# MUNICIPALITY OF HEATHCOTE.

BYE-LAW NO. 2.—TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS FOR THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

BYE-LAW NO. 2.—TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS FOR THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, entitled, An Act to establish Municipal Institutions in the Colony of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that any municipal district ostablished under the provisions of the said Act may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated 19th Angust, 1853, the district of Heathcote was proclaimed a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Heathcote, that after and from this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required under the provisions of the said Act:

1.
