WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in

Council, made on the seventh day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed for the holding of the several circuit courts of Victoria in every year as therein mentioned: And whereas by another Order of the Governor in Council, made on the nineteenth day of March last, the times for holding certain of such courts in the present year were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to postpone the times fixed as aforesaid for holding the next circuit courts at Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, Geelong, and Sandhurst, and to appoint a second circuit court to be holden at Portland during the present year: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the times for holding the next circuit courts at Ballarat, Beechworth, Castlemaine, Geelong, and Sandhurst, and doth hereby direct and appoint that the said several courts, and also a second circuit court at Portland, shall be holden during the present year at the respective times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At Geelong on Tuesday the tenth day of July 1860 (in lieu of 8th June 1860).

At Ballarat on Monday the sixteenth day of July 1860 (in lieu of 13th June 1860).

At Castlemaine on Saturday the twenty-eighth day of July 1860 (in lieu of 28th June 1860).

At Sandhurst on Saturday the fourth day of August 1860 (in lieu of 6th July 1860).

At Portland on Friday the fifth day of October 1860.

At Beechworth on Monday the eighth day of October 1860 (in lieu of 20th July 1860).

And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING LEASES AND APPLICATIONS FOR LEASES OF AURIFEROUS CROWN LANDS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the seventh day of May, 1860.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to make such regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, as shall appear to be necessary for prescribing the form of documents and leases to be issued under the said Act, the modes, times, dates, and places of the issue thereof, the conditions on which such leases shall be issued, and such regulations from time to time to alter, vary or amend; And whereas it is deemed expedient to make regulations touching the execution and delivery of leases, the forfeiture thereof, and the withdrawal of applications therefor: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the regulations hereinafter set forth touching the execution and delivery or cancelling of mining leases of auriferous Crown lands, or the withdrawal or refusal of applications for such leases, in any of the mining districts now existing, or to be hereafter created, that is to say:—

1. Upon receiving the lease the warden shall at once give notice to the lessees, and request their attendance at his office to execute and take delivery thereof within seven days from the date

of such notice, and should the said lessees, or their lawful attorneys as hereinafter provided for, fail to comply or to show reasonable cause for an extension of the period of seven days allowed for the purpose the warden shall report the circumstances to the Chief Secretary, who may declare the lease forfeited.

2. Upon receiving information that a mining lease has been forfeited or cancelled, the warden shall cause a notice thereof to be published in some newspaper circulating in the locality, and also shall require the mining surveyor of the district to proceed without delay to the ground described in such mining lease, and cause all posts, notices, &c., by which such ground has been distinguished as applied for under the leasing regulations to be removed, and further to notify for the information of the miners in the vicinity that the reservation thereof from occupation under miner's right, by virtue of the application for such lease, is at an end.

3. Upon receiving notice that an application for a mining lease has been withdrawn or refused, the warden shall forthwith instruct the mining surveyor as aforesaid to proceed to the ground described in such application and remove all posts and notices thereon, and shall publish a notice to the like effect as in the case of a forfeited or cancelled lease.

4. It shall be lawful for the warden in case of the withdrawal of any application for any mining lease, or of the refusal of any such lease, to deduct all costs and expenses occasioned thereby from any money deposited in his hands by the applicant or applicants for such lease under the provisions of the leasing regulations, and to apply the same in payment thereof.

5. In case of the inability of any lessee or lessees by reason of absence, sickness, or any other lawful impediment, to execute a lease, then, upon proof of such inability to the satisfaction of the warden, and also upon proof to such satisfaction that the power of attorney hereinafter provided for has been duly executed by such lessee or lessees, the lawful attorney or attorneys of such lessee or lessees shall be permitted to execute such lease for and on his or their behalf.

6. That all such attorneys shall be appointed under power of attorney, in the form set forth in the schedule hereto, and the execution thereof shall be attested by a warden or police magistrate, if any such be resident at or near the place where the same is executed, and if not, then it shall be attested by a justice of the peace, and every such power of attorney shall be duly registered in the office of the Registrar General of the colony, before it shall be acted upon.

