PROCIAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders, it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments, within the said colony, which should from time to time be proclaimed by the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, by notice in the Government Gazette, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments respectively of the place or district where the same are or shall be situated within the said colony, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected in the said colony, and of the prisoners confined within the same: And whereas a certain building situate at Beechworth, and formerly used as a police court, has been devoted to the use of Chinese prisoners, and it is expedient to proclaim the same in accordance with the said Act. Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the slab building situated on the site known as the Camp, at Beechworth, and in the vicinity of the Beechworth Gaol, formerly used as a police court, to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction, for the purposes and

The body is that of a man about 35 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, with light brown hair, thin sandy whiskers, and small feet, dressed in new moleskin trousers, a faded green jumper with purple stripes and cuffs lined with scarter silk, blue striped cotton shirt, a flannel under shirt, and a pair of blucher boots. It was sewn up in a blue blanket, and appeared to have been pinned down to the bottom of the river with a forked stick. The petitioners state they are all householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote.

They refer to the creation of the municipality on the 19th of August, 1859, and draw attention to the power conferred in the Municipal Act 18 Vict. No. 15 to alter or vary the boundaries of a proclaimed district.

They further state that they find it will be for the benefit of the municipality that its boundaries should be altered, and the following boundaries (which are within the limits prescribed by the Act) substituted, viz.:—

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT. PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO FITZ ROY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixty-four residents beyond the limits of the municipal district of Fitz Roy, praying that their locality may be included therein WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention. That the position and advantages possessed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.
