Treasury, Melbourne, 18th December, 1860. REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS. SUPPLEMENTARY TO REGULATION No. 5.

(Amended Audit Act, 22 Victoria No. 89, section ii.)

IN cases where a collector of imposts or an officer in the public service, whose duty it is to receive money on account of the Consolidated Revenue, shall not have made any collections within the period during which only he is at liberty to retain such collections in his own custody, he shall nevertheless forward, at the prescribed time, a statement (Form A) to the receiver to whom his collections are payable, such statement to be in such case inscribed with the word "nil."

LAND SET APART AT MELBOURNE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, did, by an Order made on the 22nd day of October, 1860, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate at Melbourne, as a reserve for a Museum and for gardens in connection with the Public Library, on the understanding that the temporary buildings at present on the ground are not to be interfered with unless by consent of the Government.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND SET APART.—Two acres three roods sixteen perches, county of Bourke, parish of North Melbourne, part of section 27, city of Melbourne: Commencing at the intersection of the south-east side of La Trobe street with the south-west side of Russell street; bounded on the north-east by Russell street, bearing south 28 degrees east four chains seventy-five links; on the south-east by the north-west side of Little Lonsdale street, bearing south 62 degrees west six chains; on the south-west by the Public Library reserve, bearing north 28 degrees west four chains seventy-five links; and on the north-west by La Trobe street, bearing north 62 degrees east four chains seventy-five links to the point of commencement.

IN compliance with the terms of the 4th section of the Act of Parliament 24 Victoria No. 117, it is hereby notified that it is intended permanently to reserve from sale the land hereinafter described for the purpose of extending the area of the reservoir for water in connection with the municipal district of Ararat, subject to the conditions that the municipal council of Ararat shall not interfere with the water-shed above the reservoir, and that compensation be made by the said municipal council to parties in legal occupation of the land required for the proposed reservoir at the date of this notification.

It is also hereby notified that the Governor in Council has, in the meantime, temporarily reserved such land from sale under the power in that behalf contained in the 3rd section of the said Act, and has also exempted the said land from mining operations within the meaning of the 4th section of the Gold Fields Act 21 Victoria No. 32.

MUNICIPALITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW No. 7.—FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE FOOTWAYS, WATER-COURSES, ETC., OF PUBLIC STREETS AND THOROUGHFARES, ETC., OF THE FOOTSCRAY MUNICIPALITY, UNDER 18 VICTORIA NOS. 14 AND 15.

EVERY person requiring to take horses, bullocks, carts, drays, &c., across the footways of the public streets of the municipality, to his or her premises abutting thereon, shall make approaches thereto in conformity with the instructions of the municipal council, through their surveyor, or other authorised officer.

2. No person shall be permitted to make such approaches, or form drains, or other communication with the water-courses of the public streets, or thoroughfares, without first obtaining the

approval of the municipal council, through their surveyor, or other authorised officer.

3. No person shall throw earth, sand, gravel, or rubbish, into, or in any other manner obstruct, the water-courses or drains of the streets or other places in the municipality.

4. Any person who shall ride or drive any horse, beast, cart, or other wheeled vehicle, across any of the public footpaths or water-channels, or cause such to be crossed with or by any horse, beast, cart, dray, or other wheeled vehicle, unless over and by means of a crossing-place formed in one or other of the modes hereinbefore stated, and any person refusing or neglecting to comply with this or any other of the provisions of this bye-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 8.—FOR THE FORMATION OF A GARDEN AS A PLACE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, AND FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND NECESSARY IMPROVEMENTS IN THE GARDEN RESERVE SITUATED IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF FOOTSCRAY.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every such municipal council may also make such bye-laws as may be necessary for the establishment of public libraries, museums, botanical gardens, or other public places of recreation, and the maintenance and management thereof: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Footscray, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, it shall be lawful for any person or persons receiving authority from the municipal council of Footscray, to remove soil for filling low land, excavating stone from the high ground, clearing away surface stones, and laying out the grounds generally by planting trees, forming ponds, fountains, and all such other improvements and ornamental works as the council aforesaid may from time to time see fit to direct for the proper formation of the gardens and the maintenance and management thereof as a place of public recreation.

