ROAD TOLLS IN THE HEIDELBERG ROAD TRUST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in conformity with the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to provide for the making and repairing of parish roads in the colony of New South Wales*, trustees have been appointed for a road known as the parish road leading from the suburban allotments in the parish of Jika Jika, near Melbourne, to the village reserve in the parish of Nillumbik, River Plenty: And whereas by an Act passed by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, in the sixteenth year of the same reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving roads in the colony of Victoria*, the said Act of the fourth year of Her Majesty's reign was repealed, and it was amongst other things provided that the trustees of any parish road duly elected under the provisions of the said repealed Act should be and be deemed the district road board for the locality through which such parish road may pass, extending three miles on either side thereof, and should continue in office and exercise all the powers of a district road board under the provisions of the now reciting Act until a road district should have been proclaimed and a district road board appointed under the provisions thereof in or for the said locality or some part thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand and seal of His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, late Governor-in-Chief of the territory of New South Wales and its dependencies, bearing date the first day of July in the year One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the said trustees were authorised to collect certain tolls therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the rates of tolls to be demanded and taken by the said trustees: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in me vested by the Act secondly above mentioned, revoke all former rates of tolls authorised to be demanded and taken by the said trustees; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and direct that the rates of tolls specified in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be the rates of tolls to be collected by the said trustees within the locality or district now called or known by the name or style of the Heidelberg Road Trust, that is to say:—

Three-fourths only of the above rates for any vehicle to be paid when the tires of the wheels of such vehicle are not less than four and a half inches wide, and perfectly flat and level throughout their whole width.

LAND RESERVED FOR A RESERVOIR AT CASTLEMAINE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, has, by an order dated the 10th day of October last, reserved the land hereinafter described as a site, for a Reservoir at Castlemaine, in connection with the Mount Alexander Waterworks Company, the permissive occupancy of such site by the company being made contingent upon compliance with certain terms and conditions:—

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND RESERVED.—Thirty-one acres two roods and two perches (31a. 2r. 2p.), more or less, county of Talbot, parish of Castlemaine, part of section 1 A 1, abutting on the Melbourne and Sandhurst Railway reserve, near Barker's Creek, portion A: Commencing at a point on a road one chain wide, said point bearing south 45 degrees west one chain one link from the south-east angle of allotment 6 of section A 1, parish of Castlemaine, bounded on the south-east by a line bearing south 45 degrees west nine chains forty-five links; thence on the south by a line bearing north 82 degrees 43 minutes west nineteen chains thirty-five links; thence on the west by the east boundary of the Melbourne and Sandhurst Railway reserve, bearing in a northerly direction seventeen chains twenty links; thence on part of the north by the south side of a road one chain fifty links wide, bearing south 66 degrees east seven chains ninety-five links; again on part of the north by the south side of a road one chain fifty links wide, bearing south 80 degrees 26 minutes east ten chains fifty-four links; thence on the north-east by the south-west side of a road one chain wide, bearing south 37 degrees east nine chains seventy-three links to the commencing point.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

WHITE HILLS, SANDHURST.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by Two hundred and fifty-nine householders resident within the municipal district of Sandhurst, praying for the erection of their locality into a separate municipal district.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are householders within the meaning of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, and reside within the portion of the municipal district of Sandhurst subsequently described, and which they desire to have erected into a separate municipality, viz.:—Commencing at a point called or known by the name of Simon's Point on the north-west; thence in a straight line to a point called and known by the name of Washington Haycock's Point on the north-east; thence in a straight line south to a point to the north of a bridge called and known by the name of King's Bridge, taking the northern part of the said bridge as the boundary, and from Simon's Point on the north-west as aforesaid in a straight line south to a point north of King's Bridge aforesaid in a straight line with the said point drawn from Washington Haycock's Point to the north of King's Bridge as aforesaid, as delineated on the plan in the petition.

They further state that the area of the locality above described does not contain nine square miles, nor is any one point therein distant more than six miles from any other point, and that it contains a population of householders of not less than three hundred.

That, although resident within the municipal district of Sandhurst, they are subjected to great loss and inconvenience in consequence of their remoteness from its business centre and the courts there situated.

That they are therefore of opinion that the erection of their locality into a distinct municipal district will confer a great benefit on themselves and all others there resident, and tend greatly to its prosperity.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray your Excellency that you will be pleased, with the consent of the Legislative (sic) Council, to declare by proclamation the said locality to be a municipal district by the name of 'The White Hills Municipality,' or by such other name as your Excellency may think fit, and that your Excellency will be pleased to define the limits and boundaries thereof."
