ADDITION TO AVOCA GAOL.

PROCLAMATION
By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the first day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the building called and known as the police lock-up, situate at Avoca, was proclaimed to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas certain buildings have been recently added thereto, and it is expedient to proclaim such buildings to a portion of the said gaol: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and direct that the two buildings commonly called portable lock-ups, each being ten feet square, which have been recently added to the said gaol, prison, and house of correction, at Avoca aforesaid, shall be and be deemed a portion thereof.

BYE-LAW NO. 4.—FOR REGULATING THE. FORMATION OF GROSSINGS OVER FOOTPATHS, AND FOR PROHIBITING DAMAGE TO FOOTPATHS AND WATER-CHANNELS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, &c. (18 Victoria No. 15, section 26): And whereas for the better protection of the public tootpaths and water-channels, it is deemed expedient to make the following orders and regulations: Be it therefore ordered and

- directed by the council of the muricipal district of Hotham, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor:

 1. Persons having roadways for earls across formed footpaths to provide crossing-places.—That all, persons having, or that may hereafter have, roadways for earls and other wheeled vehicles across the footpaths now formed, or that may hereafter be formed by the municipal council of. Hotham, shall, at their own cost, provide, construct and maintain a crossing-place over the water-channel and footpaths, in the manner following, viz.:

- water-channel and footpaths, in the manner following, viz.:

 2. Crossings to be enclosed with kerb of the same description as the street kerbing.—In streets where a stone or wood kerb is now, or hereafter may be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone pavement or broken metal, the whole width of the footpath from the building line to the pavement of the water-channel, and shall be enclosed on both sides with a stone or wood kerb of the same size and description as the street kerbing, which it must join with a proper curve, the water-channel must not in any way be altered or obstructed, and it must be maintained at all times in good repair, at the cost of the person having the crossing.

 3. Wooden bridges over channels where there is no kerb.—In streets where a footpath and side channel are or may hereafter be formed, and where no kerbing is laid, suitable wooden bridges shall be provided and fixed over the water-channel, so as to leave a free passage for the water underneath said bridges, to project into the public roadway not less than four feet from, the outer edge of the footpath; and the crossing-place over the footpaths, whether paved, metalled or gravelled, shall be maintained in such manner that it shall at all times be as clear and dry as the footpath itself immediately adjoining such crossing-place.

 4. Materials and manner of laying crossings, subject to the approval of the council.—The materials used for such crossing-places and kerbing, and the manner of laying the same, shall be subject to the approval of the municipal council or the duly appointed town surveyor, and in cases where the material or manner of laying the same, or forming the crossing-places, shall, on the report of the town surveyor, be deemed objectionable by the said council, it shall be lawful for the council after the expiration of seven days from any day on which such council shall give notice of objection to the persons forming or causing to be formed such crossing-place) to proceed in the manner hereinafter stated as against parties refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this bye-law.
