MUNICIPALITY OF HEATHCOTE.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS FOR THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, entitled, *An Act to establish Municipal Institutions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated 19th August, 1859, the district of Heathcote was proclaimed a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Heathcote, that after and from this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required under the provisions of the said Act:

1. If at any election a poll shall be demanded, the election shall be by ballot in the following manner:—The chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling-place a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink, pens, or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting paper as hereinafter provided, in which polling-place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, the several candidates and their respective scrutineers, the electors who shall for the time be tendering their votes, and any ratepayer who desires to enter an objection to the tendering of a vote, shall be present; and any other person intruding and refusing to quit when desired so to do shall, on being convicted before one or more justices of the peace, be fined in a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

2. The chairman shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a lock-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand upon the table in front of the chairman. And each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box, in the presence of the chairman, town clerk or his deputy, and scrutineers. And in case such elector shall be unable to read or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate. And no elector shall take out of such polling-place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same. And any person wilfully infringing any of the provisions of this clause, or obstructing the polling by unnecessary delay in performing any act within this bye-law, and on being convicted before one or more justices of the peace shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

3. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before 8 a.m. of the polling-day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in each polling-place.

4. It shall be lawful for the chairman, or for any candidate or scrutineer, to put to any person before he shall have received his voting paper the following questions:—

What is your name?

Are you of the age of 21 years?

Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Heathcote?

Have you paid all rates levied on you, except such as shall have become due by you within one month before this election?

And if any person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence within the meaning of this bye-law, and on being convicted before one or more justices of the peace, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. At every election it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with a ratepayers' roll, and as such elector comes forward to demand his voting paper, to see whether the name of such elector appears upon the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act, and as each elector deposits his voting paper within the ballot-box, to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

6. In case the voting paper as of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman, where such party shall purpose to deposit his paper in the ballot-box, shall refuse to allow the same to be put in, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not; and for the purpose of such decision it shall be lawful for the chairman to take evidence on affirmation, and such decision shall be final and conclusive on all parties; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such elector has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise, such vote shall not be allowed.

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7. At the close of the poll, or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman, in the presence of the scrutineers, shall count the number of votes polled for each candidate, and if on the state of the poll being announced the number of the votes shall have been found equal for any two or more candidates, one or more of whom, but not all, shall, by the state of the poll and the number of members to be elected, be entitled to be declared elected, the chairman shall, by a casting vote or votes, as the case may be, decide which of the candidates for whom the votes may be equal shall be elected, but no chairman shall be entitled to vote at any election except in case of an equality of votes.
