WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act to enable the Postmaster General to issue Money Orders in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time order and direct what shall be deemed "separate Post towns or places" within the meaning of the third section of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act intituled An Act to amend the law relating to the Post Office*: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the municipality of South Barwon shall be deemed to be within the limits of the town of Geelong for the purposes of the above recited Act, and that all letters delivered within the boundary of the town of Geelong and municipality of South Barwon aforesaid shall be subject to the town rate postage, viz., Twopence per single rate of half an ounce, and so on in proportion.

And the Honorable John Robinson Bailey, Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

of country allotment 173 in the said parish; the road being one chain and a half in width, and the line above described its southern boundary.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

WHITE HILLS, SANDHURST.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by Two hundred and fifty-nine householders resident within the municipal district of Sandhurst, praying for the erection of their locality into a separate municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders within the meaning of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, and reside within the portion of the municipal district of Sandhurst subsequently described, and which they desire to have erected into a separate municipality, viz.:—Commencing at a point called or known by the name of Simon's Point on the north-west; thence in a straight line to a point called and known by the name of Washington Haycock's Point on the north-east; thence in a straight line south to a point to the north of a bridge called and known by the name of King's Bridge, taking the northern part of the said bridge as the boundary, and from Simon's Point on the north-west as aforesaid in a straight line south to a point north of King's Bridge aforesaid in a straight line with the said point drawn from Washington Haycock's Point to the north of King's Bridge as aforesaid, as delineated on the plan in the petition.

Some repairs have also been done to the Yambuk road; but owing to the fact of the amount receivable on account of last year's grant-in-aid being several hundreds of pounds less than was expected, and engagements having been made in anticipation which more than absorbed the immediate funds, the council have not been able to undertake any works of importance during the last half-year.

##### GENERAL.

Application was made to the Government to place on the Estimates the sum of £4000 for the purpose of making a main line of road to Hamilton.—Refused.

Also for a post office messenger.—Refused. Remonstrances were made against the amalgamation of the telegraph and post offices, but without effect; also against the proposed reduction of grants-in-aid.

The extension of Prince street to Regent street from Bank street has been gazetted.

The surveyor, Mr. Jenkins, having accepted the office of town surveyor at Hamilton, resigned his situation on the 21st ultimo.

Vouchers have been forwarded for the sum of £200, to which sum the council is entitled on account of Botanical Gardens, but the money has not yet been received.

A deputation from the council waited on Mr. Atkinson, proprietor of the Belfast special survey, during his visit here, to ask for a piece of land whence to procure street material, and also for sites for a market place, a town hall, and a mechanics' institute, and land was promised for the various purposes.