SCHEDULE.

Know all men by these presents, That I, A.B. (or we, A.B. and C.D.), do hereby make, nominate, constitute, and appoint, and in my (or our) place and stead put E.F., of (residence and addition), to be my (or our) true and lawful attorney for me (or us), and in my name (or our names) to accept the lease of auriferous crown land for mining purposes, for which I (or we), on the day of 18, applied under the Act of the 21 Victoria No. 32, and the indenture of which was on the day of 18, executed by His Excellency the Governor, and for me (or us), and in my name (or our names), and as my (or our) act and deed to sign, seal, and deliver such indenture of lease, and for me (or us), and in my name (or our names), to enter into all such covenants and agreements as I (or we) shall be required to enter into in and by said indenture, or otherwise, in the matter of said lease, and generally for me (or us), and in my name (or our names) to do, execute and perform all such other acts, deeds, and things as may be necessary, or may be required to be done, executed, or performed in and about the acceptance and execution respectively, for me (or us), and in my name (or our names), of such lease and indenture of lease, respectively; and I (or we) do hereby ratify and confirm, and covenant that I (or we) will ratify and confirm all and whatsoever the said E.F. shall lawfully do or cause to be done in or about the premises by virtue of this power. THE FRANKLIN AND YANDOI ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and the Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained; and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Talbot, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at a point one chain east of the south-east angle of portion 6 of section 8 of the parish of Wombat, and thence by a line bearing north along the west boundaries of portions 4 and 3 of section 7 of the said parish; thence onwards to the south side of section 19, in the parish of Holcombe; thence westerly along the south boundary of the said section 19 to the

centre line of Middleton's Creek; thence northerly along the centre line of Middleton's Creek to a point north of the northern extremity of section 2 of the said parish of Holcombe (the boundary line thus far being continuous with the west boundary of the Glenlyon road district); thence further on the east by a line bearing north to a point in the parish of Fryers, bearing east one and a half miles from the north-east angle of the parish of Yandoit; thence on the north and west by the north and west boundaries of the parish of Yandoit and the west boundary of the parish of Franklin continued south to the centre line of the Glengower or McLachlan's Creek; thence by the centre line of the said creek southwards (the boundary line along the centre of the creek being continuous with the parish of Bulancrook and the road district of Creswick's eastern boundaries) to a point due west of the north-west angle of section 2 in the parish of Wombat; and thence on the south by a line bearing east to and along the north boundaries of sections 2 and 3 of the said parish of Wombat to the commencing point.

And I do hereby proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Franklin and Yandoit Road District."

TOLLS ON THE COLAC ROAD, WITHIN THE BARRABOOL ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving roads in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as thereinafter mentioned: And whereas the Barrabool District Road Board deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls on the Colac road within their district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and proclaim that the Barrabool District Road Board may direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses, now or hereafter erected or built by the said board in or upon the Colac road within the said Barrabool Road District, at rates not exceeding the rates hereinafter declared, that is to say:—

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, set apart the pieces or portions of land hereinafter described, situate in the parish of Dunced, in the county of Grant, as a site for National School purposes.

