THE DOG NUISANCE ACT EXTENDED TO STEIGLITZ AND MEREDITH.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has extended the provisions of the Act 6 William IV. No. 4, intituled, *An Act for abating the nuisance occasioned by dogs in the streets of certain towns and on highways in New South Wales*, to the townships of Steiglitz and Meredith, in the county of Grant, the boundaries of which respective townships are as follow, viz.:-

DESCRIPTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF STEIGLITZ.—Commencing at the junction of the Slaughter-yard Gully with Sutherland's Creek, and bounded on the east by a line south forty chains, on the south by a line west eighty chains to Sutherland's Creek, on the west by Sutherland's Creek northward to a point on the same due north of the last corner and by a line north sixty-six chains, on the north by a line east eighty chains, and again on the east by a line south forty chains to the commencing point.
