CONVERSION OF SPECIAL LANDS INTO COUNTRY
LANDS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things provided, that the Governor in Council shall be authorized to declare any land not within half a mile of land alienated before the commencement of the said Act to be Country Land: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that all allotments of land which are now surveyed or are hereafter to be surveyed, and whose minimum distance from land alienated prior to the commencement of the above-recited Act is half a mile, shall be COUNTRY LANDS within the meaning of the said Act.

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF KEW.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders at Kew, in the county of Bourke, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF KEW.—Commencing at a point on the east bank of the Yarra Yarra River, being the centre of a road forming the northern boundaries of portions 28, 29, 35 and 69, in the parish of Boroondara, bearing east; thence by a prolongation of the last line, being part of the northern boundary of the Hawthorn municipality, bearing east to the centre of a road forming the east boundaries of portions 70, 71, 82, 83, 84 and 91, parish of Boroondara, bearing north; thence by a prolongation of the last line north to the south boundary of portion 52, same parish; thence by the south boundary of portion 52, bearing east fifty links to the east boundary of said portion 52; thence by the last-named boundary bearing north fifty-four chains fifty links to the Yarra Yarra River; thence by the south and east bank of the said river southerly and easterly to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Kew."

THE FRANKLIN AND YANDOIT ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the seventh day of May, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Franklin and Yandoit Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Franklin and Yandoit Road District shall be and comprise so much of the county of Talbot as is included within the area hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point one chain east of the south-east angle of portion 6 of section 8 of the parish of Wombat; and thence by a line bearing north along the west boundaries of portions 4 and 3 of section 7 of the said parish; thence onwards to the south side of section 19 in the parish of Holcombe; thence westerly along the south boundary of the said section 19 to the centre line of Middleton's Creek; thence northerly along the centre line of Middleton's Creek to a point north of the northern extremity of section 2 of the said parish of Holcombe (the boundary line thus far being continuous with the west boundary of the Glenlyon road district); thence further on the east by a line bearing north to a point in the south boundary of the parish of Fryers; thence west by the said boundary to south-west angle of the said parish of Fryers; thence north to the north-east angle of the parish of Yandoit; thence on the north and west by the north and west boundaries of the parish of Yandoit and the west boundary of the parish of Franklin continued south to the centre line of the Glengower or McLachlan's Creek; thence by the centre line of the said creek southwards (the boundary line along the centre of the creek being continuous with the parish of Bullarook and the road district of Creswick's eastern boundaries) to a point due west of the north-west angle of section 2 of the parish of Wombat; and thence on the south by a line bearing east to and along the

north boundaries of sections 2 and 3 of the said parish of Wombat to the commencing point.