A plan, showing the metes and bounds of the land so reserved, is deposited in the Surveyor General's Office, Melbourne.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND RESERVED.—Two roads, county of Grant, parish of Dunced, part of the reserve in section 9: Commencing at a point bearing north 26 degrees 30 minutes east nineteen chains sixty-two links from the north-west angle of allotment S of section 9, bounded on the west by a road leading from Loutit Bay to Geelong, bearing north 26 degrees 30 minutes east one chain fifty-two links; thence on the north by a road bearing north 89 degrees 55 minutes east three chains thirty-four links; on the east by a line bearing south 5 minutes east one chain thirty-six links; and on the south by a line bearing south 89 degrees 55 minutes west four chains two links to the point of commencement.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 41.—FOR APPOINTING AND REGULATING STANDS FOR PUBLIC VEHICLES, WATER CARRIERS, AND CARTERS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation and licensing of porters, public carriers, carters, water drawers, and public vehicles: And whereas it is expedient, to prevent accidents, and for the better regulation of public vehicles, that certain places be appointed as stands for the said public vehicles, water carriers, and carters: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the places appointed by this bye-law (as per schedule attached) shall be the places at which such vehicles shall stand for hire within the municipality of Castlemaine; and any driver or drivers of such vehicles, water carriers, or carters, standing and plying in any other than one of the places appointed by this bye-law, shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and any owner or driver standing or plying for hire after sunset and before sunrise without two good lights on his vehicle, shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and further, that this council shall from time to time, as they may see fit, repeal any of the rules and conditions contained in this bye-law or in the schedule attached, and substitute others for those repealed, or alter and amend all or any of the said rules and conditions in this bye-law or in the schedule attached, and such substitutions, alterations, and emendations shall, when sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor, have the same force and effect as they would have had had they been in the original.

The south side of Mostyn street, from within ten yards of Barker street extending two hundred yards eastward.

The south side of Forest street, from within ten yards of Urquhart street to within ten yards of Hargrave street.

Stand for Water Carts.

On the Market square.

Stand for Wood Carts.

On the south-east corner of the Market square.

Stand for General Carters.

On the east and west sides of the Market square.

MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—STANDING RULES AND ORDERS.

CHAP. I.—Order of Proceedings.

THAT the sittings of the council shall on all ordinary occasions be open to the public, but any councillor may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the council is taken as to whether the question proposed shall be discussed with closed doors.

2. The council shall commence business so soon after the time appointed for meeting as there are a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum, but if at the expiry of twenty minutes from the time specified for meeting there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the council at that meeting, but the names of the members present shall be recorded in the minutes.

3. That at the hour appointed for the meeting of the council, or any committee thereof, the town clerk shall enter on the minute book the names of the members present or who may be present at any time during the meeting, the time of entry being stated, and from such entries compile and publish a half-yearly register of members' attendance, and keep an attendance registry.

Order of Business.

1. Confirmation of minutes of previous meeting.
2. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of council.
3. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
4. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
5. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.
6. Reading and ordering on reports of select committees.
7. Reading and ordering on reports of deputations.
8. Special payments.
9. Special business not classified.
10. Order of the day, including subjects arising from proceedings of former meetings.
11. Motions of which previous notice has been given.
12. Notices of motion.
13. The standing orders may be suspended, with the exception of No. 15, chap. ii., and No. 1, chap. iv., in cases of emergency, provided a majority of the members present shall deem such suspension necessary.
4. With reference to the confirmation of minutes, no discussion will be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

5. All communications by letter intended for the council shall be made and addressed to the town clerk, and applications and memorials shall be addressed to the chairman under cover to the town clerk, which communications shall be opened at the council table.

6. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of the council, unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given at the previous meeting of the council.

7. The order of the day shall include all business of which due notice has been given, and all matters arising out of former meetings of the council.

8. Any motion entered on the notice paper, and the councillor having given notice of the same being absent, and no other councillor deputed to bring forward such motion, when the business is called in order, such motion shall be struck out.

9. No bye-law shall be decided on without due notice (as in cases of motions), and a copy of the proposed bye-law shall be open in the council chamber for the inspection of all ratepayers, free of charge, or of any person duly qualified to vote at elections under the Act.

CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

1. Any councillor proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the chairman, and no councillor shall be interrupted unless by a call to order (when he shall sit down); the councillor calling to order shall then be heard, and the question of order decided before the subject is resumed or any other business.

2. Any councillor proposing a motion or an amendment must state the nature of it before addressing the council.

3. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment, and after such explanation or reply the question shall forthwith be put to the vote.

