BRANCH AT WILLIAMSTOWN.

Branch at Williamstown.

In order to afford additional facilities to masters of vessels for shipping and discharging their crews at the Port of Melbourne, it is hereby intimated that from this date a branch of the Government Shipping Office has been opened at Williamstown, for the transaction of business. The office is situated in Morris street, immediately opposite to the railway piers and close to the Electric Telegraph Office.

The Merchant Shipping Act requiring that the masters of every British ship arriving shall deposit his articles, &c., in the Shipping Office within forty-eight hours after arrival, it is desirable that masters of vessels should comply with this provision immediately after entering at the Custom House, and hand the agreements with crews, and other documents, to the Government Shipping Master at the Central Office in the Custom House, Melbourne.

Any masters or owners of vessels, by giving notice at the Central Office, can have their crews engaged or discharged at the Williamstown branch, and in cases of emergency can obtain seamen as substitutes for those who may neglect to join: in such No. 40.—March 30, 1860.—1.

cases the papers will be transmitted to the Williamstown office; but it is hereby notified that to prevent delay and before a vessel can be cleared at the Custom House, it will be necessary for a master to produce his papers completed, and to pay the established fees for engagement or discharge at the Central Office, together with any wages of deceased seamen, seamen sent to the hulks or hospital, &c.

Deserters, or men absent without leave, should be immediately reported, either at Melbourne or Williamstown, and an entry made in the official log book.

The master should also report any case which is to be made the subject of investigation before a Police Court, in order that the proper documents may be before the Bench of Magistrates at the enquiry.

A similar practice will be followed as regards an office about to be opened very shortly at Bay street Jetty, Sandridge.

"Examination and Salaries of Teachers.

"With reference to paragraph 9, section iii. of the Regulations of the Commissioners of National Education as to the Examination and Salaries of Teachers: Notice is hereby given that from the 1st April, 1869, the following will be the rates of allowances in lieu of house rent:—

For single teachers, £20 per annum, For married teachers, £30 per annum,

one-half of which amounts will have to be provided by the patrons of the school."

In pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by Two hundred and fiftynine householders resident within the municipal district of Saudhurst, praying for the erection of their locality into a separate municipal district.

O.2261. WILLIAM NICHOLSON. WHITE HILLS, SANDHURST. The petitioners state that they are householders within the meaning of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, and reside within the portion of the municipal district of Sandhurst subsequently described, and which they desire to have erected into a separate municipality, viz:—Commencing at a point called or known by the name of Simon's Point on the north-west; thence in a straight line to a point called and known by the name of Washington Haycock's Point on the north-east; thence in a straight line south to a point to the north of a bridge called and known by the name of King's Bridge, taking the northern part of the said bridge as the boundary, and from Simon's Point on the north-west as aforesaid in a straight line south to a point north of King's Bridge aforesaid in a straight line with the said point drawn from Washington Haycock's Point to the north of King's Bridge as aforesaid, as delineated on the plan in the petition.

They further state that the area of the locality above described They further state that the area of the locality above described does not contain nine square miles, nor is any one point therein distant more than six miles from any other point, and that it contains a population of householders of not less than three bundled. That, although resident within the municipal district of Sandhurst, they are subjected to great loss and inconvenience in consequence of their remoteness from its business centre and the courts there situated. That they are therefore of opinion that the erection of their locality into a distinct municipal district will confer a great benefit on themselves and all others there resident, and tend greatly to its prosperity. greatly to its prosperity.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your petitioners therefore pray your Excellency that you will be pleased, with the consent of the Legislative (ric) Council, to declare by proclamation the said locality to be a municipal district by the name of 'The White Hills Municipality,' or by such other name as your Excellency may think fit, and that your Excellency will be pleased to define the limits and boundaries thereof."

REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1860.

A CTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and Suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne. North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Hochmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood and Richmond). South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Borcondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade in Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Flagstaff Observatory on each day during the month of February, 1860:—

The average of mortality in Melbourne and suburbs, which in December reached its highest point of 15'5 persons daily, and in January had fallen to 13'3, in February again declined to 9'8 per diem.

The mean temperature for the month was 5'4' or 3'3' over than in January. The hottest day was on the 27th, when the thermometer reached a maximum of 93'7' in the shade. The lowest temperature recorded was on the night of the 7th, when the minimum registration was 47'.

For the first seven days of the month, although the mean temperature was 62'4' or 3' less than the mean of the month, the mortality was at the rate of 10'9 a day, or 1'1 above the average. The beneficial effect of this cool weather was, however, felt during the next seven days, for which period, although the mean temperature rose to 64'2' or within 1'2' of the monthly mean, the deaths decreased to 0'3' a day or 5' less than the average. During the next seven days the thermometer again fell to a mean of 62'9' or 25' less than the monthly mean, and the deaths sank to 7'9 a day or 1'1 less than the average. For the last eight days the mean temperature increased to 7'12' or 58' above that of the month, and the effect was immediately shown in an increased mortality, which rose for that period to 10'9 a day or 1'1 over the daily average for the month.

