GAOL AT BEECHWORTH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*, it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments, within the said colony, which should from time to time be proclaimed by the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments respectively of the place or district where the same are or shall be situated within the said colony, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected in the said colony, and of the prisoners confined within the same: And whereas a certain building situate at Beechworth, and formerly used as a police court, has been devoted to the use of Chinese prisoners, and it is expedient to proclaim the same in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the slab building situated on the site known as the Camp, at Beechworth, and in the vicinity of the Beechworth Gaol, formerly used as a police court, to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction, for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of January, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PARTICULARS.

The body is that of a man about 35 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, with light brown hair, thin sandy whiskers, and small feet, dressed in new moleskin trousers, a faded green jumper with purple stripes and cuffs lined with scarlet silk, blue striped cotton shirt, a flannel under shirt, and a pair of blucher boots. It was sewn up in a blue blanket, and appeared to have been pinned down to the bottom of the river with a forked stick.

Suspicion attaches to Patrick Whelan and his mate (whose name is unknown), splitters, who where camped close to where the body was found, and disappeared suddenly on the 9th of January.

Patrick Whelan is about 30 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, with fair complexion, sandy hair and whiskers, the latter long and thin, no moustache, of slight build, with a scar near one eye, and the left hand sore and tied up.

His mate is from 30 to 35 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, stout built, with dark hair, whiskers, beard and moustache, dressed in moleskin trousers and blue shirt. This man had a dark iron grey mare in his possession.

PROPOSED ROAD. COUNTY OF BOURKE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan describing the exact course and bearings of, and the measurements required for, a road in the county of Bourke (being a deviation in the road from Melbourne to Ballarat *via* Exford) proposed to be opened by the Board of Land and Works, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited at the Crown Lands and Survey Office, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED DEVIATION IN THE MELBOURNE AND BALLARAT ROAD (VIA EXFORD), IN THE PARISHES OF PYWHEITJORRK AND DJERRIWARRH, IN THE COUNTY OF BOURKE.—The centre line of this deviation commences at a point one hundred and fifty chains seven links, measuring along its southern boundary, from the south-east corner of section 20, parish of Pywheittjorrk, and thence bears north 26 degrees 45 minutes west for three chains forty links; thence north 44 degrees 55 minutes west for three chains seventy-three links; thence south 46 degrees 30 minutes west for one chain eighty-two links; thence south 33 degrees 30 minutes west for one chain fifty-three links to the Toolam Toolern Creek, the road being one chain wide; thence the centre line bears south 33 degrees 30 minutes west for seven chains sixty-seven links to the south-western side of the River Werribee, the road being three chains wide.

The name of the owner and occupier of the land in Pywheittjorrk is W. F. Tulloh, and of the land in Djerrriwarrah is S. Staughton.

The total quantity of land proposed to be taken is one acre one rood thirty-nine perches (1a. 1r. 39p.), for which part of the site of the present road will be given.

The estimated cost of effecting this deviation is Five pounds (£5) for shifting twelve chains of fencing.

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, Office of Roads and Bridges, Melbourne, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

HEATHCOTE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT. PETITION FOR ENLARGEMENT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-two householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote, including the chairman and councillors thereof.

The petitioners state they are all householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote.

They refer to the creation of the municipality on the 19th of August, 1859, and draw attention to the power conferred in the Municipal Act 18 Vict. No. 15 to alter or vary the boundaries of a proclaimed district.

They further state that they find it will be for the benefit of the municipality that its boundaries should be altered, and the following boundaries (which are within the limits prescribed by the Act) substituted, viz.:

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention.

That the position and advantages possessed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition.

This petition was presented by A. Thomson, Esq., and the other members of the House for town and county were solicited to support the same.
