**GLENLYON ROAD DISTRICT.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Talbot hereinafter defined shall be and constitute a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say :—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section 5, in the parish of Wombat; from thence due north to the north-west angle of allotment 1 in the said section; thence north 1 chain to the south side of allotment 4 in section 6 of the said parish; thence west to the south-west angle of said allotment 4; thence along the west boundary of said allotments 4 and 3 of the said section 6 and of allotments 4 and 3 of section 7, in the said parish, to the south side of section 19 in the parish of Holcombe; thence northerly along the centre line of Middleton's Creek to the north end of section 2 of the said parish of Holcombe; thence on the north by a line bearing east to the east boundary of the parish of Holcombe; thence on the east by a line forming the east boundary of the said parish of Holcombe to a point due west of the south-west angle of section 15, in the parish of Burke; thence again on the north by a line bearing east to and along the south boundary of section 15, in the said parish of Burke, to the south-east angle of the said section 15; thence further easterly to the north-west angle of section 16 in the same parish; thence further east along the north boundary of sections 16, 15, 14, 11, 12 and 13, to the centre of the River Coliban; thence on the east by the centre of the said river to a point in a line with and easterly of the south boundary of the parish of Glenlyon; and thence on the south by a line and the south boundary of the said parish of Glenlyon to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be, "The Glenlyon Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO FITZ ROY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixty-four residents beyond the limits of the municipal district of Fitz Roy, praying that their locality may be included therein.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention. That the position and advantages possessed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—“That your Excellency will be pleased to exclude that portion of Smith Ward lying east of Nicholson street from the jurisdiction of the [recently] contemplated municipality of Carlton; and further be pleased, with the consent of the council of Fitz Roy to alter the northern boundary of that municipality as follows:—From a point at the intersection of Nicholson street and Reilly street, along the centre of Nicholson street northward to the southern boundary of Brunswick municipality; thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary line to the Merri Creek; along the centre of the said creek southerly to the centre of the Plenty road; thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence to a point in the said road opposite the centre of Smith street; thence southerly to a point at the intersection of Reilly street and Smith street.”

The Tea is made in the following proportion for 300 persons:—Tea, 2 lbs.; sugar, 6 lbs.; 2½ gals. new milk. The stew is made by boiling (in the liquor of the meat cooked the previous day) 38 lbs. of uncooked meat free from bone; 186 lbs. of potatoes; 32 lbs. of onions; 9 lbs. of rice, and pepper and salt, for 300 persons. Occasionally 30 lbs. of flour are added.

Working patients are allowed the following extras:—Lunch daily at 11 a.m., 2 oz. of bread; ½ oz. cheese; and ½ pint of beer; and ½ pint of beer at 4 p.m. The superintendent to have power to substitute tea for the beer allowed to the working female patients at his discretion.

One oz. of pepper and 25 oz. of salt to be drawn daily for every 100 full rations to patients. Pay patients allowed 1 oz. of butter and ½ oz. of coffee daily; 10 oz. roast beef (uncooked without bone), and pudding consisting of ½ lb. of flour, ¼ lb. raisins, and 1 oz. suet, on Christmas Day and the Queen's Birthday, for patients only. Attendants' diet: 1 lb. bread; 1 lb. of meat; 1 lb. of vegetables; ½ oz. of salt; 1 oz. rice; 1 gill of milk; ½ oz. of tea; 4 oz. sugar; 1 oz. butter; 2 oz. cheese, and 1 pint of beer (or 3 oz. of flour in lieu of beer) daily.