4. If more than one councillor rise at one time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to precedence.

5. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

6. The chairman when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final.

7. The chairman shall rise when addressing the council in discussion on any question.

8. Any councillor may demand the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the subject under discussion.

9. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

10. The chairman shall, on taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the votes of all councillors shall be entered on the minutes.

11. The council shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections.

12. No proposition once brought before the council shall be withdrawn without leave of the council, nor shall any proposition be entertained by the council until the same be seconded.

13. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion of adjournment, but if the question be negatived the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall again be entertained: Provided the motion be carried, any business left undecided shall take precedence at the next meeting of council.

14. Any councillor may record his protest against any decision of the council, provided the same be made, in writing, before the next meeting of the council, and couched in respectful language, and be consistent with truth. Notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

15. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the council which shall have been negatived by the council, shall again be entertained during the same municipal year.

16. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intended mover at the close of the meeting of council to the town clerk, who shall file the same for the municipal year.

17. That when in consequence of a breach of order, the chairman shall call upon any member or person by name, such member or person shall withdraw as soon as he has been heard in explanation, and after such member or person's withdrawal, the council shall at once take the case into consideration, and if such member or other person be adjudged guilty, he shall be fined in a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in default of immediate payment shall be sued before two or more justices of the peace for recovery of the same.

CHAP. III.—Elections:

1. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until four clear days' notice shall have been given in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications for the same; and the salary of such office shall in all cases be fixed for the municipal year before proceeding to the election.

2. At all such elections the voting shall be by ballot.

3. No councillor or officer belonging to the council shall be received as security for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

CHAP. IV.—Miscellaneous Regulations.

1. For the consideration of any bye-law, or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in the standing order No. 15, chap. ii., it shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper of the day, or notice of motion for which call was made is set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question, or any amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five shillings.

2. The town clerk shall have the charge of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the safe custody and proper use of the same, each impression thereof being duly verified by the signature of that officer.

3. The town clerk shall affix the municipal seal to contracts, bonds, and licenses requiring the same, and to all bye-laws and addresses to the Governor passed by the council, but he shall not affix it to any other municipal document without the authority of the council.

4. The town clerk shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the council, nor unless such document bears the signature of the chairman.

BYE-LAW NO. 2.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE BY MEANS OF
STANDING ORDERS THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL
FOR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HOTHAM.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings (18 Victoria No. 15, section 20);

Business of the council to be conducted according to the following standing orders.—Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Hotham, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the proceedings and business of the said municipal council shall be conducted according to the following regulations only, which shall be and be called the "Standing Orders" of the said council, that is to say:—

CHAP. I.

Parliamentary usages to be resorted to.—That in all cases not hereinafter provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of parliament, which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of this council.

Order of Proceedings.

1. *Council to sit with open doors.*—The business of the council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors; but any three members present may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the council whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

2. *Commencement of business.*—When a quorum not present.—At all meetings of the council the business shall commence so soon after the time stated in the summons as a legal quorum is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of twenty minutes, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the members present) in the minute book, and the business on the notice paper shall be postponed to the next meeting of the council.

3. *Confirmation of minutes.*—At every regular meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of any preceding meetings, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes when confirmed shall be signed by the chairman for the time being.

4. *Order of business.*—That after the confirmation of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

Order of Business.

1. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the council.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.
5. Reading and ordering on reports of special committees.
6. Reading and ordering on reports of deputations.
7. Orders of the day, including subjects arising from proceedings of former meetings.
8. Motions of which previous notice has been given.
9. *Council to be communicated with by petition.*—Every communication addressed to the council shall be in the form of petition or memorial, in writing, not printed or lithographed, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.
10. *Presentation of petitions.*—On the presentation of a petition, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner; and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a

committee or taken into consideration with any order of the day to which such petition may refer; and every member presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof. Every petition must be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

7. *Presentation of reports.*—No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice thereof shall be given, nor shall any debate be allowed thereon, except as to its being received, and if thought necessary, printed for distribution among the members.

