WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Hotham: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Hotham, the following buildings, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:-

The Presbyterian Church situate in Curzon street.
The Presbyterian School situate in Elm street.

THE BRAYBROOK ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Bourke, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:-Commencing at the south-east angle of portion 1, section X., in the parish of Cut-paw-paw, and being bounded as follows, viz.: on the south by the south boundary of section X., in the last named parish, and the south boundary of the parish of Derrimut, bearing westerly to its south-west angle; thence on the west by a line bearing north to the south boundary of portion B of section XXVI. of the last named parish; and thence by the south and west boundaries of the last named section to the centre of the Kororoit Creek; thence on the north by the centre line of the Kororoit Creek, bearing easterly to a point due west of the north side line of section VI., in the parish of Maribyrnong; thence further on the north by the north boundaries of sections VI., VII., XI. and X., bearing easterly to the western boundary of section XXII., in the last named parish; thence north by the west boundary of the last named section to the centre of the Saltwater River; thence south-easterly by the centre line of the Saltwater River to a point due west of the north side line of section IX., in the parish of Doutta Galla; thence by the north boundaries of sections IX. and VIII., in the last named parish, easterly to the north-east angle of the last named section; and thence south along the east boundary line of the said section to the centre of the Saltwater River; thence along the centre of the Saltwater River to a point due west of the north boundary line of section XXXVII., in the last named parish; thence easterly and south-easterly along the north and north-east boundaries of section XXXVII. to XVII. inclusive of the last named parish to the west boundary of the Hotham municipality; thence further south and continuous with the west boundaries of the Hotham municipality and the Melbourne corporation to the River Yarra Yarra; thence by the north bank of the River Yarra Yarra to the east boundary of the Footscray municipality; and thence by the east, north, and west boundaries of the Footscray municipality home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Braybrook Road District."

PROPOSED LEASE OF SALT LAKE, ON LONG LAKE RUN, WIMMERA DISTRICT.

APPLICATION having been made to the Board of Land and Works, by Roderick McGregor and Peter Rohs, of Sandhurst, miners, for a lease of a certain salt lake on Long Lake run, in the Wimmera district, for the purpose of mining for and manufacturing salt, it is hereby notified that the Board of Land and Works intend to grant to the said Roderick McGregor and Peter Rohs a lease (subject to suitable conditions), for a term of four (4) years, of two-thirds (2/3) of the area of said lake, with the exclusive right to dig and manufacture salt therefrom, the remaining third of the lake to be reserved for the use of settlers in the district.

Any persons who may have objections to the proposed lease of the said lake for the purpose specified, are requested to communicate the same by letter (addressed to this office) within thirty days from this date.

THE RUSHWORTH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Rushworth.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault or erecting tombstone in the cemetery by permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the charges set forth in the schedule, is entitled to have, maintain and keep a vault, monument or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. On application for such permission being made to the trustees, a certificate will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on proof to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that his relatives are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case an interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time of arrival at the cemetery.

7. The hours fixed for the performance of funerals are to be from eight o'clock a.m. to six o'clock p.m., and orders must be given the day before.

8. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones and fencing to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners, and all wooden fencing not kept in repair may be removed by the trustees.

10. Every coffin in a brick grave or vault to be bricked or cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. The plans of all monuments and fences proposed to be erected must be first submitted to the trustees.

12. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

13. The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. No person employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge of his duties.

15. A plan of the cemetery shall be kept, and may be inspected on payment of the charge set out in the schedule.

16. Any person destroying fences, or otherwise injuring the cemetery, will be proceeded against as the law directs.

17. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

18. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT OF THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1860.

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade in Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Flagstaff Observatory on each day during the month of April, 1860:—

The mean temperature for the month of April was 58.8°, or nearly 8° lower than that of the preceding month. The deaths of both sexes, however, averaged 10.5 a day, being the same rate within a fraction as that for the months of February and March, and only 1.2° a day less than the average for the first quarter of 1860.

The thermometer in the shade reached its highest point during the month at 2h. p.m. on the 2nd, when it stood at 85.9°, and its lowest at 6h. a.m. on the 25th, when it had fallen to 43.4°. The greatest range of temperature in the shade on any one day (34.9°) was on the 1st, from a maximum of 83.5° to a minimum of 48.6°, and the least (4.4°) was on the 22nd, between 59.4° and 55°. The range between the maximum and minimum of the month was 42.5°, and the mean daily range 15.53°. The extremes of atmospheric pressure were experienced on the 26th and 11th, on which days respectively the mercury stood at 30.280 in., and 29.375 in., the mean pressure for the month being 29.923 in. and the range .905 in.

For the first seven days of the month the mean temperature was 64.9°, or 6.1° above the mean of the month, the rate of mortality for the same period being 10 a day, or 5 under the average. For the next seven days the mean temperature declined to 56.3°, the mortality however increased with the diminished temperature, being for that week at the rate of 12.6 a day, or 2.1 over the average of the month. During the 3rd week the temperature rose to a mean of 59.6°, or 0.8° above the monthly mean, the mortality declining to 11.6° a day, but being still about one death a day over the average of the month. For the last nine days the temperature fell to a mean of 55.3°, or 3.5° under the monthly mean, the mortality for the same period averaging 8.3 daily, or two deaths a day less than the average of the month.

The total number of deaths during the month was 314, of whom 164 or 52.2 per cent. were of males, and 150 or 47.8 per cent. of females. The greatest number of deaths in any one day (18) took place on the 16th; the next highest number was 17, on the 11th. The greatest number dying on any one day during March was 19, and on any day during the quarter ending 31st March it was 30.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of last census, the daily average of deaths during the months of March and April, 1860, and the increase or decrease of the rate of mortality in April, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

* The population of Melbourne and suburbs, as shown by the census of 1857, is given as a guide to the probable relative proportions rather than to the actual numbers of the present inhabitants of the several sub-districts.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age were 191, or 60·8 per cent. of the total. The largest number, 102, or 55·4 per cent., were of females, whilst only 89, or 46·6 per cent., were of males. As was remarked in a previous report it is unusual for the deaths of female children to outnumber those of males. This is the first month since January that such an occurrence has taken place. Of the entire number of children who died, 119 were under a year old, 57 between one year and three, and 15 between three years and five.

The deaths of persons above the age of five years numbered 123, or 39·3 per cent. of the total. 75 or 61 per cent. were of males; 48, or 39 per cent. of females: 15 were between 5 years and 15; 22 between 15 and 30; 42 between 30 and 45; 27 between 45 and 60; and 17 over 60 years of age. Of the latter a female had reached the age of 72, two males that of 74, and one male who died in the Benevolent Asylum is stated to have been 86 years of age. Five males and one female died during the month in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum.
