NOTICE TO MARINERS.

PORT PHILLIP.

MASTERS of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the West Channel, are hereby informed that the construction of a Lighthouse, which is to be built on Swan Spit, upon wooden piles, in twelve (12) feet at low water, close to the present lightship, will be commenced on or about the 14th instant.

The vessel from on board of which the foundation piles will be screwed down into the ground will be moored about one hundred (100) yards S.W. of the lightship, and exhibit from sunset to sunrise two (2) white lights until a sufficient number of piles are fixed to enable the work to be carried on without the vessel, when these lights will be removed from the vessel, and be exhibited from a mast, secured to one of the piles, until the completion of the work.

Caution.

All persons in charge of vessels navigating in the neighborhood of the Swan Spit must be careful to give the new light-house and vessel a wide berth in passing.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

CORSAIR ROCK, PORT PHILLIP HEADS.

IN reference to the paragraph headed "Corsair Rock" in the Sailing Directions for Port Phillip, issued from this office in May, 1854: Notice is hereby given that during the course of the survey of this port now in progress, under Commander Ross, R.N., Marine Surveyor, several small pinnacle rocks have been found to exist between the western end of Nepean Reef and the Corsair Rock; also a small detached rock situated about one hundred and fifty (150) feet N.N.E. from the Corsair Rock, having from ten (10) to twelve (12) feet water over them.

These dangers, it will be observed, close up the narrow passage hitherto supposed to exist (and referred to in the Sailing Directions) between the western end of Nepean Reef and the Corsair Rock, but do not affect the fairway used by vessels passing in and out between the Heads.

These newly discovered dangers being inside of the Corsair Rock, the marks and instructions given in the Sailing Directions to clear the latter remain unaltered, namely:—Shortland's Bluff Flagstaff kept half a cable's length open to the westward of the low lighthouse clears the Corsair and adjacent rocks.

Masters of vessels in possession of the beforementioned Sailing Directions can obtain, on application at any of the Harbor Offices, a slip with the above information, printed in corresponding type and size, for insertion as an addendum to them.

**NOTICE TO MASTERS AND PILOTS OF VESSELS
ARRIVING IN VICTORIA WITH GUNPOWDER ON
BOARD.**

THE Governor in Council has, in exercise of the authority conferred by the Act of Parliament 21 Victoria No. 21, sec. 1, prescribed the limits hereinafter specified to be the limits within which no ship or vessel having more than twenty pounds (20 lbs.) of gunpowder on board, arriving in or off any of the undermentioned ports or harbors of Victoria, shall be permitted to anchor, viz.:—

PORT OF MELBOURNE.

Within three-quarters of a mile of Gellibrand's Point; nor to the northward of a line bearing east from the lightship.

PORT OF GEELONG.

Inner Harbor.—Within three-quarters of a mile of Limeburners' Point; nor to the westward of a line bearing north-north-west from the Powder Magazine.

Outer Harbor.—Within two (2) miles of the shore; nor to the northward of a line bearing east from Point Henry.

PORT OF PORTLAND BAY.

Within three-quarters of a mile of the shore; nor to the northward of a line bearing east from the lighthouse.

PORT OF PORT FAIRY.

Within three-quarters of a mile of the shore; nor to the westward of a line bearing N.N.E. from the lighthouse.

PORT OF WARRENANBOOL.

Within half a mile of the shore; nor to the westward of a line bearing south-south-west from the beach lighthouse.

PORT OF PORT ALBERT.

Within two (2) miles of the wharfs; nor to the northward of Sandy Island.

The bearings are magnetic.

LEXTON ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the counties of Talbot and Ripon hereinafter defined shall be and constitute a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained; that is to say:—Commencing at the north-west angle of portion 111, parish of Beckworth, bounded on the east by a line bearing south to the north-west angle of the parish of Addington; thence again on the east by the western boundary of the Ballarat road district bearing south until it intersects the main line of road leading from Ballarat to Ararat; bounded on the south by the last-mentioned road bearing westerly until it intersects the Charleycombe Creek; bounded on the west by a straight line bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle of the town reserve of the Crowlands town reserve and by a straight line bearing easterly until it intersects the north-west angle of Hodgekinson's pre-emptive right (Woodstock) at the junction of Doctor's and McNeil's Creeks; thence by the north boundary of the said pre-emptive right bearing east, crossing McNeil's Creek to the north-east angle thereof; bounded on the north-west by a straight line from the last-named point bearing south-easterly to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Lexton Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO FITZ ROY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixty-four residents beyond the limits of the municipal district of Fitz Roy, praying that their locality may be included therein.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention.

That the position and advantages possessed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"That your Excellency will be pleased to exclude that portion of Smith Ward lying east of Nicholson street from the jurisdiction of the [recently] contemplated municipality of Carlton; and further be pleased, with the consent of the council of Fitz Roy to alter the northern boundary of that municipality as follows:—From a point at the intersection of Nicholson street and Reilly street, along the centre of Nicholson street northward to the southern boundary of Brunswick municipality; thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary line to the Merri Creek; along the centre of the said creek southerly to the centre of the Plenty road; thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence to a point in the said road opposite the centre of Smith street; thence southerly to a point at the intersection of Reilly street and Smith street."

EIGHTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT.

REPORT of the proceedings of the Municipal Council of Sandhurst, for the half-year ending 10th January, 1860.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The works completed during the past half-year or now in progress, are the formation of portions of Myrtle street, Water street, Violet street, McCrae street, Thistle street, and Bridge lane; curbing and channelling in View place, Market square, and High street; levelling open space in Pall Mall, and forming roadways; making road in continuation of Mitchell street, crossing over New Chum Gully; footpath in Barnard street; footpaths and drains in Panton and Laurel streets; clearing stumps in Barclay place, &c., with many other minor works, and the general maintenance of existing works at a cost of £2,597 8s. 6d.

During the past half-year, the Town Hall has also been completed, and opened for public use.

BYE-LAWS PASSED.

- No. 21. For making the assessment and rate for the current year.
- No. 22. For suppression of nuisances.
- No. 23. For appropriation of Government grant in aid.

FINANCE.

The sum of £2,299 3s. 3d. has been received from the Government as balance of the grant in aid.

The assessment for the year 1859 numbers 3291 properties, amounting to £130,400, on which a rate of 1s. in the pound has been levied, giving as the total amount of rate for the year £6,520.

MISCELLANEOUS.

For the prevention of fires the Council have voted the sum of £100 to purchase apparatus required by No. 2 Fire Brigade; and have also voted the sum of £400 per annum for maintenance and expenses of Fire Brigades, to be expended under the surveillance of a sub-committee to the Council.

For relief of the sick and destitute, the sum of £200 has also been paid to the Bendigo District Hospital, and £200 to the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum.

A site of six acres has been granted for a cattle market, but legal difficulties have as yet prevented the establishment of the market.

The municipal boundary was publicly perambulated on the 11th October.

In consequence of the Board of Roads and Bridges refusing to place upon the estimates a sum to reimburse the council for their expenditure in maintenance of the sludge channels, it was deemed advisable to send the chairman as a deputation to the Government on the matter. The council are now informed that the requisite amount will be placed on the supplementary estimates. The net amount expended was £2,131 17s. 3d., which has been swelled by interest to £2,433 12s. 3d.

The council have made many applications to the Government, in furtherance of the interests of the town, with various success, and amongst others, a most urgent claim for a proper and safe bridge at the junction of the Mount Korong road and Main Murray road, at View Point, but this the Road Board states cannot be done this year unless an equivalent amount is taken from some other work in the district.
