PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henny Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description scover, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Ballaarat: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Ballaarat, the following buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say.—

The premises used as the Road Engineer's office, situate on a portion of allotment 4, section 6, fronting Sturt street, Ballaarat, and adjoining the Survey Office, together with the outbuildings belonging to such premises.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.
