ADDITION TO AVOCA GAOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the first day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the building called and known as the police lock-up, situate at Avoca, was proclaimed to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas certain buildings have been recently added thereto, and it is expedient to proclaim such buildings to be a portion of the said gaol: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and direct that the two buildings commonly called portable lock-ups, each being ten feet square, which have been recently added to the said gaol, prison, and house of correction, at Avoca aforesaid, shall be and be deemed a portion thereof.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of April, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—TO PREVENT THE ERECTION OF DWELLINGS ON RIGHTS-OF-WAY SURVEYED AND LAID OUT AS RIGHTS-OF-WAY BY AND UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE CHIEF OFFICER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF CROWN LANDS AND SURVEY.

BE it ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Ballarat, in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor it shall not be lawful for any person to erect any dwelling-house, or any building or habitation which may be used or occupied by any person or persons to reside or sleep therein, fronting to or abutting upon any of the rights-of-way surveyed and laid out for rights-of-way exclusively by and under the authority of the chief officer of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey, and previous to any stable or any outhouse being put up on or abutting upon any of the said rights-of-way, or within twenty feet of any such rights-of-way of less width than forty feet, the owner or occupier thereof shall lodge with the town surveyor of the municipal district of Ballarat a plan and description of such stable or outhouse, and shall state in such application the purpose for which such building is intended, and previous to commencing to build, he or she shall obtain a written authority from the municipal council of the district of Ballarat, or their duly authorised officer, to erect such building: Provided nevertheless, if it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the council of the said municipal district that any such outhouse or stable is used for the purpose of a dwelling-house, or for carrying on any trade, or for the assembling of loose or improper characters, the said municipal council shall, by notice in writing to the owner or occupier, or left on the premises so complained of, order the removal of any such building. And any person erecting a dwelling-house abutting on any of the said rights-of-way of less width than forty feet, or within twenty feet of such rights-of-way, and neglecting or refusing to remove any such outhouse, stable or dwelling which shall have become a nuisance, or contrary to the provisions of this bye-law, after twenty days' notice, shall be liable and subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for the first offence, and a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds for any second offence, and for any succeeding offence a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, such penalty or penalties to be recovered and recoverable by the said council on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace acting in or for the said district.

BYE-LAW No. 32*, TO AMEND BYE-LAW No. 32.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the regulation of markets, market dues, &c.: And whereas by Proclamation dated 29th March, and gazetted 1st April, 1855, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the establishment of a market within the municipal district of Castlemaine, and did by the said Proclamation determine the boundaries, that is to say:—Commencing at a point on the southern side of Mostyn street, intersected by the western side of Hargrave street; thence west by the southern side of Mostyn street ten chains; thence south by the eastern side of Barker street five chains; and thence by a line bearing east ten chains; and thence north by the western

side of Hargrave street five chains to the commencing point: And whereas a bye-law, being No. 32, passed by this council and assented to by His Excellency the Governor and gazetted on the 11th of June, 1858, which bye-law provides, That the said council shall, from time to time, as they shall see fit, repeal any of the rules and conditions contained therein and substitute others for those repealed, or alter and amend all or any of the said rules, conditions, tables, and forms in the said bye-law, or in the schedule or appendix attached, and that such substitutions, alterations, and emendations shall, when sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor, have the same force and effect as they would have had had they been in the original: And whereas it is desirable for the accommodation of the public and for the interest of the district that a portion of the market place should be set apart and open each working day for the sale of hay, straw, green fodder, and grain: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, that from and after the sanction of His Excellency the Governor to this amendment of bye-law No. 32, that the south-western portion of the said market place, that is to say: Commencing at a point on the northern side of Forrest street, intersected by the eastern side of Barker street; thence east by the northern side of Forrest street 300 feet; thence by a line bearing north 75 feet; thence by a line bearing west 300 feet; and thence south by the eastern side of Barker street 75 feet to the commencing point, be set apart and open every day from sunrise to sunset (Sundays, Christmas Days and Good Fridays excepted) for the supply and sale of hay, straw, green fodder and grain, subject to the conditions, rules, tables, and forms contained in bye-law No. 32, the days for holding the market alone excepted: And be it further enacted, that from and after the sanction of His Excellency the Governor to this amendment of bye-law No. 32, so much of the said bye-law No. 32 as relates to the days named for holding a market for the sale of hay, straw, green fodder, and grain, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR REGULATING THE KEEPING OF SWINE, AND SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES ARISING THEREFROM, WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

Elections to be taken by ballot.—Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Hotham, that from and after the date of this bye-law, receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the chairman of the municipal council of Hotham, or his deputy or deputies, be hereby severally empowered to take elections by ballot to supply vacancies occurring from time to time in the municipal council of Hotham, in like manner, as far as the same may apply, as elections by ballot are now from time taken to supply vacancies in the Legislative Council and Assembly of Victoria, according to the provisions to that effect in the Act of Council 19 Victoria No. 12, intituled, *An Act for the election of Members, &c.*