MUNICIPALITY OF HEATHCOTE.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR PREVENTING DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATER-COURSES, AND FOR THE REGULATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS, AND FOR THE ERECTION OF SHADES AND AWNINGS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF HEATHCOTE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act shall have the care and management of the public roads and streets, and thoroughfares, and shall make such bye-laws for carrying out their object as shall to such council seem fit: And whereas by a proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated 19th day of August, 1859, the district of Heathcote was proclaimed a municipal district under the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Heathcote, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor:—

1. Any person who shall wilfully or carelessly cause any damage whatsoever to any of the footpaths or water-courses of the municipal district of Heathcote shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

2. It shall be lawful for the said council to give permission to the owner or occupier of any gateway, yard, or lane, to which access by horses, beasts, carriages, or other vehicles can be obtained only by riding, driving, or wheeling upon or across any of the said public footpaths or water-courses, to make and maintain such crossing or crossings over the said public footpaths or water-courses, or any of them, as may be necessary for approach and access to any such private gateway, yard, or lane; such crossing to be made and maintained at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of the said municipal council, or of such officer or officers as they may appoint for that purpose.

3. And the said council is hereby empowered to give notice in writing to any owner or occupier to repair any crossing to their respective premises; and in case such party shall neglect after seven days' notice to execute the necessary repairs, then the council shall have power to repair the same, and recover the amount from the owner or occupier, before two or more justices of the peace.

4. The said council shall also have power, when forming any footpaths, to require the owner or occupier of any unfenced allotment to fence the same fronting the footpath, to prevent trespass; and in case such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect after fourteen days' notice, or be absent from the district, then it shall be lawful for the said council to fence the same, and to recover the amount from the present or any future owner or occupier.

5. The council may, on seven days' notice, require the owner or occupier of any building or premises to make and maintain such drains leading through or under the adjoining footpaths as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building or

premises into the public water-tables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence and to the satisfaction of the council, or such officer as they may appoint for that purpose; and on any person refusing or neglecting to construct or maintain such drain, it shall be lawful for the council to perform the required work and recover the cost in a summary manner before two or more justices of the peace.

6. Any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be erected any shade or awning over or across any public footpath within the municipality without having obtained in writing the consent of the said council to such erection, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

7. And be it further ordered and directed by the said council, that every such shade or awning, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been given, shall be erected with the upright posts or pillars thereof immediately at the outside of the kerbstone or boundary of the footpath in front of any shop, dwelling-house, or other premises to which such shade or awning shall be attached, and that no plate, rafter, or tie, of any such shade or awning, shall be of less height above the surface of such path than seven feet in the clear to the underside of such plate, rafter, or tie.

BYE-LAW No. 22.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF THE ANNUAL VALUE OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 10TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1861.

WHEREAS the council of the municipal district of Maldon, in pursuance of clause 30 of the Municipal Act of Victoria No. 15, has caused a valuation of all property in houses and land situate within the municipality to be made, and which valuation amounts to Twenty-one thousand seven hundred and seventeen pounds: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maldon, by and with the sanction of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the aforesaid valuation or assessment be at once carried into effect, and have full force and effect as contemplated in the said Municipal Act.

BYE-LAW No. 23.—TO IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND ON AN ASSESSMENT OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 10TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1861.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum Two shillings in the pound of such value: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Maldon, that a rate for the current year of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual value of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the said municipal district be imposed and levied, and be due and payable in two equal sums (except such annual rate shall not exceed Ten shillings, then and in every such case the rate shall be collected in one whole sum), the first on the 10th day of December now next ensuing, and the second on the 10th day of June, 1861.

KENSINGTON PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Kensington General Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 7th section of the Act, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations for ever.
3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.
4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton or at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given on the previous day; if not, an extra charge will be made.
6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.
10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.
11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
14. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in schedule; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.
16. The sexton has orders to turn out or take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of Council relating to

cemeteries or the regulations for protection of the same, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the 9th, 12th, and 13th sections of the Act.
