WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act to enable the Postmaster General to issue Money Orders in the colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as shall be need relating to post office money orders and the places where such money orders shall be issued and be made payable: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that from the 1st July, 1860, money orders may be issued and be made payable at the Post Office at New Inglewood, subject to the money order regulations in force.

And the Honorable John Robinson Bailey, Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## EXCHANGE OF POSTAGE STAMPS FOR MONEY.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to authorise the purchase of stamps by the Post Office Department from the public: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct, that on and after 1st July next postage stamps may be received at all the Post Offices in Victoria, conducted by officers exclusively the servants of the Post Office Department, in exchange for money, and that a charge be made of Five per cent. upon the value of stamps purchased, or according to the following scale, viz.:

For stamps not exceeding in value 1s. 8d., the charge to be One penny.

For stamps exceeding in value 1s. 8d., but not exceeding 3s. 4d., the charge to be Twopence.

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For stamps exceeding in value 3s. 4d., but not exceeding 5s., the charge to be Threepence.

And so on at the rate of One penny for every 1s. 8d. or portion of 1s. 8d. Postage stamps only to be exchanged when not soiled or otherwise damaged, and when presented in strips, at least two stamps adhering to each other, as at first issued from the Post Office.

And the Honorable John Robinson Bailey, Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# THE COLAC ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the eleventh day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the boundaries of "The Colac Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to vary and alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Colac road district shall be and comprise so much of the counties of Grenville and Polworth as is included within the area hereinafter specified, that is to say:-

Commencing at a point on the east shore of the Tirrangower Morass due west from the south-west angle of section 15, in the parish of Pirron Yaloack; in the county of Polworth, and being bounded on the south by the south boundaries of sections 15, 16, and 20 of the aforesaid parish, and of sections 23 to 28 of the parish of Elliminyt, and a line bearing east to the centre of the River Barwon; thence on the east by the centre of the River Barwon northwards to a point due east of the south boundary line of allotment N of section 28, in the parish of Birregurra; thence westwards to the south-west angle of the last named allotment; thence northwards to the south boundary of allotment A of section 23 in the last named parish; thence south-east along the south boundary of the last named allotment to its south-east angle; thence due north along the eastern boundaries of allotments A, B, C, D, and E of said section 23 to the north-east angle of said allotment E; thence westwards to the south-east side line of a Government road (bounding the last named section on the north-west); thence north-east along the side line of the said road, and of allotment E of section 19, in the last named parish, to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of the last named section; and thence northerly by the said dividing line (crossing the Birregurra Creek into the county of Grenville) and the dividing line of allotments B and C of section 12, in the last named parish, to the Colac road; thence north-east along the said Colac road to a point due south of the east side line of allotments 50 and 57 of the last named parish, and onwards to the south side of section 104, in the parish of Gellibrand; thence further north by the western boundary of the said parish, and along the dividing line between the parishes of Hesse and Warracabarunah to the north-east angle of the last named parish; thence westward to the west boundary of the parish of Hesse; and thence north again by the west boundaries of the parishes of Hesse and Wingcol to the Geelong and Cressy road; thence westerly by the said road through Cressy and Foxbow to the Gnarkoot Ponds; and thence southerly by the Gnarkoot Ponds and the eastern shores of Lake Corangamite, the Parin Yaloack Creek, and Tirrangower Morass, home to the commencing point.

# MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, PORTLAND.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be exempted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the building hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Portland: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Portland the following premises, situate and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:-

The premises situated on portion of allotment No. 10 of section No. 14, town of Portland, in the occupation of the Government as public offices.

### THE MARYBOROUGH PUBLIC CEMETERY. RULES and Regulations of the Maryborough General Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 8th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations, for ever."
3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule.
4. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
11. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.
12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.
15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.
16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.

REPORT of the proceedings of the Ararat Municipal Council, for the half-year ending 23rd April, 1860.

On the 11th January Councillors Davison and Kerr resigned their seats as councillors, and on the 8th February Messrs. Barnett Simmons and Thomas Beveridge were elected to the vacant seats.

The council have held twenty-four general and four special meetings, at which the attendance has been as follows:—

Councillor Beveridge was absent from one meeting on deputa-  
tion to Melbourne.

Bye-law No. 16, regulating the keeping of swine within certain parts of the municipality, has received the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

The following public works have been completed during the past six months:—

Formation of Vincent street to its permanent level.  
Formation of 18 chains 80 links of road in continuation of View Point street to the Pleasant Creek road.

Formation of 25 chains of High street to its permanent level.  
Formation of Reservoir, west of Vincent street, capable of containing two million gallons after allowing for evaporation.

Formation of culvert at the intersection of View Point continuation and Pleasant Creek road.

Laying down pitched crossings in High street.

Anxious that the town should have the benefits of an abundant supply of water as near as possible, the council have purchased the dam on the south of Barkly street, and they hope that by next summer they will be in a position to have it cleared of sludge, and an embankment formed that will throw the water as far back as Taylor street.

On the occasion of the visit of the inspector general of roads and bridges to Ararat in August, 1859, the council earnestly urged on him the desirability of having the main line of road through the township changed to Barkly street from High street where it was originally intended to make it, and that Barkly street should be constructed as a main Government road to unite the municipal works with the Ballarat road beyond the pumps. In both these matters they are glad to be able to say they succeeded, thus bringing the traffic through the principal portion of the town instead of at the back of it, and effecting a saving of over £400 to the ratepayers.

In consequence of the energetic course of action adopted by this council from the beginning, the most important public works are in such an advanced state that they considered themselves justified in reducing their expenditure as low as possible; they have therefore dispensed with the services of a permanent surveyor, they have also discharged the weekly laborer, and have accepted a tender for the cleansing and keeping in repair of all the streets and roads within the municipal boundary.

As early as the 23rd August, 1859, this council made application to have an amount placed on the Estimates for 1860 towards the erection of a suitable post office on Ararat, to which they received the following reply from the Postmaster General, "That he had already recommended provision being made on the Estimates 1860 for the erection of a suitable post office building in your township;" but notwithstanding the distinctness of this pledge, no amount for that purpose appeared on the Estimates when laid before the House, and the promise given by the late Honorable Postmaster General was repudiated by his successor.