8. *Consideration of reports.*—If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained, such report shall not be adopted until notice has been given of the several recommendations, and the sense of the council taken separately on each.

9. *Reports to be numbered and signed.*—The reports of any committee shall be numbered in consecutive order and signed by the chairman thereof, or in the event of his absence, then by the chairman for the time being, previous to being presented to the council.

10. *Orders of the day, &c.*—The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration; any member of the council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the town clerk at least three clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration, and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

11. *Proceeding with motions.*—No motion shall be proceeded with unless the councillor giving notice, or one of the council authorised by him in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called upon.

12. *Delivery of notice paper.*—The notice paper shall be prepared by the town clerk and caused to be delivered to each councillor two clear days previous to each council meeting.

13. *Resolutions, how rescinded.*—No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless a call of the whole council has been duly ordered for that purpose; and no motion for rescinding any resolution of the council shall be again entertained during the same municipal year unless by consent of at least five members of the council.

14. *Bye-laws.*—No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the council regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall in the interim remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers free of charge.

15. *Reference of proposed petitions, &c., to legislative committee.*—No motion proposing any petition, address, bye-law, or standing order, shall be entertained, unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, address, bye-law, or standing order, and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon; and the mover of every such proposition shall be for that occasion a member of such committee.

16. *Preservation of manuscript motions, &c.*—The original manuscript of any motion or amendment that is submitted to the council shall be preserved until the minutes of the meeting at which the same has been disposed of are confirmed in the usual way.

CHAP. II.—Order of Debate.

17. *Motions and amendments, how proposed.*—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair shall proceed with the subject.

18. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the council in support thereof; and when making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign and deliver it to the town clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

19. *Seconding of motions and enforcement of standing orders.*—No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by simply noticing that such order is disobeyed.

20. *As to speaking on moving or seconding a motion.*—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion without remark shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

21. *Members to be addressed by their official titles.*—The members in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or councillor.

22. *Priority in speaking.*—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

23. *Chairman to rise when addressing the council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question.

24. *Speaking twice on the same subject.*—No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried, and after the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

25. *Calling to order for speaking twice on the same subject.*—The chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second

time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

26. *The chairman shall decide what is order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final for that occasion in each case.

27. *Imputations of improper motives and personal reflections highly disorderly.*—No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be considered highly disorderly.

28. *Members shall withdraw offensive expressions, and make apology.*—Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the council, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the council, under a penalty, in case he refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the council, of not less than One nor more than Ten pounds.

29. *Members to withdraw when called upon.*—When, in consequence of disorderly conduct, the chairman shall call upon any member by name, such member shall withdraw as soon as he has been heard in explanation; and after such member's withdrawal the council shall at once take the case into consideration.

30. *Words may be taken down.*—Any member may require the town clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

31. *Production of documents.*—Any member may of right require the production of any documents of the council relating to the question or matter in discussion.

32. *Amendments.*—One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion, and it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but not more.

33. *Questions may be superseded.*—A question may be superseded, 1st, by the adjournment of the council, on the motion of a member "That the council do now adjourn;" 2nd, by the previous question, viz., "That this question be now put," being proposed and negatived.

34. *Vote, how taken.*—The chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

35. *Manner of voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, excepting in cases of elections, when the vote shall be by ballot; any member of the council may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall stand up and those in the negative shall retain their seats until the vote is recorded.

36. *Adjournments.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undiscussed shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

37. *Committee of the council.*—In the consideration of any matter of detail it shall be competent for the council to resolve itself into a committee of the whole.

