REGULATION—PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

THE Board of Land and Works directs that the following Regulations respecting the payment of preliminary deposits, which for some time past have been in force in the Department of Roads and Bridges, shall for the future be observed in the Public Works Department.

FURTHER REGULATION PASSED BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

The Board of Land and Works orders that, from and after the 1st July next, contractors tendering for works under the Department of Roads and Bridges be required to attend the opening of the tenders, in the Board Room, at the Crown Lands Office, either personally or by an authorised agent.

Immediately upon the conditional acceptance of a tender by the Board, the accepted tenderer or his agent shall pay in cash a preliminary deposit of £10 when the amount of the contract is under £1000, or £25 when the amount of the contract exceeds £1000; such sum to be absolutely forfeited in the event of his not entering into the requisite contract agreement within one week.

Contractors will also be required to make such alterations in the schedules to their tenders (not affecting the bulked sum in the body thereof) as may be necessary to bring them into conformity with the specification and general conditions of the contract, and as may be required by the Inspector General of Roads, failing which, such deposit to be in like manner forfeited. A letter embodying the abovenamed conditions to be signed by the contractor when paying the amount of the deposit.

SIR,—I transmit to you herewith copies of New Regulations which have been issued by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty affecting candidates for Naval Cadetships. These regulations will come into operation on 1st April next.

NAVAL CADETS.

(The following Regulations will come into operation in regard to persons nominated to Naval Cadetships on or after the 1st of April, 1860.)

I. No person will be nominated to a cadetship in the Royal Navy, who shall be under 12 or above 14 years of age at the time of his first examination.

II. Every candidate, on obtaining a nomination, will be required to pass an examination at the Royal Naval College at Portsmouth, within three months of nomination. In the special cases of nominations granted to the sons of natives of Her Majesty's colonies, a candidate will be allowed to pass a preliminary examination on board the Flag or Senior Officer's ship on the station; but such examination must be passed in strict accordance with these regulations, and should the candidate be found qualified, it will still be necessary that he should be sent to England, to be entered on board a training ship where he will be subject to the same regulations as other cadets.

III. The candidate must produce a certificate of birth, or declaration thereof made before a magistrate.

IV. The candidate must be in good health and fit for the service, that is, free from impediment of speech, defect of vision, rupture, or other physical inefficiency.

Candidates will be required—

1. To write English correctly from dictation, and in a legible hand.
2. To read, translate, and parse an easy passage from Latin or from some Foreign Living Language.

N.B.—The aid of a dictionary will be allowed for these translations.

And to have a satisfactory knowledge of—

3. The leading facts of Scripture and English history.
4. Modern geography, in so far as relates to a knowledge of the principal countries, capitals, mountains, and rivers. To be able to point out the position of a place on a map when its latitude and longitude is given.
5. Arithmetic, including proportion, and a fair knowledge of vulgar and decimal fractions.
6. A knowledge of the definitions and axioms of the First Book of Euclid.

As drawing will prove a most useful qualification for naval officers, it is recommended that candidates for the service should be instructed therein.

V. If the candidate be found unqualified at his first examination, he will be allowed a second trial at the next quarterly examination. Should he not pass this second examination, he will be finally rejected.

VI. If the candidate succeeds in passing the required examination, he will be at once appointed to a training ship for the purpose of instruction, rigging of ships, seamanship, the use of nautical instruments, &c.

List of instruments and books which each cadet will be required to have on entry—

- Sextant.
- Case of mathematical instruments, containing a good protractor.
- Spy glass.
- French grammar and a dictionary containing sea terms.
- A book on navigation.
- Euclid's elements.
- Book of geography. (Sullivan's 2s. ed.)
- Book on use of mathematical and nautical instruments.
- A book on the steam engine.
- Coleenso's arithmetic and algebra.
- Jean's trigonometry.
- Boyd's naval cadet's manual.

The ship's library will contain books of instruction.

* These examinations will take place on the first Wednesdays in the months of March, June, September, and December.

AT a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden at the Public Lands Office, La Trobe street west, in the city of Melbourne, on the eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

21. The distribution of the sum of £13,510, being the vote in aid to the Board of Agriculture for 1860, shall be as follows, that is to say:—In aid to agricultural societies, £7730; expenses of the board and council, to be expended by and under its direction, £530; for the Experimental Farm, to be expended by and under the direction of the council, £3000; and for the collecting and compiling of agricultural statistics, to be expended by and under the direction of the Registrar General, whose certificate to the accounts shall be sufficient, £2250.

MUNICIPALITY OF CRESWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 11.—FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR 1860.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised and required to assess all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to Her Majesty) according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Creswick, that all the several properties in houses and lands within the limits of the municipal district of Creswick be and the same are hereby assessed for the current municipal year One thousand eight hundred and sixty according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll made by Joseph Reed, the town clerk, and finally confirmed by the justices in petty sessions assembled on the tenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, amounting to the sum of Fourteen thousand and seventy-four pounds ten shillings (£14,074 10s.), and that a rate for the current municipal year One thousand eight hundred and sixty of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the said annual value be and the same is hereby imposed and levied on all the said properties respectively, said amount to be paid in one sum, to be due on the first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty.

PUBLIC WORKS FINISHED OR IN PROGRESS.

Such works as the council deemed it advisable to undertake during the past half-year have been completed in a satisfactory manner, in accordance with the plans and specifications. The kerbing and channelling of the east side of Sydney street, between Bourke and Union streets, has been completed, and it is to be regretted that so few of the owners of property on that side of the street have availed themselves of the opportunity thus afforded to complete the footway fronting their respective holdings. The drainage of part of Melbourne, Foot, and Bourke streets has been partially effected, much to the comfort of many of the residents on the west side of Sydney street. That portion of Foot street between Church and John streets has been repaired and remodelled, and it is in contemplation to proceed with the kerbing and channelling of Sydney street between Union and Clarke streets.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council has made every effort to induce the Government to place a sum of money upon the Estimates to be appropriated to the above purpose, hitherto without success.

Some time back, Mr. C. King, C.E., was employed by the council to make a survey, and report upon the best means of supplying the town with water. This was undertaken under the impression that Government assistance would be forthcoming, in the event of which it was deemed advisable to be prepared with something tangible upon which calculations might be based. A copy of Mr. King's report was therefore duly forwarded to the Government.

ELECTIONS.

Councillor Butler resigned on 14th November, and the vacancy was filled up by the election of Mr. G. Hudson, on the 21st December.

The chairman, councillor Bevan, also resigned on the 16th of January, and Mr. A. Caldwell was elected by polled votes to the vacant seat on the 22nd of February.
