor obstruct the driver of any other vehicle in taking up or setting down any person, nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavor to prevent the driver of any other vehicle from taking a fare.

6. No owner or driver of any public vehicle shall permit his vehicle, either with or without horses, to stand in any street, lane, thoroughfare, or public place longer than may be necessary for loading or unloading, or taking up or putting down any passenger, except while standing for hire in some lawful place appointed for that purpose, as provided by this bye-law, or waiting for the hirer.

7. No driver or any conductor of any public vehicle shall carry or knowingly permit to be carried in any such vehicle within the said municipality, except to some police office or watch-house, any person so noisily or violently conducting himself, or otherwise so misbehaving as to occasion any public annoyance or disturb the public peace.

8. The driver of every public vehicle shall be constantly attendant on the same when plying on any public stand or otherwise engaged for hire within the said municipality.

9. Every public vehicle plying or engaged after sunset and before sunrise within the said municipality shall be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver shall keep the same lighted whilst so plying or engaged for hire.

10. The driver of every public vehicle shall place a muzzle upon the head of any vicious horse used or employed by him, and keep the same thereon whilst on any stand within the said district.

11. Every driver of a public vehicle who shall feed any horse whilst on any stand within the said district shall use a nosebag to contain the forage, and shall not remove such horse's blinkers during the time of feeding.

12. The words "public vehicle" and "vehicle," when used in this bye-law, shall be understood to mean all coaches, omnibusses, cars, cabs, and other carriages plying for hire, or carrying passengers for hire, within the municipal district of Prahran, whether at separate and distinct fares for each passenger, or at one fare for the whole vehicle, or otherwise, and not impelled otherwise than by animal power; the word "owner" shall signify every person possessed of a beneficial interest in any public vehicle; and the word "conductor" shall include every person other than the driver who shall attend upon any public vehicle or upon the passengers therein; and whenever in this bye-law, with reference to any person, animal, matter, or thing, any word or words shall be understood to include several persons, animals, matters, or things, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant thereto.

13. For any offence against any of the provisions of this bye-law the offender shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