38. *Protests.*—Any member of the council may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the council; notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the council by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of council, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

39. *The council counted out.*—If a debate on any order of the day or on a motion be interrupted by the council being counted out, such order of the day or motion may be restored to the notice paper, and the debate thereupon resumed, at the next meeting of council, at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committee of the whole council interrupted for want of a quorum.*—If the discussion of any question in a committee of the whole council be interrupted for want of a quorum, the council may order the resumption of such committee on a future day, on motion upon notice, and the discussion of such question shall then be resumed at the point at which it was so interrupted.

CHAP. III.—Committees.—Permanent.

41. *Appointment of committees.*—There shall be at least four permanent committees, consisting of three members each, two to form a quorum, formed under the following heads:—

1. Public works and lighting
2. Finance and rates
3. Markets and licensing
4. Health and legislative

which committees shall be elected annually by voting papers of members of council.

42. *Chairmanship of committees.*—Every committee, at the first meeting after its appointment, shall elect one of its members to be chairman for the municipal year, and in his absence shall elect a chairman for the time being.

43. *Chairmanship of committee.*—The chairman of the council when appointed on any permanent committee shall be the chairman thereof; when special committees are appointed for a merely temporary purpose, the member proposing such committee shall be the chairman thereof; and the standing orders of the

council shall be observed in all committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking.

44. *Special committees.*—Special committees shall not consist of less than five members, three to be a quorum, and shall be subject to the same regulations, so far as they apply, as permanent committees.

45. *Absence of a quorum at committees.*—If there shall not be a quorum of members present within twenty minutes after the time fixed for the meeting of any committee, such meeting shall lapse, but it may be competent for the chairman of such committee, if necessary, to convene another meeting at a future day.

46. *Absentees.*—Any member of a committee absenting himself from three consecutive meetings, duly convened, shall cease to be a member thereof.

47. *Vacancies, how filled.*—The council shall, if it thinks fit, on the requisition of any member, discharge him from serving on a committee, and all vacancies as they occur shall be filled up by the council.

48. *Questions decided by majority of votes.*—All questions shall be decided by a majority of votes; and whenever the votes are equal, the chairman shall have the casting vote.

49. *All meetings shall be held at council chambers.*—The meetings of all committees shall be held at the council chamber.

50. *Finance committee may disburse five pounds in one week.*—The finance committee shall be at liberty, at their discretion, to authorise disbursements for current expenses to an amount not exceeding five pounds in any one week.

51. *Committees, how convened.*—The town clerk, shall convene every permanent committee within ten days of its first appointment, and every select committee within five days of the same, or at any other time thereafter, by order of the council, or the written order of the chairman, or on that of any two members of such committee; and of all committee meetings the town clerk shall give each member at least twenty-four hours' notice.

CHAP. IV.—Miscellaneous Regulations.

52. *Call of the whole council, how made.*—For the consideration of any bye-law, or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in standing order No. 1, or for any other important business, it shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any such subject, at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper for the day when the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call was made is set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty of One pound, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

53. *Election of officers.*—No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until not less than five clear days' notice have been given in two or more Melbourne daily newspapers, and a local newspaper, if any, inviting applications for the same, and the salary, or other remuneration of such office, in all cases be fixed before proceeding to the election.

54. *Voting to be by ballot at election of officers.*—At all elections for offices at the disposal of the council, the voting shall be by ballot, on cards to be provided for the purpose, signed by the voter, and containing the name or names of the person or persons voted for, and no voting cards shall be received at any election which is not signed by the member voting; and such voting cards shall be kept in the town clerk's office for the twelve months next ensuing the day of election.

55. *Security; members or officers not receivable.*—No member or officer, of the council, or any auditor of the municipality of Hotham, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

56. *Councillors to have no share or interest in contracts.*—No councillor shall have, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partner, any share or interest in any contract or employment, with or by the council, except he be a shareholder in any public company or corporation with which the council may contract.

57. *Attestations under the common seal.*—The town clerk shall have the custody of the common seal of the municipal council, and be responsible for the same and the proper use thereof; each impression of the seal being verified by the signature of that officer.

