W HEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the severath day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed for the holding of the several circuit courts of Victoria in every year as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and vary the times appointed for holding the next sittings of certain of the said courts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter and vary the times appointed for the holding of the next circuit courts at Ballaarat, Castlemaine, Geelong, and Sandhurst respectively, and doth define and direct that the times at which the next circuit courts shall be holden at the said several places during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, shall be as follow, that is to say:—

At Cactlemaine, or Thursday the twenty eighth day of June.

At Ballarat on Monday the eighteenth day of June.
At Castlemaine on Thursday the twenty-eighth day of June.
At Geelong on Friday the eighth day of June.
At Sandhurst on Friday the sixth day of July.

3. Fresh meat (except when ordered for the Lunatic Asylum free from bone) is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than five inches, must have been cut off.

4. The supplies are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the officer in charge, or at the Government Stores, on the order of the Government Storekeeper.

5. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles when required within twenty-four hours, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

6. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and forward the same, in a complete state, to the Government Storekeeper, for examination and payment.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 5.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Governm

doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct; it will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.