The greatest number of deaths occurring in any one day during the month of February were on the 1st, 5th, and 26th, on each of which days 14 persons died. In January, the highest number in one day was 30, and in December 22.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of last census, the daily average of deaths during the months of January and February, 1860, and the increase or decrease of the rate of mortality in February, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

It is thus seen that a diminished mortality has obtained to a greater or less extent in every sub-district except Richmond, which shows a slight increase, and South Yarra and Prahran, in which the daily average remains the same.

"The number of children under 5 who died during the month was 186, or about 66 per cent. of the deaths of all ages; of these 123 were less than a year old, 54 between the ages of 1 and 3, and 9 between 3 and 5. Sixty-six died from zymotic diseases, viz., 1 from meazles, 5 from whooping cough, 2 from croup, 2 from thrush, 23 from diarrhoa, 26 from dysentery, 2 from cholera, and 5 from fever. Of diseases of uncertain or variable seat 43 died, of which 15 were set down to atrophy and 25 to debility; of diseases of the onervous system 27 died, viz., 9 from cephalitis, 4 from hydrocephalus, and 14 from convulsions; of diseases of the organs of respiration 17 deaths occurred, of which 7 were set down to diphtheria, 3 to quinsy, 1 to bronchitis, and 6 to pneumonia; of diseases of the digestive organs 25 died, viz., 10 from teething, 1 from gastritis, 6 from enteritis, 5 from mesenteric disease, 2 from

colic, and 1 from jaundice. Eight died from external causes, of whom a girl of 4½ and another of 1½ years old were burned to death; a child of 2½ years and 2 under a year old died from the effects of scalds; one infant was suffocated, another died of ulcerated navel, and one is set down as having met with an "accidental death," the nature of which is not stated.

The persons who died over the age of 5 years numbered 97, or 3½ per cent. of the total; of these 11 were between the ages of 5 and 15 years, 22 between 15 and 30, 38 between 30 and 45, 19 between 45 and 60, and 7 over 60 years of age, of which last one female had reached the age of 78 and a male that of 83 years. Of symotic diseases 20 died, viz., 3 from diarrhova, 10 from dysentery, 6 from typhus, and 1, a female 5½ years of age, from syphilis; of diseases of uncertain or variable seat 6 died, viz., 2 from homorrhage, 2 from dropsy, 1 from gangrene, and 1, a female of 50 years old, from cancer; of diseases of the nervous system 8 died, viz., 5 from centulistis and disease of the brain, 2 from paralysis, and 1, a child of 12 years old, from convulsions; of diseases of the respiratory organs 35 died, of which 3 are set down to diphtheria, 1 to laryngitis, 5 to bronchitis, 7 to pneumonia, 18 to phthisis, and 1 to, disease of the lungs; of disease of the heart 5 died, and 1 of disease of the kidneys; of complaints of the disgostive organs 11 died, viz., 2 from gastritis, 3 from tabes mesenterica, 1 from hernia, 2 from colic, and 3 from diseased liver. One death occurred from arthritis, and one from rheumatism. One male, a builder, died of old age. Eight deaths were the result of violent or accidental causes. Included in the above total are 8 lunatics who died in the Yarra Bend Asylum.

Should the contractor fail to supply any articles when required within twenty-four hours, they will be otherwise pro-

cured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either, by the persons to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

BYE-LAW.

The following bye-law was passed by the council, but was refused the assent of the Governor, viz., bye-law No. 44, being a bye-law to amend bye-law No. 1, declaring vacant the seat of any member absenting himself from four consecutive meetings of the council without sufficient excuse; also, bye-law No. 44, now awaiting the assent of His Excellency, for the establishment of a valuater fire company. of a volunteer fire company.

FINANCE.

In consequence of the balance of the grant-in-aid falling so short of the anticipation of the council, it was considered necessary that money should be borrowed in order to carry out the most needful works prior to the winter setting in. This question, after considerable discussion, was postponed until the new members had been elected.

The council learning that a great reduction was about being made by the Government in their next year's grant-in-aid, memorialized the Government, and, in conjunction with other municipalities, petitioned the Legislative Assembly, and obtained the aid of the local representatives, with all other means at command, to prevent the threatened decrease in their revenue.

The amount of rates collected during the half-year is £2329
11s. 3d.

Several applications have been made to Government for cut-ting a new channel for the creek, and for placing money on the estimates for the completion of Barker street.

At the request of the council the Government has granted two bridges across the railway line, which will be found of great ser-vice to the inhabitants of the town; also several open crossings.

Application has also been made to the Government for a piece of land at the north-west corner of the township, for a park and botanical gardens. This is applied for in lieu of the camp