58. *Attestations under the common seal.*—The town clerk shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the council, nor unless such document bears the signature of the chairman, but in the case of powers of attorney, and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, the signatures to which require to be verified before the chairman by declaration, and in any such case the said seal shall and may be affixed by the town clerk to the chairman's certificate, accompanying the same, on the receipt of a fee of Ten shillings and sixpence for each attestation.

59. *Suspension of standing rules and orders.*—Any one or more of the standing rules and orders may be suspended *pro tem*, in case of emergency, with the consent of a majority of the council.

Penalty for chimney flue taking fire.—Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Hotham, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, that the occupier of any premises within the municipal district of Hotham, whereof any chimney flue shall take fire from having become foul, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings: Provided that if any such occupier shall plead that his chimney did not take fire in consequence of being foul, the proof thereof shall lie with such occupier.

Should there be more candidates than vacancies, a show of hands will be taken for each candidate, and the three persons in whose favor the show of hands shall be decided, shall thereupon be declared to be members of the municipal council accordingly; unless any candidate or six ratepayers shall thereupon dissent from such decision, and shall demand a poll, in which case a poll will be held on the following day, Friday, 1st June, such poll to open at Eight o'clock in the morning, and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

THIRD HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF FITZ ROY, FROM THE 1ST OCTOBER, 1859, TO 31ST MARCH, 1860.

THE annual election for councillors to fill vacancies caused by termination of the period of office, took place on 4th October last, and resulted in the return of councillors Brennand, Bennett, and Edwards. The Honorable C. Vaughan was elected at the same time in place of Mr. Elmer. Rae, resigned. On the 17th February following councillor Fergie was returned to fill the vacancy caused by the retirement of Dr. Bennett.

At the meeting of council held on 10th October, the Honorable C. Vaughan was unanimously elected chairman of the council for the current municipal year.

The council held twenty meetings during the six months preceding the 31st March last, at which the attendance has been as follows:—

The council have consented to the erection of moveable canvas sunblinds, provided they are constructed in accordance with the specifications prepared by the municipal surveyor.

ANNEXATION OF QUARRIES.

On 30th March last a special committee, consisting of councillors Langton, Williams, and Fergie, was appointed to take active measures, in conjunction with the residents in the Quarries district, for securing the rejection by the Legislative Assembly of the Bill to repeal the fourth, fifth, and sixth sections of an Act intituled *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*; the effect of which, if passed, would be to prevent the annexation of the Quarries to this municipality. In consequence of an attempt having been made towards the close of last year to embrace the Quarries within the limits of the proposed municipality of Carlton, the residents in that portion of Smith Ward east of Nicholson street, a second time petitioned the Executive Council for annexation to Fitz Roy. This memorial was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st January, 1860, but the consideration of it was postponed until the Legislative Assembly had decided upon the bill above mentioned. The City Council had previously caused a bill to be introduced in that House, purporting to define the limits of the city of Melbourne, which excluded the Quarries district; but on the Government declining to erect Carlton into a separate municipality, that measure was abandoned and another substituted, being the bill which the committee was appointed to oppose, and which, by depriving the Executive of their power to take localities within the corporate limits of Melbourne and annex them to existing municipalities, proposed to retain the Quarries district within the jurisdiction of the city.

REVENUE.

The council have received from Government the sum of £611 5s. 10d., being the concluding payment of the grant-in-aid for the last municipal year, which amounted to nearly thirty-one shillings and sixpence on the amount of rates collected to 30th June, 1859.

The valuation of rateable property within the municipal district, after deducting the reductions made by the court of appeal, is £125,341, yielding a revenue, at one shilling and threepence in the pound, of £7833 16s. 3d.

HEALTH.

