#### CLASS B.—DRY ALLUVIAL SINKING.

That the bye-laws No. 14, "shepherding," and No. 15, "forfeit," shall be and are hereby rescinded and superseded by the following bye-law:—

14. *Shepherding*.—All claimholders must be present on their claims every lawful day (after that on which the claim was taken possession of) two consecutive hours between Nine a.m. and Twelve at noon. Any miner or miners not fulfilling this condition shall forfeit his or their claim or share, unless, in case of dispute, he or they can give sufficient reason for such absence.

## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT. PETITION FOR ANNEXATION TO FITZ ROY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by sixty-four residents beyond the limits of the municipal district of Fitz Roy, praying that their locality may be included therein.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are residents in the portion of Smith Ward, Melbourne, which is east of Nicholson street (which portion it was proposed should form part of another municipal district recently in contemplation—the Carlton), and that they are desirous of being included within the contiguous municipal district of Fitz Roy.

That they have for years suffered considerable inconvenience and loss from the neglected condition of the approaches to their locality from the city and elsewhere, a condition unlikely to be improved for a considerable period in connection with Carlton, the pressing wants of which locality will require prior attention.

That the position and advantages possessed by the contiguous district of Fitz Roy lead them to believe that they will obtain greater benefits through being annexed thereto than they can possibly expect even under the most favorable circumstances from being connected with Carlton.

They state, lastly, that they constitute a majority of the residents within the area described in the prayer of their petition.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—"That your Excellency will be pleased to exclude that portion of Smith Ward lying east of Nicholson street from the jurisdiction of the [recently] contemplated municipality of Carlton; and further be pleased, with the consent of the council of Fitz Roy to alter the northern boundary of that municipality as follows:—From a point at the intersection of Nicholson street and Reilly street, along the centre of Nicholson street northward, to the southern boundary of Brunswick municipality; thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary line to the Merri Creek; along the centre of the said creek southerly to the centre of the Plenty road; thence in a south-westerly direction to the centre of the Heidelberg road; thence to a point in the said road opposite the centre of Smith street; thence southerly to a point at the intersection of Reilly street and Smith street."

They draw attention to the subject of annexing the remaining portions of the parishes of Bellarine, Moolap, and Paywit to their district.

They state that they have given the subject considerable attention, and that great inconvenience is felt for want of proper roads from the townships of Drysdale and Portarlington to communicate with the Queenscliff road, and especially urge the necessity for the opening of a new line through Messrs. #### BYE-LAW ADOPTED.

No. 22. To authorise the expenditure of 1st instalment grant-in-aid for 1859.—Gazetted 30th August.

The limited revenue at the disposal of the municipal council having been mainly expended during the preceding half-year, no public works of importance could be undertaken until the Government make known their intention with regard to municipalities and the amount to be expended at Warrnambool. The contracts entered into at the beginning of the year for forming portions of Timor and Liebeg streets have been completed.

1st August and 29th November.—Applications to Government were renewed for a special grant of £4000 towards making the main approaches into town. £2000 have since been placed on the Estimates.

On the 2nd September, the council remitted to the Honorable Dr. Wilkie, of Melbourne, the amount collected in this district towards a general fund for exploring Central Australia.

November.—The council received a letter from Messrs. Geo. South and Co., Melbourne, proposing to establish a gas company in this town, but the council, after obtaining by a general canvass the number of lights likely to be required, the cost of plant and working expenses appeared too serious an undertaking for them to entertain, particularly at the present juncture (the Government contemplating a reduction of the grant-in-aid), and it was decided to leave the matter for the present to public or private enterprise.

December.—The council forwarded to the local members a memorial against the Government proposal to reduce the annual grant in aid of public works in country districts; and

requested those gentlemen to urge upon the Government the injustice of such a measure.

The council have again to thank several gentlemen for their liberal contributions of seeds and shrubs for the Botanical Gardens.
