PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint that the several places mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereunto annexed shall be respectively polling places for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election of Members to serve in the Legislative Assembly of Victoria for the electoral District of Avoca; and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits of the several divisions of such District mentioned or referred to in the first and third columns of the same schedule shall be taken at any election for such District at the polling place or polling places in the second column of the same schedule set opposite to the respective names of such divisions, that is to say:-

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been passed by the council, and received the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council:—

No. 1. To regulate the proceedings in council.

No. 7. To levy a rate of 1s. in the pound on the annual value of all houses, lands, and tenements.

The following acts have been passed by the council, but have not yet received the assent of the Governor:—

No. 2. To regulate the conducting of municipal elections.

No. 3. To regulate mining on the streets and reserves.

No. 4. To regulate the slaughtering of cattle.

The council have repaired one of the culverts in High street, which was in a very dangerous state; but not having yet received the permanent levels of the main road from the district engineer, they have been unable to commence other works.

DEPUTATION.

The council have, by deputation, visited Melbourne, and urged on the Government the advisability of having the main road through the municipality, from the saw mills to the northern boundary, made at once, and prominently brought forward the great neglect that the district has hitherto experienced. They have likewise endeavored by every legitimate means in their power to procure their due proportion of the Government grants in aid of municipalities.

GRANTS.

The following grants have been given to the municipal council:—

Barrack reserve, containing 11a., for municipal buildings.

Reserve section 33, containing 4a. 0r. 3p., for cattle yards.

Half the reserve section 11, containing 1r., for fire brigade.

A reserve at the north-east corner of the municipality, containing 117a. 0r. 24p., for a racecourse.

Application was made for allotment 5 of section 5, for drainage purposes, but at the suggestion of the district surveyor the allotment is likely to be set aside for an open street.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

The council have recommended the Government to extend Hospital street to Payne street, and sell the frontages to High street, and thus do away with the vacuum which has hitherto divided the municipality.

They have likewise endorsed the petition of the residents on the Kilmore road within the municipal boundaries, asking for the sale of the frontages in quarter-acre allotments.

WATER SUPPLY.

A deputation waited on the Governor to solicit a portion of the grant in aid of water supply to the gold fields, and the council are now using their utmost endeavors to get every information to obtain a permanent supply.