The reports of the health officer, respecting the sanitary condition of the district, are favorable. The council, as local board of health, have issued instructions for the forming, metaling, and channelling of the following rights-of-way, under the provisions of the Health Act:—

1. That between Cecil and Reilly streets.
2. That running from Young to King William street.
3. That between George and Gore streets.
4. That running in the rear of Kyte's buildings, Regent street.
5. That between Palmer and Little Fleet streets.
6. That running from King William to Moor streets, near Nicholson street.

The owners of property abutting on the above rights-of-way are required to contribute two-thirds of the estimated expense, previous to the tenders being invited, the council defraying the remaining portion of the cost. The council have constructed Little Smith street under those arrangements, the owners of property thereon having paid the required amount.

MARKET.

Since 4th May, 1859, 5937 drays have been weighed at the bridge. The receipts for that period amount to £203 9s., being a return of over five per cent. on the outlay, exclusive of the market keeper's salary.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the approval of His Excellency the Governor:—

Bye-law No. 7. "For empowering the municipal council to grant, refuse, or suspend certificates of registration for public places of amusement."

Bye-law No. 10. "For levying a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound for the current municipal year." This bye-law provided that ninepence of the above rate be collected during the first half of the year, and sixpence during the remaining portion of the year.

The following are under the consideration of Government:—

Bye-law No. 11. "For licensing hawkers of vegetable produce and firewood." Forwarded on 27th January.

Bye-law No. 12. "For the regulation of public carriers, carters, and drivers of public vehicles." Forwarded on 27th February.

COURT HOUSE ON MARKET RESERVE.

The council have approved of a plan showing the external design and elevation of a combined court house and municipal chambers proposed to be erected on the eastern frontage of the market reserve, extending along Napier street. This step was taken in consequence of the Government engineers intimating their intention to proceed with the expenditure of the vote of £2000 for a court house. The council took advantage of that opportunity for submitting drawings of the public buildings referred to, showing a unity of design, which were accepted by the Government. The expense of that portion which will be appropriated for municipal business and other public purposes is estimated at £5000. The council, however, have no intention of proceeding with that erection in the meantime, nor will it probably be undertaken until the public thoroughfares are placed in an efficient state of repair. Notwithstanding repeated applications made by the council to the department of Public Works for the expenditure of the vote for the erection of a court house in Fitz Roy, nothing was done in the matter till the close of the last year, when that department required an indemnity from the Fitz Roy council prior to inviting tenders. This difficulty arose from the site indicated by the Fitz Roy council being vested in the city corporation under the provisions of the Fitz Roy Ward Improvement Act; the Government alleged that it was not advisable to erect public buildings on other than Crown land sites without an indemnity being obtained that it would be devoted to the purposes intended by the vote. The Fitz Roy council having furnished a bond for £1000, obtained the permission of the city council, under seal, for the appropriation of a portion of the market reserve as a site for a court house. This document, together with an additional guarantee for £2000 from the Fitz Roy council, was forwarded to Government, and on the 27th of December last a tender was accepted for the works. No steps having been taken towards the erection of the building, the council, in the beginning of February last, instructed the town clerk to enquire of the Commissioner of Public Works whether there was any cause of delay in the erection of the police court, the council could assist the Government in removing. This communication was acknowledged, but nothing further was done. As a last resource the council, on the motion of councillor Langton, directed the town clerk, on 21st March last, to write to the Chief Secretary, calling his attention to the delay which has attended the outlay of the vote for the erection of a court house in Fitz Roy, setting forth the steps which have been taken by the council to secure Government in the possession of the land, and asking that the works be at once proceeded with. A reply to that communication was received from the Under Secretary, informing the council that it had been forwarded to the law officers of the Crown, and in this position the matter now stands.

FITZ ROY WARD IMPROVEMENT ACT.

A Bill to amend the abovenamed Act, by transferring the powers contained therein to the Fitz Roy council, together with other provisions relating thereto, has been prepared by the municipal solicitor, Mr. Brodrick, and been introduced in the Legislative Assembly by Dr. Embling, M.L.A., when it was referred to a select committee for their report.
