NOTICE TO MARINERS. PORT PHILLIP.

MASTERS of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the West Channel, are hereby informed that the construction of a Lighthouse, which is to be built on Swan Spit, upon wooden piles, in twelve (12) feet at low water, close to the present lighthouse, will be commenced on or about the 14th instant.

The vessel from on board of which the foundation piles will be screwed down into the ground will be moored about one hundred (100) yards S.W. of the lightship, and exhibit from sunset to sunrise two (2) white lights until a sufficient number of piles are fixed to enable the work to be carried on without the vessel, when these lights will be removed from the vessel, and be exhibited from a mast, secured to one of the piles, until the completion of the work.

Caution.

All persons in charge of vessels navigating in the neighborhood of the Swan Spit must be careful to give the new lighthouse and vessel a wide berth in passing.

FOR THE SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLE-
SALE.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander
of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament
held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present
Majesty, intitled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the
selling of fermented and spirituous liquors*, it was amongst other
things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with
the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare
any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town,
district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fer-
mented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might
be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the
first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is ex-
pedient to revoke the Proclamations authorizing the sale of spirits
or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, in
the townships of Sandhurst and Eaglehawk, within the district
of Sandhurst hereinafter mentioned, and in the townships of
Elphinstone, Castlemaine, Fryerstown, and Harcourt, and in
the parish of Castlemaine, which are comprised within the dis-
trict of Castlemaine also hereinafter mentioned, and to declare
the districts hereinafter defined to be districts for the purpose
and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now there-
fore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the
advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the above-
mentioned Proclamations; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do
by this my Proclamation declare that the districts hereinafter
named and defined shall be districts wherein premises for the
sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than
two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts
mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is
to say:—

DISTRICT OF SANDHURST.

Commencing at the north-eastern angle of section 54, parish
of Nerring; thence by a Government road to Myers Creek;
thence by Myers Creek to its source; thence southerly and
easterly by the dividing range to Mount Herbert; thence by a
line north-easterly to the south-western angle of the town re-
serve of Mandurang; thence east to the Emu Creek; thence
northwards by the Emu Creek to the southern boundary of
section 14, parish of Strathfieldsaye; thence west to the south-
western angle of the said section; thence north to a point due
east of the commencing point; and thence by a line west to the
commencing point aforesaid.

CASTLEMAINE DISTRICT.

Commencing at the junction of the Limestone Creek with the
River Loddon; thence by that creek to its source; thence by a
line east to the Middleton Creek; thence by the Middleton
Creek to its junction with the River Loddon; thence by a line
east to the River Coliban; thence by the River Coliban to the
Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek to the Mount
Alexander Range; thence by the Mount Alexander Range,
Barker's Creek, and the River Loddon to the commencing point,
including Castlemaine, Muckleford, and Harcourt, hereafter
described as follows, that is to say:—

CASTLEMAINE:—Commencing at a point 1 chain 50 links north
from the north-west angle of section 39, township of Castle-
maine, bounded by lines bearing east 38 chains, south 160 chains,
west 90 chains, north 160 chains, and east 42 chains to the com-
mencing point.

MUCKLEFORD:—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of
allotment 50, section 7; thence north 200 chains; thence west
200 chains; thence south 240 chains; thence east 200 chains;
and thence north to the commencing point.

HARCOURT:—Commencing at the south-western angle of por-
tion 27, section 4; bounded on the east by a line bearing north
to the north-western angle of portion 27, section 3; on the north
by a line west to the main road to Sandhurst; on the west by a
line south, crossing Barker's Creek, 160 chains; and on the
south by a line east 80 chains to the commencing point.

clamation declare that the town hereinafter named and defined
shall be a town wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fer-
mented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may
be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the
first schedule to the above recited Act, that it is to say:—

WHROO TOWNSHIP RESERVE.—Commencing at a point
bearing due east and distant forty chains from the north-
eastern angle of allotment 8 of section 1 in the township of
Whroo; thence north forty chains; thence west eighty chains;
thence south eighty chains; thence east eighty chains; and
thence north forty chains to the commencing point.

LEXTON ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander
of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and
Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in
the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled,
An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria,
it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful
for the Lieutenant Governor; from time to time, by notice in
the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such por-
tion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be
a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and
also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby pro-
claimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation
to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly,
the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive
Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the
counties of Talbot and Ripon hereinafter defined shall be and
constitute a road district for the purposes in the said Act con-
tained, that is to say:—Commencing at the north-west angle of
portion 111, parish of Beechworth; bounded on the east by a
line bearing south to the north-west angle of the parish of
Addington; thence again on the east by the western boundary
of the Ballaarat road district bearing south until it intersects
the main line of road leading from Ballaarat to Ararat; bounded
on the south by the last-mentioned road bearing westerly until
it intersects the Charleycombe Creek; bounded on the west by
a straight line bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle of
the town reserve of Crowlands; bounded on the north by the
south boundary of the Crowlands town reserve and by a straight

line bearing easterly until it intersects the north-west angle of Hodgkinson's pre-emptive right (Woodstock) at the junction of Doctor's and McNeil's Creeks; thence by the north boundary of the said pre-emptive right bearing east, crossing McNeil's Creek to the north-east angle thereof; bounded on the north-west by a straight line from the last-named point bearing south-easterly to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Lexton Road District."

PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO FITZ ROY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixty-four residents beyond the limits of the municipal district of Fitz Roy, praying that their locality may be included therein.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention.

That the position and advantages possessed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition.

SANDHURST MUNICIPALITY.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF SANDHURST, FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 10TH JANUARY, 1860.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The works completed during the past half-year or now in progress, are the formation of portions of Myrtle street, Water street, Violet street, McCrae street, Thistle street, and Bridge lane; curbing and channelling in View place, Market square, and High street; levelling open space in Pall Mall, and forming roadways; making road in continuation of Mitchell street, crossing over New Chum Gully; footpath in Barnard street; footpaths and drains in Panton and Laurel streets; clearing stumps in Barclay place, &c., with many other minor works, and the general maintenance of existing works at a cost of £2,597 8s. 6d.

During the past half-year, the Town Hall has also been completed, and opened for public use.

BYE-LAWS PASSED.

- No. 21. For making the assessment and rate for the current year.
- No. 22. For suppression of nuisances.
- No. 23. For appropriation of Government grant in aid.

FINANCE.

The sum of £2,299 3s. 3d. has been received from the Government as balance of the grant in aid.

The assessment for the year 1859 numbers 3291 properties, amounting to £130,400, on which a rate of 1s. in the pound has been levied, giving as the total amount of rate for the year £6,520.

MISCELLANEOUS.

For the prevention of fires the Council have voted the sum of £100 to purchase apparatus required by No. 2 Fire Brigade; and have also voted the sum of £400 per annum for maintenance and expenses of Fire Brigades, to be expended under the surveillance of a sub-committee to the Council.

For relief of the sick and destitute, the sum of £200 has also been paid to the Bendigo District Hospital, and £200 to the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum.

A site of six acres has been granted for a cattle market, but legal difficulties have as yet prevented the establishment of the market.

The municipal boundary was publicly perambulated on the 11th October.

In consequence of the Board of Roads and Bridges refusing to place upon the estimates a sum to reimburse the council for their expenditure in maintenance of the sludge channels, it was deemed advisable to send the chairman as a deputation to the Government on the matter. The council are now informed that the requisite amount will be placed on the supplementary estimates. The net amount expended was £2,181 17s. 3d., which has been swelled by interest to £2,493 12s. 3d.
