THE COURT OF MINES AT MOUNT EGERTON DISCONTINUED.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of April, 1860.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted that within and for every mining district therein referred to there shall be a court to be called "The Court of Mines," and such court shall be holden at such intervals and at such places within such district as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the seventh day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the Court of Mines within and for the mining district of Ballaarat was ordered to be holden at Mount Egerton, in the said mining district, once at least in every three calendar months: And whereas it is deemed expedient to discontinue the holding of such court at Mount Egerton: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the said Court of Mines within and for the said mining district of Ballaarat, shall, from and after the date hereof, be no longer holden at Mount Egerton aforesaid.

And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF FRYERSTOWN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such places, and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Fryerstown, at Fryer's Creek, in the county of Talbot, the boundaries whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

No. 56.—MAY 4, 1860.—1.

The boundaries of the township of Fryerstown:—Commencing at the south-west corner of the reserve, at a stake near the Castlemaine road, and bounded on the west by a line bearing north eighty chains; on the north by a line bearing east eighty chains; on the east by a line bearing south eighty chains; and on the south by a line bearing west eighty chains to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

NOTE.—The totals for January and February are in excess of those already given in the published reports for those months by a few deaths, principally inquest cases, which had not been registered up to the time of the Deputy Registrars forwarding to this office their monthly returns from which those reports were compiled.

The total number of deaths in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March was 332, being at the rate of 10.7 daily. This average differs but slightly from that of February, during which month the deaths averaged 10.6 a day. The mean temperature during the month was 66.6°, or 1.2° higher than it was in February. The greatest heat was experienced on the 25th, when the thermometer rose to 95.2°. It reached its lowest point on the night of the 24th, when it fell to 46.0°; thus the greatest range of temperature in the month (49.2°) occurred within the space of twenty-four hours.

For the first seven days of the month the mean temperature was 66°2', or 0°6' above the monthly mean, the mortality for the same period being at the daily rate of 11·4, or 7 over the average. During the next seven days the mean temperature rose to 66°5', or 0°9' over the mean of the month, in spite of which, however, the deaths declined to 9·3 a day, or 1·4 below the average; but during the next seven days they increased to 11·4, or 7 above the average, although the thermometer during the same period fell to a mean of 64°7', or 0°9' less than that of the month. For the last ten days the mean temperature was 65°3', or 0°4' less than the monthly mean, the mortality for the same period being at the rate of 10·7 a day, or exactly the average of the month.

Of the total number of deaths during the month, 183, or 56·6 per cent., were of males, and 144, or 43·4 per cent., of females. The greatest number of deaths occurring in one day (19) was on the 24th, which was also the day on which the lowest temperature was experienced. Eighteen persons also died on the 1st, which day, although the weather on it was mild and genial, followed immediately after five very hot days with which February terminated.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of last census, the daily average of deaths during the months of February and March, and the increase or decrease of the rate of mortality in March, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

Of the 332 deaths during the month, 202, or 60·8 per cent., were of children under 5, of which 115, or 56·9 per cent., were of males, and 87, or 43·1 per cent., of females. Of children of both sexes 122 died under a year old, 67 between one year and three, and 13 between three years and five. Eighty-one are recorded as having died of *zymotic diseases*, viz. 2 from scarlatina, 3 from whooping-cough, 4 from croup, 17 from diphtheria, 2 from thrush, 31 from diarrhoea, 15 from dysentery, 4 from cholera, 2 from typhus fever, and 1 from erysipelas. Of *diseases of uncertain or variable seat* 53 died, viz. 1 from inflammation, 1 from abscess, 1 from mortification, 2 from purpura, 23 from atrophy, 24 from debility, and 1 from malformation. Of *complaints of the nervous system* 37 died, viz. 11 from cephalitis, 13 from hydrocephalus, 13 from convulsions, and 1, a male three and a half years old, of sunstroke. Of *affections of the organs of respiration* 7 died, viz. 1 from laryngitis, 4 from bronchitis, 1 from pneumonia, and 1 from phthisis. Of *complaints of the digestive organs* 20 died, viz. 11 with teething, 1 from gastritis, 4 from enteritis, 1 from tabes mesenterica, 7 from hepatitis, and 2 from jaundice. A child of a year old was drowned, and one of twelve weeks accidentally suffocated. The causes of death of two children were unspecified in the returns.

The deaths of persons over 5 years of age were 130, or 39·2 per cent. of the total; of these 73, or 56·2 per cent., were of males, and 57, or 43·8 per cent., of females; 14 were between the ages of five and fifteen years, 37 between fifteen and thirty, 43 between thirty and forty-five, 21 between forty-five and sixty, and 10 upwards of sixty years of age; of the latter 1 male had reached the age of seventy and another that of seventy-one years. Two lunatics, both females, died in the Yarra Bend Asylum. The following causes of death were registered:—Of *zymotic diseases*, 37, viz., scarlatina, 5; diphtheria, 5; diarrhoea, 7; dysentery, 13; and typhus fever, 7. Of *diseases of uncertain seat* there were 7, viz., dropsy, 1; abscess, 1; scrofula, 2; cancer, 2; and marasmus, 1. Of *diseases of the nervous system* there were 17, viz., cephalitis, 5; apoplexy, 1; paralysis, 2; tetanus, 2; epilepsy, 2; delirium tremens (both males), 2; and disease of the brain, 3. Of *diseases of the respiratory organs* there were 36, viz., bronchitis, 2; pneumonia, 15; hydrothorax, 1; and phthisis, 18. Of *diseases of the organs of circulation* there were but 3, viz., pericarditis, 1; aneurism, 1; and disease of the heart, 1. Of *complaints of the digestive organs* there were 16, viz., gastritis, 3; enteritis, 1; peritonitis, 4; ascites, 1; colic, 1; hepatitis, 2; jaundice, 1; hydatids in the liver, 1; and disease of the liver, 2. Of *diseases of the urinary organs* there was but one death, and that from nephritis. Of *childbirth* there were 4, and of *deaths from external causes* there were 7, of which 1 was caused by a snake bite and another is alleged to have resulted from destitution. In two cases the cause of death was not stated.

BYE-LAW No. 18.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE ARARAT MUNICIPAL DISTRICT, FOR THE YEAR 1860.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore enacted by the Ararat municipal council, that the assessment on the annual value of the property within the municipal district of Ararat, estimated at Twenty-three thousand two hundred and fourteen pounds one shilling (£23,214 1*s*. sterling), as approved by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing the 20th day of September, 1859, and ending the 20th day of September, 1860.
