THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HEATHCOTE ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case, save as therein-after mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the nineteenth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the municipal district of Heathcote was defined as therein mentioned: And whereas a petition has been received from the householders and landholders at Heathcote aforesaid, praying for the alteration of the municipal boundaries thereof, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the boundaries of the said municipal district, and with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation declare that the said municipal district of Heathcote shall be and consist of the area comprised within the boundaries and limits hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the north-west boundary of country allotment No. 48 in the parish of Heathcote 25 chains from the south-west side of the main road; thence true north 32 degrees east 53 chains 78 links, crossing the main road to a point 25 chains from the north-east side thereof; thence by a line bearing true east 41 degrees 45 minutes south 46 chains 10 links more or less

to the town boundary; thence by the town boundary true north 65 degrees 5 minutes east 70 chains 20 links more or less, and true east 65 degrees 55 minutes south 202 chains 28 links, and true south 65 degrees 55 minutes west 36 chains 30 links more or less; thence leaving the town boundary true east 60 degrees 27 minutes south 36 chains more or less; thence true east 40 degrees 57 minutes south 120 chains 74 links more or less; thence south 40 degrees 57 minutes west 53 chains more or less, and passing through the south-east angle of Heathcote suburban allotment 18 A; thence by the parish boundary bearing true west 41 degrees 30 minutes north 131 chains 20 links more or less; thence true west 60 degrees 27 minutes north 49 chains more or less to the town boundary again; then by the town boundary bearing true south 65 degrees 55 minutes west 30 chains 14 links more or less to the corner post on the "Red Hill," and west 65 degrees 55 minutes north 161 chains 94 links more or less; and thence leaving the town boundary west 51 degrees 30 minutes north 53 chains 20 links more or less to the point of commencement.

MAIN ROADS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, to proclaim, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, the roads in the said colony which should be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the roads hereinafter described shall be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Western Port and Gipps Land road viz:—
THE WESTERN PORT ROAD:—Commencing at Dandenong, in the county of Mornington, and bearing thence in a southerly direction *via* Cranbourne to near the north coast line of Western Port; thence easterly *via* Sawtell's Creek, Tooridin Inlet, and Station Creek; thence *via* Ballock Creek; and thence trending southerly to Corinella.

THE GIPPS LAND ROAD:—Commencing at Dandenong, in the county of Mornington, and bearing thence easterly *via* Berwick and Fakenham to the Buneep.

THE DANDENONG ROAD:—Commencing at the Junction Hotel, on the Brighton road, in the county of Bourke; thence *via* Wellington street, Windsor, to the intersection of Chapel street, Prahran; thence *via* Oakleigh to Dandenong.

Kilmore to Heathcote, viz:—
THE HEATHCOTE ROAD:—Commencing at a point on the Sydney road, in the county of Dalhousie; about two miles north of Kilmore; thence in a north-westerly direction *via* Pyalong, Heathcote, and Axedale, to Sandhurst.

Geelong to Melbourne, viz:—
THE MELBOURNE AND GEELONG ROAD:—Commencing at Flemington, on the Mount Alexander road, in the county of Bourke; thence *via* the Melbourne Cattle Yards and the Racecourse; thence *via* the Saltwater River Point; thence *via* Wyndham, Rothwell, and the Duckponds, to Geelong.

Ararat to south-western seaboard, viz:—
THE ARARAT ROAD:—Commencing at a point three and a half miles south of Woolsthorpe, in the county of Villiers; thence northerly *via* Woolsthorpe, Caramut, Chatsworth, Wickliffe (Ross's station) (Crisp's or Wright's pre-emptive section), to Ararat.

Ararat to Raglan road, viz:—
THE RAGLAN ROAD:—Commencing at Ballaarat, in the county of Grenville; thence *via* Burraumbet Ford, Burraumbet Lake, Cockpit Lagoon, Mount Ross, Beaufort, and Raglan, to Ararat.

Ararat to Pleasant Creek road, viz:—
THE ARARAT AND PLEASANT CREEK ROAD:—Commencing at Ararat, in the county of Ripon; thence *via* Pleasant Creek to the Wimmera road.

ROSDALE TO STRATFORD:—Commencing at Rosedale, in the Gipps Land District, and bearing easterly *via* the La Trobe and Thomson Rivers and Sale to Stratford.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS
CONFIRMED.**

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has confirmed the Order-of-the-Board of Land and Works hereto subjoined, viz.:-

It is ordered that toll-gates be erected at the following sites, and that the usual tolls (in accordance with the Proclamation dated 10th August, 1858) be levied thereat so soon as the necessary erections are completed, viz.:-

- On the Western Port and Gipps Land road, at Dandenong bridge.
- On the Dandenong road, at Mulgrave.
- On the Sydney road, at a point about fifty chains north of the approach to Broadford bridge.
- On the Sydney road, at Avenel bridge.
- On the Sydney road at Benalla bridge.
- On the Heathcote road, at a point about six miles distant from its junction with the Sydney road.
- On the Geelong to Melbourne road, at the Geelong municipal boundary.
- On the Lower Western road, at Inverleigh.
- On the Rosdale to Stratford road (Gipps Land), at the Thompson River bridge.
- On the Ararat to south-western seaboard road, at Spring Creek.
- On the Ararat to south-western seaboard road, at "The Gap."
- On the Ararat to Raglan road, at Dobie's bridge.
- On the Ararat to Pleasant Creek road, at a point about four miles north of Ararat.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS

SYDNEY ROAD DEVIATION.**

NOTE.—Boroondara and Brighton are reported as healthy, and Brunswick has improved. Of the sixteen deaths at Collingwood, nine were of children under three years of age. In Melbourne, twenty out of thirty-nine deaths registered were of children. Of the seven deaths at Richmond, three were of infants, and of the remainder, one case was that of a suicide, and another was the result of a severe burn. At St. Kilda, more sickness than usual has prevailed during the last week; and at Williamstown, a great deal of sickness is reported amongst children.