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF CROSSINGS OVER FOOTPATHS, AND FOR PROHIBITING DAMAGE TO FOOTPATHS AND WATER-CHANNELS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, &c. (18 Victoria No. 15, section 26): And whereas for the better protection of the public footpaths and water-channels, it is deemed expedient to make the following orders and regulations: Be it therefore ordered and

directed by the council of the municipal district of Hotham, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor:—

1. *Persons having roadways for carts across formed footpaths to provide crossing-places.*—That all persons having, or that may hereafter have, roadways for carts and other wheeled vehicles across the footpaths now formed, or that may hereafter be formed by the municipal council of Hotham, shall, at their own cost, provide, construct and maintain a crossing-place over the water-channel and footpaths, in the manner following, viz:—

2. *Crossings to be enclosed with kerb of the same description as the street kerbing.*—In streets where a stone or wood kerb is now, or hereafter may be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone pavement or broken metal, the whole width of the footpath from the building line to the pavement of the water-channel, and shall be enclosed on both sides with a stone or wood kerb of the same size and description as the street kerbing, which it must join with a proper curve, the water-channel must not in any way be altered or obstructed, and it must be maintained at all times in good repair, at the cost of the person having the crossing.

3. *Wooden bridges over channels where there is no kerb.*—In streets where a footpath and side channel are or may hereafter be formed, and where no kerbing is laid, suitable wooden bridges shall be provided for the water underneath said bridges, to leave a free passage for the water under the crossing, so as to project into the public roadway not less than four feet from the outer edge of the footpath; and the crossing-place over the footpaths, whether paved, metalled or gravelled, shall be maintained in such manner that it shall at all times be as clear and dry as the footpath itself immediately adjoining such crossing-place.

4. *Materials and manner of laying crossings, subject to the approval of the council.*—The materials used for such crossing-places and kerbing, and the manner of laying the same, shall be subject to the approval of the municipal council or the duly appointed town surveyor, and in cases where the material or manner of laying the same, or forming the crossing-places, shall, on the report of the town surveyor, be deemed objectionable by the said council, it shall be lawful for the council (after the expiration of seven days from any day on which such council shall give notice of objection to the persons forming or causing to be formed such crossing-place) to proceed in the manner hereinafter stated as against parties refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this bye-law.

5. *Parties before laying crossing must give notice and submit specification.*—All persons about forming crossing-places over footpaths shall give notice, in writing, of their intention, and submit a specification of the manner in which the work is to be performed to the town surveyor, who shall give permission for the same to be proceeded with as specified, provided that the specified manner is not objectionable, and that the applicant shall have paid to the town clerk a fee of Five shillings for each examination and permission.

6. *Council, after notice, to form crossing-place, and recover the cost.*—It shall also be lawful for the said municipal council, whenever it appears that carts or other wheeled vehicles habitually and frequently cross any formed footpath or channel to any right-of-way, yard, or other premises, without a crossing-place having been made as hereinbefore stated, after the expiration of twenty-one days from the date of notice having been served upon the owners or occupiers of the said right-of-way, yard, or other premises, to proceed and form such a crossing-place, and recover the expense and cost of its construction from the owner or occupier of the premises entered by its use, and in cases of common rights-of-way from the several owners and occupiers of the premises abutting thereon, or to which it is appurtenant; and any person refusing or neglecting to pay the amount owing for such construction, in the manner aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter stated for a breach of this bye-law.

7. *Penalty for riding or driving over footpaths.*—Any person who shall ride or drive any horse, beast, cart, or other wheeled vehicle, across any of the public footpaths or water-channels, or cause such to be crossed with or by any horse, beast, cart, dray, or other wheeled vehicle, unless over and by means of a crossing-place formed in one or other of the modes hereinbefore stated, and any person neglecting or refusing to comply with this or any other of the provisions of this bye-law, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

8. *Penalty for suffering water to overflow on footpath.*—And be it further ordered and directed that it shall not be lawful for the owner or occupier of any building premises or land to cause or suffer any water to be discharged or to overflow from any such building, premises, or land, into, on, or over any public footpath or highway within the said district; and any person who shall so offend shall, upon conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds; provided that if such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining path as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building, premises, or land, into the public watertables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer or officers as the said council may appoint for that purpose, he shall not be liable to the penalty imposed in this clause.

An application to the Attorney General to appoint a stipendiary magistrate in consequence of the very irregular attendance of the local magistrates, the court having to be adjourned on several occasions, to the great inconvenience of the public, and had it not been for the very regular attendance of the chairman of the municipal council, the difficulty of obtaining redress would have been considerably increased. The application was made on the 14th January, 1860; no answer has yet been received.

An application to the Postmaster General to extend the postal delivery through the entire municipality. This application has been partly complied with, and the delivery now extends eastward to the Orrong road.

An application to the Board of Land and Survey to grant a portion of land on the reserve between Gardiner's Creek road and Commercial road, for the purpose of erecting baths and washhouses. The land has been granted.
