MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, BALLAARAT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act, with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Ballaarat: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Ballaarat, the following buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The premises used as the Road Engineer's office, situate on a portion of allotment 4, section 6, fronting Sturt street, Ballaarat, and adjoining the Survey Office, together with the outbuildings belonging to such premises.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PUBLIC WORKS FINISHED OR IN PROGRESS.

Such works as the council deemed it advisable to undertake during the past half-year have been completed in a satisfactory manner, in accordance with the plans and specifications. The kerbing and channelling of the east side of Sydney street, between Bourke and Union streets, has been completed, and it is to be regretted that so few of the owners of property on that side of the street have availed themselves of the opportunity thus afforded to complete the footway fronting their respective holdings. The drainage of part of Melbourne, Foot, and Bourke streets has been partially effected, much to the comfort of many of the residents on the west side of Sydney street. That portion of Foot street between Church and John streets has been

repaired and remetalled, and it is in contemplation to proceed with the kerbing and channelling of Sydney street between Union and Clarke streets.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council has made every effort to induce the Government to place a sum of money upon the Estimates to be appropriated to the above purpose, hitherto without success.

Some time back, Mr. C. Kingk, C.E., was employed by the council to make a survey, and report upon the best means of supplying the town with water. This was undertaken under the impression that Government assistance would be forthcoming, in the event of which it was deemed advisable to be prepared with something tangible upon which calculations might be based. A copy of Mr. Kingk's report was therefore duly forwarded to the Government.

ELECTIONS.

Councillor Butler resigned on 14th November, and the vacancy was filled up by the election of Mr. G. Hudson, on the 21st December.

The chairman, councillor Bevan, also resigned on the 16th of January, and Mr. A. Caldwell was elected by polled votes to the vacant seat on the 22nd of February.

POST OFFICE.

An active correspondence has been maintained with the Government in reference to the erection of a post office, and it is to be hoped that a building for that purpose will be undertaken at no distant date.
