THE MELBOURNE GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE GENERAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the 5th section of the 14 Victoria No. 19, and the 6th section of the 17 Victoria No. 12, whereby it is enacted "That the trustees of the said cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform, and cause to be done and performed, all such acts, matters, and things, as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for directing the positions of all graves and vaults to be made in the said cemetery, the depths of the graves, and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults, so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalation or evaporation in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage, and shall have power to prosecute all persons who shall or may at any time do, or cause to be done, any damage to any such buildings, monuments, tombstones, shrubberies, plantations, or enclosures; provided that the said trustees shall not by any rule or regulation, or any act, matter, or thing, at any time interfere directly or indirectly with the performance of any religious ceremony in the burial of the dead, according to the usage of the communion to which the deceased may have belonged, or with the original distribution of the said lands or hereditaments made or intended to be made by the said deed of grant, or other conveyance, to and amongst separate and distinct religious denominations and communions; provided further that no rite or ceremony shall be performed in any portion of such cemetery set apart for any particular denomination, except according to the usage of such denomination, and by a duly recognised minister of the same;" and also of the 10th section of 14 Victoria No. 19, and the 11th section of 17 Victoria No. 12, whereby "The trustees of the said cemetery may allow the members of any religious denomination, at their own expense, to erect and build within such part of the said cemetery as shall be specially set apart for that denomination, a suitable mortuary church or chapel, for the performance of the rites and ceremonies in the burial of the dead according to the usages of such denomination; provided that the plans, specifications, elevations, and models, thereof, with lodges and other buildings and conveniences thereto, shall be first submitted for the approval of the said trustees, and shall be approved by them."

The trustees of the said cemetery, with the concurrence and approval of the Government, make and promulgate the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given.
2. By the 7th section of 14 Victoria No. 19, and the 8th section of 17 Victoria No. 12, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled "to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his and their heirs and near relations for ever."
3. Application for such permission must be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in schedule B., will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in schedule A.
4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment must be given at the cemetery six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral; if not, an extra charge will be made. (See schedule A.) No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.

6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order. (See schedule C.)

8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Eight o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hour for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year. No funeral will be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven o'clock p.m. and Seven o'clock a.m.*

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, and every coffin in a private grave must have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, must be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section 14 Victoria No. 19, and 8th section 17 Victoria No. 12, "to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to

the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner." In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

13. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in schedule A.; and registers of all grants are kept by the clerk.

17. The keeper has orders to turn out, or take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Acts relating to the cemetery, or the regulations for the protection of the same; and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the 9th, 12th, and 13th sections of the 14 Victoria No. 19, and 14th section of 17 Victoria No. 12.

18. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar or coroner holding an inquest, or inquiry, or a magistrate; such certificate must be delivered to the gate-keeper at the cemetery, before the funeral enters the gates.

19. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

FORM OF CERTIFICATE OF RIGHT OF BURIAL IN THE MELBOURNE GENERAL CEMETERY.

On the application of _____ and upon payment of the sum of _____ (which is hereby acknowledged to have been received), the trustees of the Melbourne General Cemetery, in terms of and as authorised by the Act of Council 14 Victoria No. 19, and 17 Victoria No. 12, have agreed, to grant and do hereby grant unto the said _____ permission to dig or make a grave or vault on that piece of ground, _____ feet long by _____ feet broad, lying within the portion of the said cemetery appropriated for _____ burials, and marked No. _____ on the map or plan of the said cemetery kept by the said trustees, with permission to erect or place on the said piece of ground a monument or tombstone, on payment of such charges as may from time to time be established. And it is hereby declared that the said _____ shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of this permission, to and for the sole and separate use of the said _____ and his (or their) heirs and near relations for ever: Provided always and it is hereby declared that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz.:

First, that the said piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said _____ his heirs and near relations solely as a burying place, and that no other use shall be made thereof.

Second, that no enclosing wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be erected or placed on said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof.

Third, that the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be maintained and kept

up by the said _____

and his heirs and near relations, in proper repair, to the satisfaction of the said trustees.

Fourth, that the said _____ and his heirs and near relations, shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject, in every respect, to such rules and regulations as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make; and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein, except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.
