WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed for the holding of the several circuit courts of Victoria in every year as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and vary the times appointed for holding the next sittings of certain of the said courts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter and vary the times appointed for the holding of the next circuit courts at Ballarat, Castlemaine, Geelong, and Sandhurst respectively, and doth define and direct that the times at which the next circuit courts shall be holden at the said several places during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, shall be as follow, that is to say:—

At Ballarat on Monday the eighteenth day of June.

At Castlemaine on Thursday the twenty-eighth day of June.

At Geelong on Friday the eighth day of June.

At Sandhurst on Friday the sixth day of July.

WHITE HILLS, SANDHURST.
IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by Two hundred and fifty-nine householders resident within the municipal district of Sandhurst, praying for the erection of their locality into a separate municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders within the meaning of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, and reside within the portion of the municipal district of Sandhurst subsequently described, and which they desire to have erected into a separate municipality, viz.—Commencing at a point called or known by the name of Simon's Point on the north-west; thence in a straight line to a point called and known by the name of Washington Haycock's Point on the north-east; thence in a straight line south to a point to the north of a bridge called and known by the name of King's Bridge, taking the northern part of the said bridge as the boundary, and from Simon's Point on the north-west as aforesaid in a straight line south to a point north of King's Bridge aforesaid in a straight line with the said point drawn from Washington Haycock's Point to the north of King's Bridge as aforesaid, as delineated on the plan in the petition. MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 31ST JANUARY, 1860.

IN consequence of the grant from the Government for the current year having been reduced to the sum of £2020 11s. 4d., the greater portion of which was received in the early portion of the year, the council have not had in their power to undertake any fresh works of importance. The several contracts in progress at the time of the last half-yearly report have been completed. The line of road from Otway street to the town boundary has also been metalled, and a portion of Must street, leading to the western part of the district, has also been formed and metalled. The repairs of those streets which have been already formed now constitute an important item in the annual expenditure. The sum expended on public works during the half-year amounts to £1155 18s.

The council have through their members endeavored to get the proposed plan of draining the swamp carried into execution, but although the late Government placed the sum of £2000 on the draft estimates for that purpose, no such sum appeared on the estimates laid before Parliament. The council, however, still hope that in another year this important work may be accomplished.

An application was made to the Government to allow seaweed and sand to be removed from the beach. No reply to this application has been received, but a general regulation permitting the removal of seaweed has been published.

An application was made as to whether the attention of the Defence Committee had been directed to the western ports has met with no result.

At the end of the year, Messrs. Finn, Learthmouth and Browning retired from the council by rotation, and Messrs. Learthmonth, Finn, and Duncan McEachern were elected to supply the vacant seats.
