LAND RESERVED AT SANDHURST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, reserved the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate at Sandhurst, as a Water Reserve.

Such land is accordingly excepted from the operations of mining within the meaning of the 4th clause of the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32.

A plan showing the metes and bounds of the land so reserved is deposited in the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne.

DESCRIPTION OF THE WATER RESERVE, BRIDGE STREET, SANDHURST:—Commencing at a point distant one chain and fifty links, and bearing N. 16° E. from the north-eastern angle of section 25 in the town of Sandhurst; thence N. 16° E. eight chains and forty links; thence N. 56° W. five chains and sixty links; thence S. 34° W. three chains and sixty links; thence S. 48° W. seven chains and eighty links; and thence S. 74° E. ten chains and sixty links to the commencing point. The lines above described are the sides of Bridge street, Arnold street, Barnard street, and Water street, which enclose the reserve.
