FURTHER REGULATION PASSED BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

The Board of Land and Works orders that, from and after the 1st July next, contractors tendering for works under the Department of Roads and Bridges be required to attend the opening of the tenders, in the Board Room, at the Crown Lands Office, either personally or by an authorised agent.

Immediately upon the conditional acceptance of a tender by the Board, the accepted tenderer or his agent shall pay in cash a preliminary deposit of £10 when the amount of the contract is under £1000, or £25 when the amount of the contract exceeds £1000; such sum to be absolutely forfeited in the event of his not entering into the requisite contract agreement within one week.

Contractors will also be required to make such alterations in the schedules to their tenders (not affecting the bulked sum in the body thereof) as may be necessary to bring them into conformity with the specification and general conditions of the contract, and as may be required by the Inspector General of Roads, failing which, such deposit to be in like manner forfeited. A letter embodying the abovenamed conditions to be signed by the contractor when paying the amount of the deposit.

LEADING LIGHT AT WARRNAMBOOL.

WITH reference to a Notice to Mariners issued from this office, dated the 28th May, 1859, respecting the second light at Warrnambool:—

Notice is hereby given that on and after the 25th instant, between sunset and sunrise, a fixed red light will be exhibited from a tower situated on the beach, just above high water mark, in a line with the two white obelisks, and bearing from the Middle Island Lighthouse N. 37° 30' E.

The Leading Light will, in ordinary weather, be seen three miles to seaward; it is masked in the direction of the outer reefs, and visible from S. 1° 30' E. to S. 20° 30' E., thus only illuminating an arc of nineteen degrees. Bearings magnetic.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of their several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages.

2. The flour and bread must be the produce of prime wheat, from which twenty per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste for first quality, and twelve per cent. for second quality of bread.

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3. REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 31ST JANUARY, 1860.

IN consequence of the grant from the Government for the current year having been reduced to the sum of £2020 11s. 4d., the greater portion of which was received in the early portion of the year, the council have not had in their power to undertake any fresh works of importance. The several contracts in progress at the time of the last half-yearly report have been completed. The line of road from Otway street to the town boundary has also been metalled, and a portion of Must street, leading to the western part of the district, has also been formed and metalled. The repairs of those streets which have been already formed now constitute an important item in the annual expenditure. The sum expended on public works during the half-year amounts to £1155 18s.

The council have through their members endeavored to get the proposed plan of draining the swamp carried into execution, but although the late Government placed the sum of £2000 on the draft estimates for that purpose, no such sum appeared on the estimates laid before Parliament. The council, however, still hope that in another year this important work may be accomplished.

An application was made to the Government to allow seaweed and sand to be removed from the beach. No reply to this application has been received, but a general regulation permitting the removal of seaweed has been published.

An application was made as to whether the attention of the Defence Committee had been directed to the western ports has met with no result.

At the end of the year, Messrs. Finn, Learmonth and Brown retired from the council by rotation, and Messrs. Learmonth, Finn, and Duncan McEachern were elected to supply the vacant seats.
