**SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY
POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL
DISTRICT OF HAMILTON.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intitled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to, and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Hamilton shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act, numbered respectively, V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MUNICIPALITY OF BALLAARAT EAST.

BYE-LAW No. 27.—FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE STREETS, FOOTPATHS, ROADS, RIGHTS-OF-WAY, AND RESERVES, WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BALLAARAT EAST.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass or make bye-laws for the general good thereof: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Ballarat East, that from and after the day on which His Excellency the Governor shall have signified his assent hereunto, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to remove the surface soil, or dig, or make any hole, or sink any shaft upon, or otherwise injure for any purpose whatsoever, any of the streets, footpaths, roads, rights-of-way or reserves, which are or may be surveyed or defined by some conspicuous means within the boundaries of the said municipal district, whether formed or not. And any person or persons committing either of these acts or offences shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum or penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE ROADS, STREETS, LANES, AND FOOTPATHS WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that every municipal council shall have the care and management of the roads, streets, paths, and public thoroughfares: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Daylesford, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, as required by the provisions of the said recited Act, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to remove the surface soil, dig any hole, sink any shaft, deposit any substance, or in any way whatsoever obstruct, or cause or allow any sludge or water to flow on to or in any way injure any of the roads, streets, lanes, or footpaths within the boundaries of the municipality, whether the same be formed or not; and any person or persons committing any one of these offences, shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

The mean height of the thermometer in the shade during the month of January was 68.7°, or 1° hotter than it was in December. The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs, however, in spite of this continued high temperature, has much declined, the number of deaths of all ages in January, being 407, whilst during December the number was 479.

Although the mean temperature of the seven first days of the month was 73.1°, or 4.4° higher than the mean of the month, the daily mortality was only just up to the average, 13.1. For the next seven days the mean temperature fell to 65°, whilst during the same period the average mortality sunk to 13.1, or one day less than that of the month. For the next six days the mean height of the thermometer was 66.1°, and the mortality again rose to 13 a day, or within a trifle of the average. For the next two days the mean temperature rose to 88°, or 19.3° above the monthly mean, the mortality being at the rate of 23 a day, or 14.9 above the average for the month. For the remaining nine days the mean temperature was 65.6°, whilst the daily rate of mortality declined to 7.7, or 5.4 below that of the month.

The daily average of deaths during January was 13; the greatest number occurred on the 21st and 22nd, on which days the numbers dying of all ages were respectively 30 and 26. Twenty-one also died on the 11th, and 20 on the 17th, on both of which days the wind was from the hot wind quarter, and the weather very oppressive.

The following table shows the daily averages of deaths of persons of all ages during December, 1859, and January, 1860, in the different sub-districts included in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and the increase or decrease of the rate of mortality in each—

It is thus seen that the improvement has been greatest in Melbourne Proper, North Melbourne and Carlton, East Melbourne, East Collingwood and Richmond; that there is a slight improvement in Jika-jika, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla, Boroondara; that in Fitz Roy and South Yarra and Prahran the average mortality remains the same; whilst deaths have greatly increased in Emerald Hill and Sandridge and Cut-paw-paw parish, and a slightly increased mortality has taken place amongst the shipping in Hobson's Bay.

Of the total number of deaths recorded during the month, 299 were of children under 5; of these no less than 232 were of children under 3, of whom 204 had not completed their first year. The deaths of children under 5 were 73.6 per cent. of the total. This proportion differs but slightly from that of December, when the deaths of children under 5 were 73.4 per cent. of the entire number. In January, the unusual occurrence has taken place of the deaths of female children exceeding those of males; this is the first month since last July in which more girls have died than boys.

Amongst the most prevalent causes of death, dysentery and diarrhoea, which in December carried off 141 children of both sexes, have in January been fatal to 104. Deaths from head affections have increased from 32 to 35; from bronchial and chest diseases, not including diphtheria, from 11 to 13; the deaths from diphtheria and croup are respectively set down as 17 and 6 against the same numbers last month; from fever as 5 against 8 last month; from whooping cough as 2 against 3 last month. A child of a year and a half old died of *pemphigus*, which is an eruptive disease attended with fever of a *typhoid* character, and an infant of 5 months old of sunstroke. A child of 14 months, and another of 12 months old died of burns, and a child of a year old from the effects of a scald; a boy of 4 years old was accidentally drowned, and an infant 10 days old died of suffocation.

Of the 108 persons who died above the age of 5 years, 13 were between 5 and 15 years old, 32 between 15 and 30, 34 between 30 and 45, 21 between 45 and 60, and 8 upwards of 60 years of age; 32 deaths are set down to throat and chest complaints, exclusive of diphtheria, against 31 from those causes in December; 4 are set down to diphtheria, viz., a girl of 14, another of 13, a boy of 6, and another of 5½ years, against 2 persons over 5 set down to the same complaint in December; to dysentery 14, against 11 last month; to head affections 9, against 3; to fever 8, against 12; and to diseases of the internal organs 13. A male of 50 and a female of 58 years of age died of apoplexy. A male of 59 years of hemiplegia, or paralysis affecting one side of the body. A female of 41 years of whitlow. A sailor on board one of the ships in the Bay died of *beriberi*, a disease mainly confined to India, and especially prevalent in Malabar and Ceylon; and a milkman, 25 years of age, died of sunstroke, on the 22nd, at Collingwood; 4 male and 1 female lunatics died in the Yarra Bend Asylum; and 6 accidental or violent deaths occurred in the district.
