## THE GENERAL SESSIONS DURING THE YEAR 1861.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace should be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony from time to time to define and appoint by Proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts should have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts should be holden, and such limits, districts, places and times respectively to revoke, alter or vary, as the said Lieutenant Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the then existing Courts of General Sessions were appointed to be holden at certain times therein mentioned in every year: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of August, in the present year, the date for holding the first Court of General Sessions for the district of Beechworth in the year 1861 was altered: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and arrange the times for holding all the Courts of General Sessions during the ensuing year: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations, and, with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation appoint that the times at which the several Courts of General Sessions of the peace throughout Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, shall be the times specified under the respective names of the several places hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

# SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF INGLEWOOD.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Inglewood, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of Inglewood in manner following, viz.:—County unnamed, parish unnamed, Loddon District: Commencing at a point on the east boundary of the town reserve, bearing north 78 degrees 8 minutes west fifty-four chains ninety-four links; north 67 degrees 16 minutes west one hundred and sixty-four chains thirty-four links; and north 71 degrees 17 minutes west seventeen chains sixty-four links, crossing the Loddon River to the south-west angle of block 1 (one), township of Bridgewater; bounded on part of the east by a line bearing north ninety-five chains sixty-two links; on the north by a line bearing west two miles; on the west by a line bearing south two miles, crossing the road from Inglewood to Kingower; on the south by a line bearing east two miles, crossing the road from Inglewood to Tarnagulla; and on the remainder of the east by a line bearing north sixty-four chains thirty-eight links to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (Number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Chewton.

# THE INVERLEIGH ROAD DISTRICT.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the counties of Grant and Grenville, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the junction of the Barwon and Moorabool Rivers; thence by the centre line of the Moorabool River to the centre of the road which forms part of the northern boundary of portion 25, in the parish of Gheringhap; thence westerly by the centre line of the said road to its junction with the Geelong and Ballarat road; thence westerly by the centre line of the Upper Western road *via* Bannockburn, Toesdale, Shelford, to a point where it crosses the centre of the Warrambine Creek; thence southerly and easterly by the centre line of the said creek to the centre of the Barwon River; thence easterly by the centre line of the said river home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Inverleigh Road District."

# JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF BACCHUS MARSH.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police and sheriffs, shall within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books

shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November in the present year, it was ordered that a county court should be holden at Bacchus Marsh, the same being a place at which a county court had not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct, that a jury list shall be prepared for the jury district of Bacchus Marsh, in the manner and within the intervals hereinafter stated, that is to say:—

The clerk of petty sessions at Bacchus Marsh shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Bacchus Marsh on or before Wednesday, the second day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed in the eighth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by the Act, on Sunday the twentieth and on Sunday the twenty-seventh days of January aforesaid; the court of petty sessions at Bacchus Marsh shall revise such list on Thursday, the seventh day of February then next ensuing; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Monday, the eleventh day of February aforesaid; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday, the twenty-fifth day of the same month of February.

And the Honorable Richard Davies Ireland, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BYE-LAW No. 25.—A BYE-LAW TO REPEAL BYE-LAWS NOS. 3 AND 24, FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND REGULATION OF A TOLL WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

WHEREAS by bye-law No. 3, passed by the municipal council of Emerald Hill and assented to by His Excellency the Governor, it was directed that a toll should be established at the point on the Sandridge road formerly occupied by the Central Road Board for the collection of tolls: And whereas by bye-law No. 24, passed by the said council to amend the bye-law No. 3 aforesaid, and assented to by His Excellency the Governor, it was directed that the said council should have power to remove the toll-gate on the said road from the point aforesaid to another point on said road within said district, and to establish check-bars or side-bars in connection with said toll-gate at such point, and to levy tolls thereat: And whereas on the sixteenth day of May, 1860, a resolution was passed in the Legislative Assembly, "that in the opinion of that house the road commonly called the Sandridge road, and which extends from Beach street, Sandridge, to the Brighton road, near the southern extremity of Prince's Bridge, in the city of Melbourne, should be declared a main road of the colony, within the sense and meaning of the Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 16 Victoria No. 40, and be maintained out of the public revenue:" And whereas it is considered advisable that practical effect should be given to such resolution with all possible expedition, so as to relieve the public at large from the payment of any toll upon the said road: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council aforesaid, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-chief of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, that from and after the thirty-first day of December, 1860, the said bye-law No. 3 and the said bye-law No. 24 of the municipal council aforesaid shall be repealed.

The council appointed councillor Menzies to attend the municipal conference in Melbourne, the result of whose deliberations has been made public.

The Government, after repeated applications, granted nine and a quarter acres of suburban section No. 9 as sites for town hall and general and cattle markets, and the council contemplate immediate action in the establishment of such markets.

Efforts have been made to extend Piper street from Mollison street to the Eastern Boundary road, but it is feared the cost of lands necessary to be purchased for the purpose will prevent its being carried out.

Applications have been made to the various insurance offices to contribute towards the expense of establishing a fire brigade, but no further steps have been taken in the matter, in consequence of the little pecuniary aid promised.

The council have under consideration the removal of all slaughter-houses from the municipality to the site appointed for the purpose. They also contemplate borrowing a sum of £3000 to carry out various important public works.

The annual election to fill the vacancies occasioned by the retirement by rotation of councillors Kelly, Healy, and Bland, took place on the 10th December, when councillors Wilson, Scott, and Hargreave, were elected.
